his issue which straddles 2015 and 2016 is a chance to look back – and look forward. For FECA, it was a rewarding year. With the success of the Fen Edge Family Festival, FECA was able to distribute a wide variety of grants. At Cottenham Village College, for instance, the stage in the hall is arrayed in new curtains, two thirds of the cost covered by a FECA grant and the remaining third by Cottenham Theatre Workshop, a group which has been a longtime member of FECA. This updating will benefit not just CTW which uses the hall for twice-yearly productions but also CVC's drama and music groups.

FECA was able to support CVC also with its new pupil initiative called SHINE, which encourages all ages at the college to understand the meaning of, and be part of, the community. We contributed to the seniors' tea party at the Willingham Feast, and gave a grant for the seniors Christmas lunch, provided at CVC by the 6th Form catering students. Grants were given too to Landbeach Busytots, a voluntary group which organises weekly sessions for babies and toddlers, and Singing to Remember, a Care Network initiative for people with dementia and their carers. The proceeds of the Fun Run were used to support the Year 5 ukulele group at Cottenham Primary School. Looking forward, many of the women and men who have served for a number of years on the FECA Committee or on the FEFF Committee (many on both) now need to move on to other commitments and will be standing down at the AGM in May 2016. This is an opportunity for new people from the five villages to be part of making the Fen Edge a vibrant community.

These are the roles which need to be filled: Chair of FECA; Treasurer Editor of the Fen Edge News; Trustee of the FECA Committee, Secretary of the FECA Committee, and members of the FEFF subcommittee. Any of the FECA Committee members would be happy to talk to you or your group about what these roles entail. You are welcome to come along to future meetings to find out more or to put forward innovations that you would like to introduce. NEIGHBOURHOOD PLANNING

Cottenham and Waterbeach (see p55) are both in the process of formulating Neighbourhood Plans which would give those who live in the villages a say in how their communities develop. The plans aren't created overnight, and the parish councils are asking us all to get involved and to put our points of view. Wendy Dear reports Cottenham Parish Council has to pass eight 'milestones' before July 2016 when it is hoped a referendum will be held to decide whether a Neighbourhood Plan would be right for Cottenham, South Cambs District Council has designated the whole of the parish as a Neighbourhood Area and a plan based on this would provide a blueprint for the village's future development and growth. Such a plan has become more urgent with the publication of the Rural Plan (see page 9) and proposals for several speculative developments in the Oakington/Rampton Road side of the village which, if approved, could expand the population by more than 20% over the next five years, creating almost a new suburb. After a public meeting at Cottenham Village College in September, when a range of concerns were raised by villagers, the parish council recommended that South Cambridgeshire District Council refuse one of the proposals, for 225 homes and 70 residential care places, as there was no obvious way in which that expansion could be absorbed sustainably. The same applied to another planning application for 50 homes; and a third, for 130 homes, was

also recommended for refusal.

Sustainability is the word used to describe the quality of life expected by those living in the village. It is seriously challenged by increased traffic, noise, pollution, added pressure on medical and day care provisions, the capacity of the sewerage and drainage system, the effect on house prices, and increased demand on preschool, primary and secondary school places.

The final planning decision might well be made at a public inquiry which would examine whether the proposed benefits of these developments would outweigh the threats. On its website, SCDC states: "The viability of a development scheme has been given greater emphasis in recent years due in most part to an uncertain housing market and the withdrawal of grant funding for affordable housing. In some cases the planning authority will be unable to support a scheme, despite having undertaken a robust viability appraisal, due to the proposal failing to create a sustainable mixed and balanced community."

WHAT HAPPENS NEXT?

Cottenham Parish Council, with a £5,000 starter grant and another £8,000 from the government, is pressing ahead with the NP. The first milestone established shared principles: more affordable homes, more pre-school places; better medical and day care provision; more local employment; improved recreation; improved transport and easier movement; not to compromise the village character; not to increase noise and pollution; and not to overload the primary school.

A survey, devised with the help of a panel

of interested consultants from local groups – such as the Fen Edge Community Association – will be posted to all houses in the village. "We need as many residents as possible to complete the survey either online or using the reply-paid envelope," says Frank Morris, Parish Council chair. "Once you've done your own, encourage all your friends, neighbours, relatives and workmates to do the same. Local charities will benefit by 50p for each survey returned on time."

