hat a busy and exciting long weekend it was

not even some rain on Saturday could
dampen the spirits of the Fen Edge. And the

1st – a midsummer's day to remember – was sunny
and action-packed. Entertainment, food, music and fun

The FEFF Committee began organising the Festival in September 2014 with one objective: to make it a family friendly event — and we were delighted with the response. You might be surprised at how many people were involved in making it run like clockwork.

#### First, the Committee

Paul Knighton – Health and Safety Jo Bigger – Art exhibition and website Adam Lord – Marketing, sponsorship and programme

Diane and Eric Pranklin – Barbecue (Burgers and sausage dogs)

Lucy Dumbrell - Stalls

Jenny Swindell – organised activities on the playing fields and recruited volunteers as stewards/marshals

At the weekend committee members had much to do: erecting fencing, managing the stallholders and activity providers. They took turns in acting as Lead Stewards in the Control Tent, the nerve centre of the Festival. When it was over, after the well attended concert by Barry Palser's Jazz Band in the main marquee on Sunday night, they then faced the clearing up. On Monday everything was back to normal, a tremendous achievement.

#### Second, the helpers

About 150 volunteers (over 18 and under 80) filled 200 slots, acting as stewards and marshals, donning orange or yellow hi-vis jackets and carrying walkie talkies. They worked in two-hour shifts, from early morning to late at night, tackling everything from litter picking, to supervising the crossing from the Green to CVC, to

cleaning the loos or selling raffle tickets – we couldn't run the FEFF without them,

Very special thanks go to Alan Mappledoram who worked throughout from Thursday to Monday sorting out the electrical supply to the main marquee and other electrical equipment on the Green and near the pond in front of CVC – he even took lessons from the marquee contractor on how to put up and take down the partition. He kept the Festival working.

#### 21st birthday of Cottenham Village Design Statement

### Cottenham was one of the first villages in the country to make their views of development known

In 1993 the Countryside Commission, wishing to improve Rural Design, asked Cottenham and two other villages to write statements about their communities, highlighting the qualities valued by residents. The statement would ensure that further development would be based on a considered understanding of the village's past and present, protecting its special character. Cottenham has been one of the largest villages in Cambridgeshire since the 11th century. Its landscape, settlement patterns and buildings show the marks of more than 1,000 years of history.

A meeting in the village on 23 September 1993 resulted in the formation of the Cottenham Village Design Group, made up of local residents. After a wide public consultation, a design statement was adopted as Supplementary Planning Guidance by South Cambridgeshire District Council in May 1994 and the Design Group set up a formal constitution a year later and joined the Fen Edge Community Association.

In 2007 the statement was revised, based on the experience of using it to comment on planning applications and to reflect changes in the village, such as the large developments at Tenison Manor and Brenda Gautrey Way. It was published as a booklet (with the help of an award from the National Lottery) and can be found at the Cottenham Library and Cottenham Community Centre. #### COTTENHAM AT A DEVELOPMENT CROSSROADS

Times have changed since 2007. In August 2013 the South Cambridgeshire Strategic Housing Land Availability (SHLAA) report was published which assessed 14 sites in and around Cottenham in 2011 for possible housing development. One, which estimated 33 dwellings at the junction of Long Drove and Beach Road, is now completed. Called Pelham Grange, it has 47 properties. Another, described as 'land at Rampton Road' intimated a capacity of 220 dwellings. Gladman Developments (http://www.your-views.co.uk/cottenham/) are proposing a to build 'approximately 250 homes

and 70 apartments'. They leafleted 400 homes and businesses, not the whole village, but there are 'consultation boards' on their website highlighting issues and asking for comments.

Information about the development was raised by Cottenham residents via the community website Streetlife but it is on the Parish Council website and Facebook page. There are several concerns: increased traffic, infrastructure, turning the village into a town, and the pressure on educational facilities. Another proposal, for a site on Oakington Road, will also add to these.

Cottenham Primary School which has been increased in size to accommodate existing pupils plus a moderate increase from Pelham Grange has no capacity for expansion, County Council education officers have advised. Additional housing would require further primary education provision. District Councillor Lynda Harford has said that any developments would be looked at cumulatively as to their effect on the village. Steven Poole from the Design Group says neither has reached the planning application stage when the plans will be scrutinised and the Parish Council will make its views known.

