

REPORT FROM THE FECA AGM

ileen Wilson, retiring Chair: Events like the FEFF provide the infrastructure that enables local groups to raise their own funds and get themselves known to everyone in the Fen Edge. It also brings in funds to FECA for grants. FECA made a number of awards in the past year. One to Cottenham Village College, to help with set up costs for the new SHINE programme, will have knock on benefits for the community through the community work undertaken by the students. Cottenham Theatre Workshop and the Village College now have new stage curtains in the hall. Smaller grants went to the Fen Edge Twinning Association for the French visit in May, the Care Network who organised a Christmas lunch for older people at CVC and a Singing to Remember group for people with dementia at Landbeach Baptist church, Busytots in Landbeach for a young children's event. Proceeds from last year's and this year's Cottenham Fun Run went to the Primary School: for the year 5 Ukulele Project and to stock the new library with books.

FECA are in an ongoing discussion with Cottenham Village College about the costs of room hire. It is hoped the outcome will benefit FECA members.

FECA has found a home for the printer purchased with a grant from the Community Chest back in 2012 for community use. Once procedures and costs for printing are agreed, this will be a money-saving facility available to FECA members.

The AGM was the last meeting for Mick Saul who has done many years as Treasurer, both of FECA and the FEFF. Robert Turner was elected as the new Treasurer. Caroline Dethridge and Rebecca Cole stood down from the committee and both were thanked for their contributions to the FEFF and Fun Run.

THE COMMITTEE: Eileen will stay on the committee, focusing on building up membership. Other members are Graham Mumby, Wendy Dear, Janet Drinkwater and Rebecca Walsh.

BRUCE ROBJENT reported on the Twinning Association. 55 people from Avrillé in the Loire valley arrived on Thursday 5th May. All went to London on Friday, joined in the Fun Run on Saturday followed by a picnic at Landbeach. Ceilidh and supper at CVC Saturday evening with 125 people and a caller attempting to call in French. Resounding success. 2018

sees Avrillé celebrate the 20th anniversary of twinning with Cottenham, 30 years with its Spanish partner and 40 years with its German partner, with all four communities gathering in the Loire valley for the event. After the referendum result, this close relationship forged through the EU may not be the same then.

THE FOOTPATH GROUP has had an active year with a recent trip to Youlgrave in the Peak district: 12 miles on the Saturday and 8 miles on the Sunday. It has organised a Summer School of Walking, and on Boxing Day it held a Holly Walk attended by 50 people.

THE RAMPTON 77 COMMITTEE was set up in 1977, the year of the Queen's Silver Jubilee. It won the South Cambs Community Award for Outstanding Local Service. Its events include a fun run, Tea on the Green, a June Summer Fair and a Seniors Christmas Dinner (in January). It has given £3,000 in grants in 5 years.

COTTENHAM THEATRE WORKSHOP has organised two productions a year since 1977. Funds are ploughed back into room hire, stage curtains (they paid a third of the costs), sound system etc. New members constantly being sought. This year's pre-Christmas production is The Wizard of Oz, taking place at the end of November/early December, at CVC (see p8).

JANET DRINKWATER, Adult and Family Learning Manager at CVC, thanked FECA for grants for coffee mornings with the Care Network, and a Christmas Lunch which led to regular Fitness for Mature Movers classes each term. There are now 18 members in the Cottenham group and 8 in the Waterbeach group, with Rampton and Willingham next in line. The sessions are subsidized and involve 1 hour of exercise and a cup of tea.

On the Adult Learning side, 55% of attendees come from outside the FEN villages. With Impington and Swavesey joining CVC in a combined advertising brochure, the courses now reach 24,000 households rather than 6,700. CVC gets around 1,000 learners a year, some are returners, but the institution is thriving and always looking for new ideas.

County funding will continue through 2016/17 but there is no commitment after that. Money is channelled from the government through the Skills Funding Agency down to county level. If that funding is removed, it will make a big difference, especially as pricing is already a huge balancing act.

