FECA IN ACTION

t has been a busy year for the Fen Edge Community
Association (FECA). I would like to extend my
thanks to the Committee for all their work over the
past twelve months. Our first priority has been to
maintain momentum in terms of membership, grantmaking, revenue-raising and activities.

At this time last year, our membership was 37 groups; it is now 48. Our grant making increased from £3,116 in 2015/16 to £4,350 in 2016/17. We have had some great successes in terms of enabling community participation in activities, helping organisations promote their events, enabling the purchase of equipment and resources.

The main source of funds in 2016 was the Fen Edge News (FEN) which has gone from strength to strength under the stewardship of Wendy Dear.

Wendy has decided that the previous issue of the FEN was to be her last and she has stepped down as Editor. She has done a fantastic job over the past four years and her enthusiasm will be sorely missed. It goes without saying that we are looking for a new Editor – please get in touch if you are interested.

Rosalie Dunnico also stepped down as Secretary during the year and the Committee expressed their thanks and appreciation for the great support Rosalie has given to FECA over many years.

2017 is a Fen Edge Festival (FEF) year and that always dominates the agenda. The Festival Committee is working very well and is on track to deliver another spectacular event. I would like to thank them all for their efforts so far!

Looking forward to the rest of 2017, there are a number of priorities.

Firstly, we would like to continue to expand membership and our grant-making as we do have the resources to do more. We are also building a lot of experience in tapping into funding from other sources that we would like to share with FECA members.

Secondly, we would also like to expand the activities that we get involved in. We would like to do more in all of the Fen Edge villages.

Thank you for all your support over the last year.

COTTENHAM LIBRARY NEWS

Challenge' for the summer holidays 2017 is called Animal Agents. It is open to children aged 4-11 years. Signing up takes place a week before the summer holidays. The children read 6 books, one for each week of the holidays. They tell staff about each book and get stickers, which go on an illustrated recording chart, each time they come. If you are stuck with your Family History **Research** there are drop in help sessions on the third Monday of each month from 7-9pm on 19 June, 17 July, 21 August and 16th October. Do you need to renew or apply for a Concessionary Bus Pass? You can renew up to 6 weeks before the expiry date. The application now has to be filled in online. You will need an electronic passport type photo in JPG format or a picture we can scan and your current bus pass. Further details need to be sent if you have moved house since your last bus pass or if your pass was issued under the disability criteria. For new bus passes more details need to be sent electronically. The library can assist you with all this if you are not experienced with the internet. Please come in and talk to us.

COTTENHAM 7K FUN RUN 2017

nce again, Cottenham 7K Fun Run provided a great morning out for athletes and spectators alike. The proud tradition, started nearly 30 years ago by Jasper Kay, continues to flourish.

This year, Saturday 6th May was cold and overcast. Perfect for runners, a bit challenging for the hardy market stalls, including Carlo's Ices, attractively circled around the pond.

Fun Run Headquarters was up and 'running' at 0600. Course to check, traffic signage to erect, kilometre markers to position. Then back to the Village College for the opening of race registration at 9am. This year, for the first time, we went digital, with internet pre-registration, a feature that will grow in future years.

First race was the mini Fun Run; one lap around the College playing field, a distance of approximately one mile. A total of 66 children participated, each with a race medal won for their fantastic achievement.

winkle Star Children's Trust primary aims are to support local children's projects and enrich the lives and educational experience of children from disadvantaged and challenging backgrounds. POTS, TUBS AND BASKETS

y the time that you read this, the current cold spell will be over, you will have planted up at least one item from the headline, and be relaxing outside with a glass of something nice, admiring the fruit of your labours. Probably.

If not, it's not too late to fill that empty pot or hang up last year's basket that you've just found. Be adventurous. What about a basket with some tumbling tomatoes? Have a look around the garden centre and find three perennial plants that go together in colour and texture. Get one tallish one and a couple of medium or small ones. Ignore whatever it says about their eventual size, and put them in a pot. Enjoy your original pot, and plant the plants in your border for next year. Some of you may know of Three Sister companion planting, where you plant sweetcorn with climbing French beans round it and squashes at the base. A variant for a large pot would be sweetcorn in the centre, four bean plants round it sown a couple of weeks after the corn, and a small courgette plant sown round the base 2 weeks after that. Something like courgette FI patio Star might do it, but even so, that has a spread of around a couple of feet, so don't be too optimistic with your planting.

By now, the plants will have used all of the nutrients in the compost, and may be starting to look a little tired. So, how do we look after them?

