DIGGING INTO THE PAST

The Fen Edge Archeology Group has made its mark in the five villages through conducting its own fieldwork. John Stanford explains why you might like to get involved with making fascinating discoveries in our historically-rich region

FEAG was set up in 2008, a year after doing some test-pitting around Cottenham during the Fen Edge Family Festival. We have taken part in every FEFF since then, exploring pits on the village green in 2009 and 2011, and investigating a local garden adjacent to the green in 2011 and 2013. We'll be somewhere around in June next year!

Members of the group have a shared interest in knowing about past human activity, drawing on the evidence of what was left behind. This might be remains of housing, things people used, boundaries, remnants of crops grown or of animals that were kept for food, or hearths, ovens or kilns, tools to indicate craft or industry or sites of religious or other special activity. It is all rewarding, no matter how small the find.

FEAG is conducting its own fieldwork which includes excavation on a Romano-British site on the fen edge just north of Cottenham. The work has been done over two weeks in July over four years. Discoveries include ditches and pits and finds such as pottery, metal items and animal bones which are analysed at workshops by the members of the group and by experts.

Our members are mostly amateurs and we have good relationships with the University of Cambridge and professional archeological groups in the area. Our Honorary President is Dr Sue Oosthuizen, a landscape archeologist in the University's Institute of Continuing Education.

Membership is open to all, at an annual cost of £10 plus modest fees if participating in visits to museums, excavations and sites of archeological interest. We arrange speakers for six or seven meetings a year, usually at Cottenham Village College and in other

villages in the Fen Edge patch. You can see join and see what's coming up on the website www.feag.co.uk

A Timebank in the Fen Edge Patch?

When I wrote in the last issue about the Fen Edge Volunteer Bank, I had not at that time discovered 'timebanking' which is a mechanism for organising activity for your own and others' benefit.

6 Dear Wendy, I'm writing with a suggestion for a new initiative related to integration...and loneliness **9**

Now both these words are common in the news today, and particularly relate to the writer, from Waterbeach, whose mother in law is Romanian and speaks little English. Is there any social activity that would put her in touch with others who are semi housebound (young mothers, grannies, retired)? he asked. The solution may be Timebanking.

I found out about it from Georgina who started the St Neots Timebank over two years ago and not only collected £50 from her husband (who bet that her project would be defeated by apathy) but has been awarded a Quality Charter Mark in recognition of its resounding success. It has 90 enthusiastic members aged from 18 up who meet once a month for coffee on a Saturday in a local hall.

Timebanking is based on a co-production principle: eg, the market puts a high value on resources that are scarce and a low value on things that are commonly available. Eventually this means that the market doesn't adequately value certain very necessary activities until they become truly scarce – for example: caring, sharing, socialising, raising children, being a good neighbour, helping others.

This second, so-called informal economy in which people solve their own problems, is the basis of timebanking: volunteers offer skills or abilities to others who may not have those skills or abilities. The beauty, and simplicity of it, is that we all have something to offer if we think about it. You may know how to trim a hedge but not how to sew. You may speak a foreign language but need company or help in the home. You may be able to knit but need shopping done or guttering cleared.

In Georgina's experience, everyone gets something out of taking part. Her volunteers are on a database of skills along with the time they have available. Many of the requests for help are one-offs, others are on-going. Housing associations and sheltered schemes have benefited from swaps: sheltered housing benches were painted in exchange for the use of a meeting room, IT help exchanged for gardening, walking a dog for legal advice, writing a letter for some knitting, providing a lift for doing some ironing. Her group has linked with Age UK, to fill gaps which by their nature can't be catered for by the welfare system. More information can be found on their website www.stneotstimebank.org.uk

There are Timebanks in St Ives and Cambourne. Perhaps it is time we had one in the Fen Edge Patch. Please do let me know if you are interested and we can start a dialogue with the parish councils. There's no £50 bet to be won, but I would like to think that sense of good community will win out over apathy. **Wendy Dear**


HEART HELP IN FEN EDGE VILLAGES

Defibrillators have become the machines of choice for all involved in emergency medicine and now are common in the Fen Edge patch, at the ready to save lives. Used promptly the machine delivers an electric shock and restarts the heart.

ne of the newest machines, at Cottenham Community Centre, was installed as a result of the generosity of a village resident who wishes to remain anonymous, and staff, volunteers and trustees of the centre have received training in using it. In an emergency all defibrillators can be operated by an untrained person as the machine talks you through how to use it.