TYRANNOCHORUS in concert

With the help of a grant from FECA, the Cottenham choirs were among 400 voices performing Carl Orff's Carmina Burana at the Royal Albert Hall on 10th July. TyrannoChorus director Siobhan Lihoreau was delighted that the youngest singers, TongueTwisters, were chosen to be part of the children's choir along with older children from Harston and Newton School (who they often sing with) and a boys' choir from Bromley in Kent. "Children (and adults!) were very excited. Can you imagine being 8yrs old and singing a major part at the RAH! So fantastic. As well as having your name on the posters and in the programme – what memories they will have!" said Siobhan

MAKE A DATE AT THE LIBRARY

With cuts happening everywhere, we are lucky to have our library on Margett Street. It's there for all to use if you are seeking information about almost anything! For instance if you have queries about care and support, the helpful librarians can point you in the right direction. They keep details of local activities and useful advisory groups like the Citizens Advice Bureau which can offer help and support, and the Care Network which aims to help people stay healthy, happy and independent for longer. This year's summer holiday challenge for primary school children is The Big Friendly Read inspired by the ever-popular Roald Dahl (2016 is the centenary of his birth) and a range of activities will be available. There's something for older children, and for the pre-schoolers as well. In term time, the youngest ones have Rhyme Time sessions on Tuesday afternoons.

For adults involved in tracing their family history, questions and answers and brick walls can be tackled at the drop-in sessions, which are normally held on the third Monday of the month from 7-9pm. Dates: 18th July, 15 August, 26 September and 21 November.

COUNTY-WIDE BIRD CLUB

This group promotes the study, recording and conservation of birds in Cambridgeshire and encourages a wider interest in natural history and the protection of wildlife habitats. There are speaker meetings from September to May, field trips in the summer and occasionally at other times, as well as a biannual conference.

Spring and autumn speaker meetings and the conference are held at Cottenham Village College. In winter the group meets at St John's Church Hall, Hills Road, Cambridge. Non members always welcome.

Cottenham WI - looking good at 90

he Women's Institute began life in 1916, a time when little heed was taken of women's opinions or concerns and the idea proved very popular in rural communities. Ten years later in Cottenham, on Wednesday 8th December 1926, 50 women joined as founding members. An unbroken sequence of monthly meetings has been held ever since and today we still thrive with 56 current members. The speaker at our first meeting was Mrs. Pond from Girton WI who told of her experiences since their start in 1919. In 1947 we celebrated our 21st anniversary with a display of conjuring tricks, plus songs and stories by Cambridge Footlights Club. Last year we planted a tree in the village to commemorate the movement's centenary. The Queen held a garden party at Buckingham Palace in honour of the WI and two members went to this event. One member also was a delegate at the WI's AGM, in the Albert Hall, London.

The WI has a long tradition of inviting a guest speaker to monthly meetings to inform and entertain. Recently we have enjoyed talks on topics as diverse as 'Life in India – with cookery demonstration', 'History of Belly Dancing' and 'Dogs for the Disabled'. In earlier years many talks concerned practical household skills or medical matters.

These skills were put to good use in World War Two when the Ministry of Food co-opted the WI to organise making preserves. Could this be the origin of a popular jest that the WI is about 'Jam and Jerusalem'? So 90 years on what does Cottenham WI offer you? Perhaps most importantly we provide an easy way to make new friends amongst those who live locally. We deepen these friendships through shared experiences and simple competitions to get everyone talking - such as 'best blooms' from our own gardens – and participation in village events. Watch out for our float at the Cottenham Feast on 16th October. It has a Shakespearean theme, to mark the 400th anniversary of his birth. In summary we are proud of our past and traditions but we adapt to the changing needs and interests of our members. For those who are so minded there is opportunity to work on our committee or even progress to Cambridgeshire or National roles. 

TODAY'S CHALLENGE - BE CANCER AWARE

Tony's story

Maria and Jim Brennan of Cottenham are backing the national campaign to raise awareness of cancer in memory of their son Tony who died last year, aged 36, of pancreatic cancer. He was the second of four sons, did weights, played football and was fit – his nickname was Bones!

"He was never overweight," says Maria, "but in May I could see he was losing weight. He had indigestion and backache and pains in his legs."

The diagnosis was made in July at Addenbrooke's where he had gone with chest pains. A CT scan revealed clots in both lungs, lesions in his liver as well as cancer in the pancreas. He died a month later.

The family still live with the suddenness and sadness of the tragedy but they have become active fundraisers for research into this aggressive disease whose outcomes have not improved in 40 years. Early diagnosis (nearly half of patients are diagnosed in A&E) is the Holy Grail. Pancreatic

Cancer UK campaigns for greater recognition of the disease and believes urgent action is needed so people and GPs are aware of the symptoms.

The following has been compiled by NHS England/Department of Health/Cancer Research UK: symptoms to talk to your GP about

Breast

The NHS breast awareness five point code says: 1. Know what is normal for you. 2. Look and feel. 3. Know what changes to look for. 4. Report any changes without delay. 5. Attend for breast screening if you are aged 50 or over. Ask to see a nurse if unsure about what to look for.

Bowel

Blood in poo and 'looser poo' – diarrhoea – that have persisted for 3 or more weeks.