The Fen Edge Community Association (FECA) will be one of the 10 charities listed Members of these charities are happy to help anyone to complete the survey.

WHAT THE VILLAGE NEEDS

By late February, having analysed the completed surveys, a vision of the village's needs can be rated and the various problems evaluated. There may be development gaps and so ways in which to close them will be agreed via a series of open sessions. A draft NP will be drawn up and distributed locally for comments from villagers. Analysis and revision will follow before it is submitted first to SCDC for approval, then for independent examination. SCDC would then organise the referendum which would ask residents to vote on the plan. If residents say yes, the plan would give the PC the authority needed to prevent developments unacceptable to Cottenham and to improve the village, a shared vision for the neighbourhood.

EFFECT OF RURAL PLAN

The first ever Rural Productivity Plan produced by the government in August aims to boost the rural economy but may impact on planning. The plan will "help our villages to thrive by making it easier for them to establish a neighbourhood plan and allocate land for new homes, including through the use of rural exception sites to deliver Starter Homes". The Starter Homes policy, which came into force in March 2015, allows amendment of planning laws so houses can be built on under-used or unviable commercial or industrial sites not currently identified for housing, on both public and private land and in rural areas.

COMMUNITY LAND TRUSTS

One way to ensure affordable housing is built is to set up a CLT, a non profit trust, that develops and stewards housing, civic buildings, community gardens and other assets on behalf of the community. Such a trust is guided by, and accountable to, the people who call the locality their home. Quite a few have been set up in villages and market towns to take the initiative to develop new homes and services for local people who work locally. In Soham, for example, Thrift CLT, is in negotiation with East Cambs District Council to take on the affordable housing component of a 600 unit urban extension in partnership with a housing association and the local authority. This extension would dramatically change the landscape of the town and the CLT wants to ensure public involvement. Stretham and Wilburton CLT is financially enabled to build and manage affordable homes and community facilities in perpetuity; it is building 35 private and 15 affordable houses plus business units and a GP surgery on a 12acre site obtained from a community-minded landowner and backed by a Cambridge College. Maybe there are similar community-minded landowners in Cottenham?

FEAST A SUCCESS

Villagers provided a guard of honour for the floats that made their way from Twenty Pence Road along the High Street to the War Memorial and then the Green in October. There was brisk business at the many stalls and over 200 medals were given out to the under 16s who took part. Local not-for-profit groups were invited to seek a share of the £1370 collected en route.

IT'S ALL GO AT THE REC

The new Sports Pavilion is now in action. There are four changing and two officials' rooms, a multi-purpose room (for hire, holds approximately 40 people) plus a kitchen and toilets. The adult and junior football and cricket teams will mostly use the facilities. The two grass courts adjacent to the building will be reinstated in due course. The Parish Council says it cost Cottenham £250,000 to build this facility with the help of grants from the Football Foundation, Sport England, South Cambridgeshire District Council and others. The SkatePark, now very popular with children on skateboards and scooters, was also achieved by a combination of a major grant from recycler WREN, financial contributions from developers and cash from SCDC.

COTTENHAM PRIMARY SCHOOL

After three years in planning we were delighted that the building was ready ahead of everyone returning after summer holidays.

The development was undertaken because our pupil numbers had outgrown the space we had. Our Head, Deputy Head and Assistant Deputy Head were sharing one tiny office.

This term, for the first time in over 18 months, we have a new hall in which to hold a whole school assembly. Peace and calm are restored throughout. The mobiles are replaced by new classrooms with four on the upper level, occupied by our older children in years 5 and 6. We have new toilet blocks, two new offices for the Head and Deputy Head, new intervention rooms, new music rooms, wider corridors, a lift to the upper level, new

children's kitchen, a new library replenished by our wonderful PTCA. Teachers and TAs had a short time to prepare for their pupils but without exception they rose to the challenge decorating, adding books, bunting, reading areas, numberlines, science displays, topic walls, bringing colour and life into the new classrooms.

Pupils take pride and an active part in running the new building. They volunteer as corridor monitors making sure everyone gets to where they need to be, especially at lunchtime, and to keep left on the staircase.