The importance of being trained in first aid, however, has prompted the centre to arrange sessions of Basic First Aid with Defibrillator training in 2015: Sunday 25th January and Saturday 7th February. The three hour training costs £20 and you receive a certificate of attendance. You can also gain a full Emergency First Aid at Work Certificate (EFAW) after six hours' training at a cost of £75. Bookings through smbainbridge@ntlworld. com and training time and date will be confirmed after the fee has been received.

Sudden cardiac arrest (SDA) can strike virtually anyone – man or woman, young or old – anywhere, anytime. Having an AED (Automated External Defibrillator) to hand is reassuring if it will take time for the



emergency services to reach the person. Every minute counts in such a situation and using the AED plus giving cardiopulmonary resuscitation (CPR, which is part of the first aid training) could save a life.

This is the sixth defibrillator in Cottenham: one at each doctors' surgery (in the High Street and Telegraph Street); one at Cottenham Village College and another at the Village Hall on the Recreation Ground, Lambs Lane.

Waterbeach has two defibrillators: one recently placed outside the doctors' surgery in Bannold Road. They are operational 24 hours a day and the code number to access them is held by the Emergency services on 999 to be provided when needed. Willingham is installing one in the sports pavilion. Rampton is getting one, supported by a British Heart Foundation grant. Landbeach has the matter under consideration.



here are really only two kinds of plants. Ones we like, and ones we don't. Weeds are in the second category and many are native species from which are descended the garden plants we enjoy now – such as polyanthus, related to the auricula brought in by Flemish lace makers and our native primrose.

Some weeds are a menace. Ground elder, Japanese Knotweed and ragwort in just about all of its forms should be dealt with urgently and positively. I've not had to deal with Japanese Knotweed, but on reading about it to prepare for this article I was surprised to find that I'd need to do what I've done with ground elder. Both are invasive, spread by rhizomes underground. The tops of both are killable with a glyphosate weedkiller, but both

can grow back from underground. With ground elder, regular inspection and killing over a season will probably do the trick.

Knotweed is a different matter and specialist advice is essential. Basically the treatment is to keep spraying the infestation and destroying the top growth. Never attempt to dig it out; it can grow back from a 1cm cutting. You'll have to keep an eye out for regrowth for at least a couple of years. For advice, go

to the Centre for Ecology and Hydrology www.capm.org.uk

Ragwort is native to this country, is a food source for many invertebrates, and a scourge to anyone with grazing animals. If you want to be a good neighbour, put your gloves on and pull it up. It made me smile when I read that a biological way of controlling it was by infesting it with cinnabar moths! For more information contact DEFRA and download their booklet The Code of practice on how to stop the spread of Ragwort.

Wildflowers should be among those plants you like. They look good, are pollen rich and

beneficial to insects. The plants bred from them, however, tend to be difficult for insects to access and are often sterile, leading to visiting bees having a fruitless journey. We need to do what we can to provide a good environment for bees; I was surprised to read that they contribute billions of pounds to the economy by pollinating crops. By doing so, they also keep us from starving.

Most wildflowers have an interesting history, playing a large part in healing us and contributing to our culinary efforts. While their natural home may be flowery meads and meadows, you can grow them in a mixed border – and have flowers from January (by stretching a point) to September. January would really be Ivy. I know it's not a flower, but it does have flowers out in January, and I've seen insects feeding on rare sunny days.