Prostate

The symptoms of prostate problems include: having to rush to the toilet to pass urine; passing urine more often than usual, especially at night; difficulty passing urine, including straining to pass it or stopping and starting; a sense of not being able to completely empty the bladder.

Skin

A change to a mole isn't the only sign – go to your doctor if you see any unusual or persistent changes

in your skin. Places to check: your back, back of legs, under feet.

Bladder and Kidney

If you notice blood in your pee, even if it's 'just the once'.

Ovarian

Feeling bloated, most days, for 3 weeks or more could be a sign of ovarian cancer.

Oesophago-gastric

Having heartburn, most days, for 3 weeks or more could be a sign of cancer.

Pancreatic

Symptoms of cancer of the pancreas vary: watch for pain in the stomach area or back, jaundice (yellowing of the skin), and weight loss. Symptoms can be vague but see your doctor if you are at all worried.

If you have any questions, see your doctor or ask for a phone appointment to discuss concerns



COTTENHAM PARISH COUNCIL

Chair Frank Morris in his report to the AGM said "It is 121 years since the Cottenham PC first met and it is good to see Cottenham residents - young and old contributing in so many ways. This year's outstanding contribution must be from Jigneth Amin (Jigs) who stepped in to keep a Post Office service in the village." Activity on the Neighbourhood Plan paused while we concentrated on applications to South Cambs District Council: Endurance (outline to build up to 50 dwellings on Oakington Rd approved, with condition that affordable homes would be for Cottenham residents in perpetuity) and Gladman (outline to build 225 homes and 70 residential homes with care on Rampton Rd refused but another plan was submitted). More speculative applications for developments are in the pipeline.

By mid-July we should have completed "step #5" on our 8-steps to the NP and be on schedule with the dates we set in November when consultants were engaged to do the survey. That survey and its mini-consultations give us a solid base for what happens next.

The most specific challenge is to translate the possible options into the plan's policies. Bear in mind that many issues we face cannot be solved by a Neighbourhood Plan alone. Villagers will have several weeks to comment on a "pre-submission consultation" on the draft planning policies. After this, we will illustrate and smarten up the plan before submitting it to SCDC. A series of formal steps leading to a referendum will follow.

Village Hall: We are working on the design of the proposed new 2-storey building, which saw its debut at the Annual Parish Meeting and Cottenham Festival.

Recreation ground car park: to add 38 parking spaces to the Rec on Lambs Lane the mound will be moved further onto the playing field and the football pitch repositioned nearer the trees. A new pedestrian path will go from near the Bowls Club to the new pavilion. Planning has to be obtained for these changes.

New open space: land gifted to Cottenham (by Warren Dunnico, Tony Fry, Raymond Baldry and Eric (Gordon) Nicol and called the WARG field) behind new houses on right side of Histon Rd as you leave the village has been fenced and in autumn wildflower seeds will be sown to make a meadow feel to encourage bees and butterflies. Dog walkers: the closest bin is across the road, almost directly opposite the entrance.

FANCY A GAME OF SHORT MAT BOWLS?

More to the point, do you know how it is played? It was first played in Wales by two South Africans who came to work in the area. Perhaps due to the poor climate and the long close season here, they simulated the outdoor game

they had played in their own country on a strip of carpet in a church hall. They later moved to Ireland where the game acquired rules and really caught on. It was brought to England by ex-pat Irishmen.

The game is played on a mat 40 to 45 feet long by 6 feet wide with standard size 'outdoor' bowls and the objective is to get your bowls closest to the jack by bowling the length of the mat around a large block of wood that occupies the mid position of the mat.

The good news is that you can play in Cottenham during the winter at the local bowling club. The season starts on Monday 12th September. There is a membership fee of £15, no rink fee, just 50p for tea and biscuits. WHY GARDENING IS A GREAT CURE-ALL

Did you read recently that gardening is good for your well-being, can alleviate the symptoms of depression and loneliness – and help people who suffer with dementia? Those of us who garden could have saved the researcher a lot of time and trouble, says Ken Ellis

We know that people like plants, and enjoy them. My wife and I are fortunate in having the contract to bedeck Ely, planning and planting displays for people to appreciate. We aren't alone in our efforts: there are others in Ely who help. The Friends of Jubilee Gardens regularly have working parties that are open to all who wish to get involved, and the Ely In Bloom team go out and strut their stuff in the very centre of the town.