At our school, visions and aims are not just a line in our prospectus – they are alive and evident: aim high, accept challenge, persevere, strive for excellence. For this reason, we were excited that Kristian Thomas accepted our invitation to open the school. He is a Team GB Gymnast and Olympic, World, European and Commonwealth Medalist most recently winning gold at the 2015 European Gymnastic Championships, a wonderful role model for our pupils. The opening event included a performance by our Key Stage 2 choir and among the guests were the current year 7 children at CVC who endured the building work but missed the chance of a new classroom.

Thank you to everyone who supported the school during the build and to our neighbours for their patience. Come and have a look if you are passing. Friends are always welcome at Cottenham Primary. **Barbara Duckworth**, Chair of Governors



LOCAL HEALTH AWARENESS

All English GP practices have to have a Patient Participation Group which is representative of the practice population. The main aim is to ensure that the practice puts the patient, and improving health, at the heart of what it does. The PPGs are supported by a senior GP Partner and the Practice Manager, and meetings are held every six weeks or bi-monthly.

• The Firs House Histon and Telegraph Street Cottenham PPG has up to 16 patient members and is supplemented by representatives from the Virtual Patient Reference Group (VPRG) of over 800 patient members. Representatives of the PPG and VPRG have participated in public consultations on health-related issues.

The PPG has organised a number of health promotion events in partnership with the Community Centres in Cottenham and Histon. FOODBANK SERVING THE FEN EDGE VILLAGES

This winter the choice between putting food on the table or having the heating on will be a very real decision for many in our communities. As increasing numbers struggle with benefit changes, low income and debts, Foodbanks will be filling the gap as they have been doing for 20 years. What would happen to people without them?

Ely Foodbank, which was established in 2012 only to support Ely, soon grew – reaching out to Soham, Sutton, Chatteris and March. It now handles 82 tonnes of stock which highlights the level of need. Cottenham is also serving surrounding villages in the Fen Edge. The Distribution Centre was launched on 29th April 2015 and is headed by CTIC (Christians Together in Cottenham) operating from the Baptist Church on the High Street on Wednesdays.

Volunteers greet clients with refreshments and a non-judgemental attitude. There is an opportunity to talk through the issues that brought them to Foodbank and the volunteers work hard to direct people to services that hopefully could alleviate some of their difficulties.

Phrases such as "we are only a pay cheque away from things turning upside down" and "for the grace of God there go you and I' ensure we meet the needs of others in a generous, big hearted fashion – because it could possibly be any one of us in this situation.

Foodbanks operate predominantly from a voucher system which frontline care workers give to clients who are in need. The food, enough for three days, is basic. Pasta, beans, soup, rice pudding and cereal are among items given to help an individual or family through a crisis. The food is pre-packed at the Ely Store into family or single/couple sizes to be unpacked and given to the clients in supermarket carrier bags (now there is a 5p charge for these, we welcome donations).

If you would like to volunteer or if you work for a frontline organisation and could issue vouchers to those in need, please get in touch. Collection points for food donations are at Cottenham Co-op, Cottenham Community Centre Coffee Shop, Rampton Motors and any of the Cottenham churches. Financial donations are also always welcome. 



MONEY MATTERS

BEING SAFE ONLINE

Mr S used his debit card online and a month later discovered that the card details had been used by another company to take an amount money from his account. He went back to Company A to find out how this had happened, and cancelled the action of Company B. He complained to the Financial Ombudsman and learnt, to his amazement, that if passing on the details to another company were part of the terms of agreement then the action was legal.

Lesson: make certain you read the terms of agreement before ticking the box to say you have. Not all terms of agreement are the same. Be careful about boxes as the message can differ: tick if you agree to us passing on details, tick if you do not wish us to pass on details.