Spring plants for a border would include Grape Hyacinth, White Campion, Valerian and

forget me nots. For continuity, plant Greater Knapweed, or its relative, Centauria. To take you into late summer, add cranesbill, hypericum and meadowsweet. Consider other plants, such as Rosebay Willowherb, Loosestrife, Thrift, Heather and Ragged Robin, though space and management may be issues.

You can see how nature plants by walking along any local footpath: she's very good at it. Other places to gain inspiration would be Blakeney Point in May or

June, Beth Chatto's garden for 'dry' ideas, and the Wild Flower Centre at Letheringsett near Holt in Norfolk. For an armchair read, try Gardening with Wild Plants by Julian Slatcher (ISBN 1 86108 165 0), and Creating a Wild Flower Garden by Jonathan Andrews (ISBN 0 86350 115 X) if they're still in print! I'm planning to put a page on our website with planting lists: to delve deeper, look at www.simplygardeningofely.co.uk

TALKING ABOUT HEAT LOSS

A recent report in *The Guardian* newspaper described a Dutch scheme that makes homes carbon neutral by adding insulated panels that snap on like Lego. Insulated roofs with solar panels are fastened on top and heat pumps, hot water tanks and ventilation units are installed in garden sheds. If EU funding is given, pilot projects will start on council estates and housing association properties in London, Birmingham and southern England. Houses built in the 60s and 70s will receive the 10-day makeover though renovations can only be done if all tenants in a block agree. Tenants on the estate near Amsterdam who have had their properties upgraded say it is 'like living in a tea cosy' and there is no longer any traffic noise or draughts.

Action on Energy is working with South Cambridgeshire District Council (SCDC) to help improve insulation for homes built with solid walls through which heat escapes. With Government funding, up to £6,000 per property is available to help towards the cost of insulating these walls, either from the inside or the outside. A Green Deal assessment needs to be done and a Green Deal finance plan can

then be put in place, if required, to reduce upfront costs. Payments should be set no higher than a typical household would save on their bills. Check out www.actiononenergy.net

Sustainable Cottenham is a volunteer group working with SCDC's Sustainable Parish Energy Partnership and Action on Energy to identify which homes in Cottenham might be eligible for the grants. If you think your home has solid walls and want to be considered, contact parish councillor Christine Ward (01954 251813 or chris.ward@increment.co.uk) or district councillor Lynda Harford (lyndaharford@ icloud.com). For other home owners or tenants in Cottenham, the group also offers a free thermal image survey so you can see how well insulated your home is (or isn't). By using a special camera, areas of poor insulation, draughts etc (where heat is leaking out of a property) are identified. Surveys are best done on cold winter nights and once you see the graphic and colourful illustration of how much energy you are paying for but not using you might want to find out how to improve matters. 

LET ME TELL YOU ABOUT CVC

Steve Ellison took up the post of Executive Headteacher of Cottenham Academy in January 2012. Here he explains the changes that have happened.

The Academy is the term we use for the two schools on our site. One is a village college whilst the other, the Centre School, has approximately 50 places for young people who have particular emotional and/or social needs. Sue Raven has led the Centre School since it was established in 2008; she has taught at Cottenham for more than 37 years but has never had a day off due to ill health!

The schools are federated, which means they have one governing body, and became an academy a term before I took up post. I spend far more of my time leading the village college than I do the Centre School, mainly because my expertise is not in the field of special schools and, more importantly, because Sue is an incredible leader.

Becoming an academy has had a significant impact in terms of the bureaucratic demands on us. This is because of the legal and financial responsibilities academies now face. In the past the local authority looked after issues such as insurance but this now falls to us. I do not believe our students experience a significantly different education because of academy status.

Driving up standards is essential in all key aspects of our work. I am thrilled by the improvement to the standards of teaching, learning and behaviour I have seen. This year's results showed a significant improvement on those from the previous year despite the "volatility" that affected the exam results nationally. I am confident that we will see a further increase in 2015.