- Planting medium: If you are planting a basket or any tub with bedding plants, use a good general purpose compost. Add water retaining gel and slow release fertiliser. If you're planting something that will stand outside on a permanent basis, use John Innes number 2 compost. It's soil based, heavier than compost, and retains water well. I tend to mix John Innes and potting compost for gross feeders like bananas.
- Feed: All plants benefit from being fed. If you've put them into an artificial environment, they will be relying on you to provide the nutrients. Even if you've used dedicated tub and basket compost, your plants will benefit from a feed. You can add a slow release fertiliser at the start of the season, but adding a liquid feed when watering is just as effective. Use a seaweed based general fertiliser, or one for feeding tomatoes. Both encourage flowering. Make sure that you feed once a week for best results, especially in mid season.
- Watering: Always a problem area. If you put up a
 basket on a south facing wall in blistering sun, it will want
 a drink twice a day. Plants use copious amounts of water
 when actively growing, so make sure that you water
 them regularly. Make it a user friendly job. Use a lance
 on a hosepipe rather than lugging a can around. You can
 get an attachment to mix feed as you water, or console

yourself that you only have to feed once a week! A tip — Try and group pots together. It makes it easier to water for the lucky person looking after your stuff while you're on holiday.

- Maintenance: Depending on what you put in them, hanging baskets need little hands on attention. If you're putting them up more than head high, don't put plants in that need dead heading. Save them for pots and tubs. Occasionally in pots and tubs, the plants will benefit from a little cutting back (and dead heading). Get into the habit of having a wander round your garden with a largish pair of scissors. Pottering can be a very therapeutic activity.
- Pests: Many and various are these. The worst suspects are, in no particular order.

Slugs and snails – Three ways to deal with them – pick them off (yuk), beer traps (waste of beer), or hedgehog friendly slug pellets.

Aphids — Blast them off with water, washing up liquid or bee and ladybird friendly insecticide, if you can find it. By far the biggest problem with pots and tubs is the vine weevil. The adults will nibble leaves, but it's the grubs that kill the plant. You get no warning of trouble until the sudden collapse of the plant, and on investigation you will find that its roots have been almost totally eaten away by what appear to be large and fat maggots. At the first sign of trouble, you can rescue plants by using a dedicated vine weevil killer. At present, there is only one on the market, and it is a tad expensive, but does work. Note: it clearly says that it kills vine weevils. If it doesn't say that on the label, it doesn't kill them, whatever the product calls itself!

If you generally follow the path that I've laid out, you should be rewarded by having attractive plant displays in your garden. For some people, these represent the only garden that they have, and they have become ingenious about what can be grown in a pot. If the idea of gardening in small containers appeals, there are plenty of books out there with good ideas. But, there is also a wealth of advice and experience around you. Learn to love your local gardening club. Almost everything that I've related to you has come from various speakers at our club in Cottenham. I seem to have joined the speaker circuit of late, and it's been a joy and a delight to share what knowledge I have with other people. So, look up the contact for your local club and go for a visit. After all, they're gardeners, just like you and me.

FECA IN LANDBEACH

NATURE ON YOUR DOORSTEP

One of the earlier books written by the wellknown author Bill Bryson was "A Walk in the Woods", where he describes his attempt to walk the Appalachian trail in eastern USA. In this amusing travelogue, he tells how he was terrified of meeting a bear but also how calming and inspirational the landscape around him was. You are unlikely to meet a bear on a walk in the woods through Bourne Wood, Landbeach (Bill didn't meet one either) but at this time of year you might well see a diminutive Muntjac deer slipping away between the trees. Their delicate footprints are often visible in muddy patches along the edges of the trails. Originally from China, escapes from Woburn Park and other places in midland counties in the early 20th century, have led to the establishment of thriving feral populations in south and central England. A visit to the little nature reserve adjacent to Cambridge Research Park is another place to see them, and perhaps to hear the soft purring call of a Turtle Dove. Only slightly larger than a Blackbird, this species is now on the Red List of conservation concern. It has been seen and heard in Worts Meadow, Landbeach in recent years but not yet this year.

We are always happy to receive records of wildlife from in and around Worts Meadow and Bourne Wood. There is a waterproof recording sheet hanging from the entrance gate into the wood or you can join our Facebook group or use the contact details shown. Two white egrets (Little Egret) were recorded last month. This is a recent colonist in the UK and they are now relatively common in East Anglia. We would love to know what you have seen!

On our amphibian walk around Worts Meadow in March, led by Froglife, the nationally rare Great Crested Newt was found in abundance in Half Moon pond near the edge of Bourne Wood but not in the other ponds. Friends of Worts Meadow (FOWM) are now working with Froglife and with English Heritage (Worts Meadow is a Scheduled Monument) and County Farms to improve the ponds within the nature reserve to make them better homes for amphibians. Our next public nature event is Pond Dipping on August 26th at 2pm — all welcome

FRIENDS OF WORTS MEADOW

FOWM are a constituted group of volunteers that help with the practical management of the nature reserve. It is free to join. Our open events provide the chance to learn about, and enjoy the wildlife of the site and help with recording. Barn would have been used to store taxes, a tenth of all crops to the church, the contributions being stacked in the barn for winter threshing and storage. The Tithe Barn Trust is a small charity and volunteer not-for profit group aiming to save and sympathetically restore the Grade II Listed Tithe Barn, in Landbeach, for community use.