Mrs W responded to a pop-up offer which appealed to her vanity: two packs of different face treatments not available in stores, for £3.99 each. She paid by debit card. Three weeks later her bank contacted her to ask if she had authorised two companies to take £3.99 and £99 each from her account. The bank had been alerted because the demands came from abroad. The woman from the bank's fraud department asked if she had done the transaction online and whether she had read the small print. Included in this was a message, that if the goods are not returned unused within 14 days you will pay a monthly fee for the products. The fraud department contacted the companies and cancelled the commitment. But those facesaving creams had been very pricey indeed. Lessons: do not take up an offer without reading

all the information about it: make sure that a 'free' or 'cheap' trial does not commit you to an ongoing cost or membership; check your bank account frequently and make certain you know what all the entries mean; best of all, ignore pop-up ads.

'COPYCAT' WEBSITES

If you are renewing your passport, driving licence or car road tax or wish to obtain a European Health Insurance Card, do not use a search engine to find the right website. Go straight to www.gov.uk and

use the search function.

Copycat websites offer to provide certain services for a fee, and they are not official providers.

FRAUDSTERS' TRICKS

They can come by phone or email, and the purpose will be to get from you details that allow the fraudster to rob you. There are many scams about, many aimed at near retirees and pensioners. No trusted organisation (your bank, energy company, the police etc) will ask you for financial information that might require you to give full security details, your pin or card reader codes. Lesson: do not respond if you are offered opportunistic deals that require you to follow an email link or another phone number. Online, move the request to the trash. On the phone, just disconnect.

COST OF AUCTIONS

Daytime television shows about buying and selling bits and bobs for cash are very popular. And of course there must be occasions when an amazing bargain is found. But how much do you know about the costs involved? According to Radio 4's Money Box presenter Paul Lewis, writing in the Financial Times, it is difficult to come out ahead. If you buy at auction and then sell your prized investment later at another auction, the price will have to rise by at least 50 % above the amount you bid before you even begin to make a profit, he wrote. The 'hammer' price is not the price the buyer pays, or what the seller receives.

Here is how Paul Lewis described 'auction arithmetic'. On to the bid (hammer) price is added 25% buyer's premium (to cover admin costs) plus VAT and up to 3% more if you pay by credit card. When, after some time, you decide to sell (because you think its value has increased), you will get the hammer price less 15% commission and VAT. The auction house has gained from you when you bought and when you sold, and though the item itself was VAT-free, you have had to pay this government tax as well.

In your garden: Putting down new roots

Ken Ellis from Cottenham Gardeners' Club shows you how to make the right moves

ave you got plants that could benefit from a move, or a border to revamp, or some bigger ones that need splitting? Have you put off doing this for fear they might die? Though it's true that some plants don't appreciate being disturbed, most will tolerate a change, so long as you are careful.

If the weather isn't frosty or too cold, now is the

ideal time to do it – and preparation is essential. Roses transplant well. Basically, you dig them up, trim their roots back, dig a hole where you want them to go and put them in. If moving a shrub or small tree the hole you dig should be big enough to take its root ball. You'll have to guess dimensions to start with, but too big is better than too small. Soak the area around the shrub the evening before so that the roots are moist. Have a large plastic sheet handy to put the shrub on. Dig round the root ball with a fork to gauge its size, and then gradually dig it out. When it is free from the ground, lift it onto the sheet, and drag it to its new position, disturbing the root and soil ball as little as possible. Put some rotted manure or compost in the hole, trim off any damaged bits of root, and place the shrub so that it's upright and facing the way you want it. But do make sure the plant is at the same height as it was before, especially important with roses. Too deep and you'll get suckers from the graft at the bottom of the plant. Add some micro rizal fungus around the roots to encourage root growth. Prune the bush back hard, and make sure it's secure in the ground and won't rock. This is necessary because the plant won't have many fine roots through which to absorb moisture and nutrients. Too much top growth at this point will stress and

This is basically what I do with all transplants. Just remember not to keep a plant hanging around out of the ground as delay lessens its chance of survival. Herbaceous perennials are good movers: being split brings back vigour. Have a sheet handy, and an old fashioned bread knife. Digging up the plant and dividing it may actually involve a lot of fork work and huffing and puffing, but what better on

may kill the plant. Water it well and don't let it dry

out when it begins to grow.

a bright winter day? How to divide? You can pull it apart by inserting two forks back to back and forcing the plant to split, or by cutting through it with the bread knife. The trick is to make sure that you get a nice clump with promising looking new shoots appearing on the top, and a good amount of root system on the bottom. The carnage may look alarming, but believe me, in a couple of months the plant won't even notice.