In terms of our community, I certainly want CVC to be a focal point for a great deal of activity. Henry Morris' concept of the village college* was visionary and is relevant today. I am delighted to be involved with FECA, the Fen Edge Family Festival and the myriad adult learning activities which take place at the college. It is a very exciting and rewarding aspect of my role and one I am determined to preserve. We remain steadfast in our commitment to achieving the very best for each and every one of our students whilst staying true to the vision of Henry Morris.



The problem is if you don't physically lock them (either with a key, or by lifting the handle to deploy the multi-lock system, depending upon which type of door you have), they are easily forced open by inserting a sharp instrument between the door frame and the key hole. The door literally just "pops" open. The message is simple: always properly lock the door when you go to bed or when you are out.

HISTORY TO CHERISH

he Dissenters' Cemetery in Lambs Lane, Cottenham, is currently being managed by a committee of eight, chaired by Ann Scott, who have come together to try to put it into better order. They are conscious of the fact that they are only the latest in a long line of volunteers and are gradually making progress: fencing has been replaced and a lot of work has been done on many old and dangerous trees.

The cemetery is a reminder of the struggle for religious equality that 'Dissenters' – people disagreeing with the teaching of the Church of England – faced in early modern times. It was founded in 1845 when members of the two Baptist (Old Meeting and Ebenezer) and the Wesleyan Methodist chapels bought the land by raising a subscription from amongst themselves and the well to do nonconformist tradesmen of Cambridge. Best known of these was the shopkeeper Robert Sayle, predecessor of John Lewis's. The first burial was a child, aged 3 years and 6 months, Ann Norman.

As nonconformists (including members of the later established Salvation Army) outnumbered Anglicans in 19th-century Cottenham, the cemetery is an important source of family history. There are 3827 burials listed in the register that can be located on a plan of the cemetery. In 1992, the Village Society copied all the monumental inscriptions on the gravestones and a transcription of the register itself is now underway.

The committee maintains trusteeship of the cemetery, but as some of the original clauses in the Trust Deed have since become outdated and impractical, says Ann, they are being reviewed in their entirety. One of her duties is that of Sexton and as such she has to be present at an interment or committal ceremony to check that the name on the coffin or casket is the one expected before certifying this to the Register Office. With modern burials or cremations no one is asked what their religion is, but many burials continue to have non conformist connections.

LEARNING AND LEISURE

Mind and body are catered for in the wide selection of classes offered to adults in the Fen Edge communities and now there is even more for different age groups through family learning and intergenerational events.

Janet Drinkwater, who oversees each term's range of temptations on behalf of South Cambidgeshire district council, is based at Cottenham Village College. Last year's attendances were excellent, with the Summer School in particular (last week of July) attracting between 140 and 160 learners a day.

In 2015 the aim is to widen the programme to include areas regarded as harder to reach, such as mental and physical health in the elderly, exploring the digital age, essentials for employability. Bringing different age groups together is high on the agenda. The first event, Remember the Fifties, organised in conjunction with the CareNetwork, was backed by a FECA grant so that older people could share their memories with college students at a coffee morning. This was followed by a Christmas event with lunch and lots of singing.

Another collaboration with NRICH Cambridge University provides 'Family Learning' workshops for parents or carers of Year 6, 7 and 8 students to aid the transition from Primary to Secondary level maths. There are also free Saturday workshops focusing on IT, and Family Learning events where families can join in a Japanese taster morning (7th Feb) and learn to make crafts together (14th March).

Daytime classes are popular and are on offer outside the college and in other villages: Pilates (very good for gentle strengthening of muscles and stability) at Rampton Village Hall, Fitness for Mature Movers in Waterbeach and at CVC, and Adult Ballet at the Cottenham Community Centre. The WEA (which some might remember as the Workers' Educational Association which built on the fine Victorian tradition of voluntary education for the working man) provides interesting morning courses in Willingham and Cottenham.