Recently the Parish Council started local consultations on a Neighbourhood Plan. Check it out on the website: www.cottenhampc. org.uk/neighbourhood-plan/ and post your comments. Councillors can only act on your behalf if they know what you think. Such a plan would have a shared vision for the neighbourhood as well as policies for the protection, development and use of land. It can consider issues such as housing, employment, heritage and transport. An NP needs involvement of the local community to succeed, and has to be passed by referendum – though that could be up to two years away.

In the meantime, because of the pressure to provide housing in South Cambridgeshire, villages are vulnerable to speculative developers – 'vampires', one councillor called them (reported in the Cambridge News). Cottenham Parish Council website has a document on the SCDC development policies on which potential developments are judged. If you want to object to a development, quote the policy numbers as to where they breach policy. **Wendy Dear**

- Cottenham locals Dani Swann and Jack Swinton made exercise look rhythmic with their contemporary dances. They run SCAMBS on Saturdays at CVC in the gym from 11 for an hour: info from tutusrus@ntlworld.com or jackstinton@gmail.com
- Line dancing and zumba certainly take your breath away as the performers demonstrated, challenging the mind and body as the calories burn up. Classes of both are held at CCC (see p53) or contact Jo on 07915 043205. For traditional movements to music you can start very young (from 4) with Irish Dancing, shown to effect in the main marquee by the Caroll Lehane Academy (www.cambridgeirishdance.com).



- The music choice was wide, in both marquees and the community cafe. The tartan kilts of the Cambridgeshire Caledonian Pipe Band were eye-catching on the Green and their popular offering of bagpipes and drums came to a muchapplauded end just before Brooks Williams slung his acoustic guitar over his shoulder and transported those gathered in the main marquee to blue-grass America. He's a familiar face in Cottenham, where he lives, and looking at the audience he said he recognised faces that he'd seen in the Co-op. If you missed him, you can catch him again at Rampton (see p15).
- A stunning contrast followed: Junior Prime Brass sending out a great sound despite having not played together for the last three months while concentrating on their GCSEs. These under 17s



take it all in their stride, and with confidence. The big Cottenham Brass has now a 15-year-old drummer, so the youngsters have a big future round here presenting popular music. Cottenham Brass moved on to hymns to finish the afternoon session, with the local clergy leading the songs of praise.



- Cottenham based TyrannoChorus is a combination of three choirs: TongueTwisters (under 11), VoxPop (under 18) and bigMouth (under 100). They're a clever lot, rehearsing separately yet able to perform together as they did on the Saturday, while the two older groups presented their eclectic mix on the Sunday. They even had a stall on the Green where people could test their yocal chords for fun.
- There was standing room only at the Venue for most of the FEFF, but on Sunday it was especially packed, everyone enchanted by an extraordinary range of entertainment. It started with a busking session and led through to the sultry lively mix of Djangophonix (bass, violin and guitars) and the Fenatics whose individual style and vocalists are obviously much appreciated.



### **WATERBEACH NEWS**

he Parish Council has applied for Waterbeach to be designated as a Neighbourhood Area. The village is described as being set in a predominantly rural area with significant agricultural land and a mix of housing, industry and commerce. Much of the land is low lying and prone to flooding and the pumping capacity limited so that flooding risk and surface water drainage are significant issues.

Community engagement and consultation are considered necessary in these applications. The council called a public meeting and asked those who attended to write their views on stickies about what should be included in a Neighbourhood Plan. The issues were wide ranging and fell under general headings. They are too numerous to list here, however a full list can be found on the website www.waterbeach.org.uk; here is a selection of what residents considered necessary.

**Housing**: ensure houses have adequate parking (including for visitors); mix of housing types, more social housing and new houses to be ecofriendly with solar panels.

**Health and welfare**: health provision to include optician, dentist, physio; safer access to pharmacy; place for older people to meet daily; more GP out of hours service.

**School and family services**: ensure school sizes stay ahead of development; more spaces for younger children; encourage teenagers to be more involved in village life.

**Transport**: infrastructure before development; improve the A10 (including cycle paths to Chittering); 20mph speed limit in village; Sunday buses,; more parking at station; minibus service between Milton, Landbeach, Horningsea and Waterbeach. Lack of pedestrian and school crossings were noted.

Flooding and drainage: review sewerage capacities; planning applications must detail drainage and effect on existing homes. What local people want is to keep farmland as farmland and not to allow building on the flood plain.

The area designated in the application includes the former Barracks and additional farmland.

some of which is still farmed and includes woodland, grassland and ponds/lakes rich in wildlife, flora and fauna. One of the suggestions was to erect a Disneyworld on the Barracks site!

The four weeks consultation on this application will finish on 24 July.