I quite like splitting up polyanthus, after flowering. Don't be afraid, just dig them up. Tease the soil apart with your fingers, and you'll see the fat tap root, and side shoots developing with their own bits of root. Gently pull them apart, or use a small, sharp knife to do it. If you're potting them on, do dip them in an anti fungal compound to stop problems with mildew. If you're dividing up a clump to move them around outside, make sure they're thoroughly watered, and don't let them dry out. Any of the primrose family will take the same treatment.

Some plants can be grumpy if you try to move them, and are best left alone. I would have included the peony in this lot – until last year. Having lived with one in what was an inconvenient place for 39 years, last August – when it was still growing – I followed the method given above and got it out of the ground in one hit, whereupon it promptly split into two. I replanted both bits in new places, and wished them luck. Both survived! But we wait with interest to see if they flower this year.

It's not a good idea to move a plant while it's blooming or if it has long taproots, as foxgloves and hollyhocks do. Plants won't always enjoy moving from one environment to another. Don't be surprised if one that's flourished in semi shade gets cross in the bright sunny path you took it to. On the other hand, a move might be right for a plant that's struggling. We moved a Campsis Radicans less than three yards across a bed. It rewarded us by covering itself in flowers for the first time. If you've a plant that you think may not move easily, it's probably best to hedge your bets: take cuttings or harvest some seeds and grow new plants. Now, there's an idea for an article....



WATERBEACH NEWS

NEIGHBOURHOOD PLAN

Waterbeach Parish Council with members of the community have had their proposal to include the whole of Waterbeach Parish, the Barracks site as well, accepted by South Cambs District Council. There were objections from Urban & Civic and Royal London Waterbeach Estates both of which are involved in the proposed Waterbeach New Town on a 716 acre site.

Keep Waterbeach Rural, a local pressure group and supporter of the NP, says the proposal might suit an urban setting but is not appropriate in a rural environment. Another concern is the small number of affordable homes in the development. With the whole parish covered by the NP, this gives "us a seat at the table for negotiations with benefits for our village," says Cllr. Peter Johnson.

Urban & Civic have distributed a community

newsletter in which they state they have "developed an engagement strategy with the input of the Parish Council, Neighbourhood Plan working group and the District Council". There are however many issues to be resolved, including the inspection of the Local Plan by SCDC (due to resume in March). Cllr. James Hockney wrote in the autumn issue of Beach News: "I cannot underline the significance of the Localism Act bringing forward the neighbourhood Plan concept for communities like ours. It will mean more funding, having legal force over non strategic elements of the Local Plan and giving us a greater say in shaping our community in areas such as planning and transport."

A proposed development of up to 144 homes in Bannold Road, Waterbeach, has been withdrawn because of objections from the local Highways Authority and the County Council's Flood and Water team. The Facebook page of KeepWaterbeachRural shows the site in flood. Ongoing problems with flooding and sewage backing up in the area have yet to be resolved.

PO RELOCATED

Waterbeach Post Office has moved from the High Street to the Village Stores in Chapel Street. A pedestrian crossing is planned for Chapel Street.

NEW SKATE PARK A SUCCESS

The bad weather held up the completion of the park but it is now much enjoyed by our young people on skateboards and scooters. The building of this 'wheeled park' was made possible by substantial grants from WREN and Amey Cespa.

WATERBEACH STATION

More parking spaces have not yet eventuated though discussions continue with National Rail regarding the adjacent site. The situation remains difficult for all who use the station and might not be able to find somewhere to park. The number of people travelling to/from Waterbeach has increased remarkably: just over 10 years ago (from 2002/3) 176,639 people a year used the station. Now there are 344,722 according to the Office of Rail and Road.

UPLIFT FOR LIBRARY

Waterbeach Independent Library is a success story, bucking the trend of lack of library use in other parts of the country. It is run entirely by volunteers, on a frugal budget £3,500 a year, paid by the Parish Council from the precept which comes from council tax. The library which is in the community room at Waterbeach School was recently refurbished, carried out by Sanctuary Housing. Hills Builders, having built a new hostel in the village, did the work as a community benefit.