Why do I mention this? Because groups like these are a great way to meet people if you're on your own, to be part of a common task before decanting to the pub. That's where the loneliness thing comes in. Joining a working party has no hidden agenda and you will have made a contribution to your community, the one where you enjoy living. Gardeners are by nature optimists, an essential

element of well-being. We are always planning and thinking what we might do to improve things. I well remember about five years ago when our allotments suffered a late frost on the 31st of May that took out everybody's potatoes. What did we learn? The following year, all our potatoes were covered in fleece until the second week of June!

When we were preparing for the first Ely Open Gardens day – at that exact same time this year – I could see several things that we could do with improving (or doing earlier!) next time round. You know how it is – not enough colour here.

plants in the wrong place there. How about you? Are there things you'd like to change in your garden? We've learnt that talking about it in the summer and doing it in winter is the way forward. Faced with a load of dead sticks (which was the lupin and which was the annual foxglove?) you need a strategy. Sit down one evening with a notepad, camera and somebody else.

You can both look at your garden, and talk about it. What would you alter? Make a note of it. Take a digital photograph. Buy some of those plastic labels with thread-through ends that you can put round a plant. Write the plant's name in 2B pencil (most permanent markers aren't in my experience). If you're reorganising a bed, venture out and look at a similar bed in somebody's garden (the National Gardens Scheme offers many places to view) or go to Bressingham or Cambridge Botanical Gardens. Take pictures of the plants you like, and photograph their labels if they have them. Make a note of where you intend to put them. Back to the optimism thing: you can almost see your bed looking so much better in the future.

BELL RINGING – AN HISTORICAL SKILL THAT'S RELEVANT TODAY

Did you hear the bells being rung in the villages for the Queen's 90th birthday? Then you might like to know more about campanology, writes Barbara le Gallez

Who can learn to ring?

Almost anyone. You don't need to be strong or to have a musical background. Ringing is a good hobby for active retired people to take up.

Do you go up in the air?

No, not like the Mars Bar monks. The rope goes up in the air – you hold on to its end.

Do you have to go to church to be a bell ringer? No, ringing is not necessarily a "churchy" activity.

Is it hard work?

No, the clever way bells are rigged up means that the weight of the bell does most of the work for you.

Do ringers have to climb stairs to get to the bells?

At some churches the ringing room is up a few stairs – others are on the ground floor.

Are there special "tunes" written ...?

The "tunes" we ring are called "methods". They involve the bells changing order in a rhythmical way. Popular methods are Grandsire, St Clements and Cambridge.

... Or do you create them yourselves?

People are always creating and naming new methods

– recent new names were Octopod and Linky

McLinkface.

What was rung for the Queen's birthday?

Lots of different pieces – each band rang what it could ring best.

GO WILD WITH YOUR CHILD!


With the summer holidays in view, families will be starting to think about how to entertain their children over the school break. Days out can be expensive but they don't need to be. Getting children outdoors, whatever the weather is a vital part of encouraging positive environmental values in them as they grow up. Time spent in the natural world keeps youngsters fit and healthy and encourages creativity, self-led discovery, resilience and independence – invaluable life skills. And of course, it's fantastic fun! Woodlands are magical playgrounds and you don't have to go far to find one. There's a beautiful wood at Rampton, the Fen Reeves Community Woodland on the northern outskirts of Cottenham and an amazing little woodland just along the lane from the Landbeach Village Hall -to name just a few. So why not grab a picnic and head to the woods with friends for a day of den building, mud pie making, bug hunting and tree climbing? For ideas of activities to do in the woods have a look at the Woodland Trust website www.woodlandtrust.org.uk

ACTIVITIES FOR FREE

Fen Drayton Lakes is a complex of lakes and meadows, next to the River Great Ouse, open from dawn to dusk and with no entry charges. The site used to be gravel workings but has since been restored to an area that's great for birds – over winter flocks of wildfowl, and from spring to autumn breeding warblers, hedgerow and wetlands birds. It's a good place for spotting other wildlife such as hares, dragonflies and (more difficult) otters.

Fen Drayton has something for everyone; for dog walkers, ramblers and families – until November there is a range of activities on offer including family nature trails, lake dipping, bug hunts, bat detecting, den building etc. All of these are free. There are also events for adults only – walks, willow weaving workshops etc. On weekends in summer there's a pop up tea shop which is really popular! Fen Drayton Lakes is 20 minutes away from Cambridge and easily accessed by car, bus and bike (the latter along the guided bus way which has a request stop in the middle of the reserve!)

In 2015-16 the surplus was less than the previous year, but we still managed to donate £200 each to Papworth Hospital Trust (Pulmonary Fibrosis – Asbestosis), Parkinson's UK, and finally to the Alzheimer's Society. These were in addition to £150 to the Papworth Trust arising from the Fun Run. In all, the total given to charities was £750.