Gemma O'Shea, Tithe Barn Trust Chair, says "We've just submitted a major grant application for almost £400k. We're keeping our fingers crossed, but the more pledges and donations we receive from the community, the more likely our grant applications will be successful and the dream of restoring the Tithe Barn will be realised. Through our project we plan to not only save and sensitively restore the unique and rare Tithe Barn, but bring new life to this underused historic building. We aim to open the barn to a wider audience and tell its story. If successful with our fundraising quest we will improve the access track so that the barn is accessible for all, including those with disabilities. The project also incorporates plans to provide basic facilities to the barn (such as toilets, power and water supply) sensitively integrated without detracting from its special character, so that its use increases and it generates an income

for ongoing repair and maintenance, thus creating a sustainable future."

We envisage the future of the barn will include schools and education visits, public open days, functions such as wedding ceremonies, film and photoshoot location hire and community events such as Farmers Markets. We've been working hard; however, we still need your help to save this gem at the heart of Landbeach. The barn is in a poor condition and deteriorating. We believe the Tithe Barn, with thatched roof and historic brick and timber floor, to be unique to Cambridgeshire and even of national significance. Experts suggest that it may well date from the medieval period. Over 90% of Tithe Barns have been converted in the UK.

COTTENHAM

Fen Edge Festival: As usual we'll be hosting a display stall on the Village Green so please come along to see all the latest news on our various projects and meet with Councillors.

Village Hall & Nursery: The planning application process is proving more tortuous than we expected, made more complicated by the scale of the building, its location "in the open countryside" and sickness of our Case Officer. Assuming – fingers crossed – that we get planning permission for an acceptable design, we will need to complete the technical design and revalidate the financing approach before inviting competitive bids for the construction, several months later than we planned.

Major developments: The Planning Inspector adjourned the Public Inquiry into the refused Gladman application to give CPC the opportunity to participate fully in the Inquiry when it resumes, at the end of September. This followed on from the District Council's decision in late March to delegate approval of the second, slightly smaller, Gladman application subject to a suitable "section 106" agreement. That, in turn, led SCDC to decide not to defend the two key reasons on which they had refused the original application provided the Inspector accepted two changes – the smaller scale and redesigned Oakington Road / Rampton Road roundabout. The Parish Council objects, among other reasons, to the real harm that will be caused to the Almshouses by the increased traffic, a harm aggravated by the roundabout design. At the SCDC Planning Committee in May they deferred a

decision on the outline application by Persimmon for 126 houses on Oakington Road. They have until the end of July to make a decision.

Neighbourhood Development Plan: The draft Plan now includes several sustainable "green field" sites for modest-scale housing development. These are being assessed independently before the Plan is finalised for formal "Regulation 15" public consultation and independent examination by a Planning Inspector and, eventually, a referendum. The Pre-Submission Draft Plan (v2) is available for comment on our website.

Highways: The series of planned pavement and road improvements between Stevens Close and the High Street, and to crossings in Beach Road and the High Street should now be with contractors.



ACCIDENTS HAPPEN, BUT WHAT CAN YOU DO?

hen a child, parent, friend or stranger, has a medical emergency, what immediate actions can you take, regardless of training? When you come across an accident, your words and your voice are your best tool. The way you respond as an individual and community matters. Even if you have not done a first aid course, or you are scared, you can still significantly contribute towards a positive outcome. They say "Actions speak louder than words" but your words and your voice are key.

Check for dangers, use your voice to reassure, to establish severity, priority and consciousness. Introduce yourself, ask the victim's name. Explain that you are getting help. Reassure them you are there. You can influence the physiological outcome with your own voice.

Use your voice to help them to help themselves, to remain still. Use your voice to shout for assistance. Use your voice to call 999, request a helper to call, put the phone onto loud speaker, the responders trained voice will clearly guide you throughout. If telephone CPR is necessary their voice will deliver clear instructions.

You could be the only bystander with any first aid knowledge, use your voice to share advice, tips, observations, with others; you will be appreciated.

If you are involved and can't help directly use your voice to

share information.

Use your voice to gain consent to help. If the casualty is unconscious, consent is implied. The Good Samaritan Bill protects you from legal action should you give first aid, whether trained or not. *

Hearing is usually the last sense to go and first to return, so keep speaking, even if the casualty is unresponsive.

If an adult or child is not responding, or remains conscious but is deteriorating, you must deploy the AED (Automatic External Defibrillator) immediately. Use your voice to share your community AED locations.

Switch the machine on. An AED is safe and designed for laypeople, it has its own clear speaking voice and will instruct you how to prepare.

If you are physically exhausted (quality chest compressions with rescue breaths (CPR) is very demanding) communicate handover instructions and inspire confidence in others with your voice.

Shout and flag down the Ambulance. The voice inside your own mind will keep your external voice calm.