SUPPORT YOUR LOCAL SCHOOLS

If you are used to buying online why not do it via www.easyfundraising.org.uk which makes a donation to a school for every buy. First you must register and then do your shopping at over 2,000 retailers such as Tesco, Argos, Amazon, M&S and many more. You state the school you support (Cottenham Primary's PTCA and Landbeach's BusyTots for instance) and they benefit. Spread the word to family and friends.

AN APP A DAY...

Apps (on iPhone, iPad and Android) are now being used to help people with health problems. FoodSwitchUk would be very useful for anyone with coeliac disease, gluten intolerance, high blood pressure, heart disease and kidney disease. With the app you scan the barcode of packaged foods to find those high in fat, salt and sugars (using the traffic-light colour code system: red for high, amber for moderate and green for low), and it will recommend healthier alternatives. Change4LifeSugarSmart is still a work in progress but with it you can scan the barcode for sugar content per pack and per 100g.

Other useful apps are: **MyMedRec** (keeps all your health information together and can be shared with doctors, pharmacists and others involved with your care); **MyMedicationPassport** (only iPhone and iPad) keeps details of prescribed medicine including how it's

it is to be taken and how often.

The DiabetesLogbook (mySugarDiabetesDiary) keeps information in one place about blood sugars, meals, insulin etc for those with Type 1 and Type 2 diabetes. Patient.co.uk offers 900 leaflets about health and medical conditions and location of nearby medical services. FitterFitnessCalculatorandWeightTracker calculates your Body Mass Index (to show if you are overweight) and body fat and waist to hip ratio and monitors your weight loss targets and daily calorie needs. Information from Choice Magazine, £2.95 from newsagents or annual subscription £47 (subscriptions@warnersgroup.co.uk)

BRIGHTEN YOUR SURROUNDS

Any patch of unloved land around you that could see being productive? Have a look at theurbanorchardproject.org which helps people restore neglected orchards and create new ones. And if you are wondering how to finance it check out www.groundwork.org.uk/tesco and its Bags of Help scheme which uses money raised from the 5p charge for plastic bags in its supermarkets. Grants of £8k, £10k and £12k could be available to you.

Advice from a reformed bike thief!

From a police newsletter emailed to interested householders "Invest in a D lock or anything that costs. The more expensive the lock the better it's going to be. Make it hard. There's a triangle of metal just behind the saddle column, and that's made like it is for the purpose of locking your bike securely, but people don't know that. Put your lock through there and you should be able to get it through your back wheel. Take your quick release front wheel off and lock it to the back one. People sometimes put the lock through the front wheel. That's fine, I'll have the rest of the bike and get myself another front wheel. You should never lock it below the handlebars. An allen key will get the handlebar column off."



LOCAL HEALTH MATTERS

All GP practices – which are currently funded according to the number of patients registered and are individual businesses with a budget – are as challenged by funding cuts as other areas of the NHS. One solution for 39 Practices in and around Cambridge (including the five Fen villages) has been to form a Federation to consider how to help each other and to protect all that is good about having primary care on your doorstep. They have greater clout as a large group, can decide how Practices could work together to save money and can operate community based services.

Health Secretary Jeremy Hunt has said that missed GP and hospital appointments cost the health service in England nearly £1billion per annum. While he said there were no plans to charge for not turning up, he wanted people to know how much each missed appointment cost the NHS. In the case of GPs, It's worked out mathematically: the hourly cost of running the service divided by the number of 10-minute appointments with a doctor or nurse. For instance at your local surgery it might work out at £20.55 per appointment. So 1500 a month of misses adds up to a whopping £30,825 a year!

All patients are urged to register their mobile telephone number at their GP surgery to receive an appointment reminder by text message; a message can also be sent to a home phone number. If you can't make that time and cancel immediately, someone else in need can be given the appointment.

When a cancer diagnosis has turned your world upside down, finding advice and help is important. Maggie's Wallace is a charity which provides a safe haven where experts can give emotional and practical support as well as advising on financial and nutritional matters and a place where you can meet others facing similar challenges over a cup of tea. There's a drop-in information point near the main entrance at Addenbrooke's and the interim support centre is at 21 Milton House, a short walk from the hospital's concourse. You need to prebook for benefits advice and counselling sessions, but the walking group, art therapy and relaxation groups are drop in from Monday to Friday. Congratulations to our own Graham Mumby who was nominated by Willingham Parish Councillor Linda Drath for the Willingham Tree Project and in particular for setting up the Community Orchard and Woodland, including an array of information boards and a beautiful picnic setting.
