CHURCH NEWS

ALL SAINTS' CHURCH, COTTENHAM

The beginning of 2018 has brought some change at All Saints'. The refurbishment works have started in earnest so we have been worshipping together in the Church Hall. This has been a time of really getting to know your neighbour as it is a smaller space! A worship band has been formed to accompany our All-Age worship on the second Sunday of the month (more musicians always welcome!) and a drama group which will be performing on Easter Day. Also new are our Action Groups, small groups focusing on how we grow in our faith, grow the church in number and serve our local community.

We are also making arrangements for adopting the suggested plans to merge the parishes of Rampton and Cottenham and for the Rampton church building to become a Chapel-of-Ease. Becoming a Chapel-of-Ease means primarily that the church is no longer required to hold weekly communion services. Instead, services will mainly be held at key festivals, such as Easter and Christmas, with Rampton church members joining with Cottenham for the rest of the time.

We are looking forward to the various Easter events. We start with a Maundy Thursday supper (29 March at 7.30pm), followed by a Reflection at the Cross on Good Friday at midday. On Easter Saturday there will be a walk from Cottenham to Ely, culminating with Choral Evensong in the Cathedral. On Easter Sunday we celebrate the Resurrection with a Sunrise Service at 6.30am, BCP Holy Communion at 8:15am, and Family Communion at 10:45am followed by refreshments in the Church Hall. There is a service of Holy Communion at 9.15am in Rampton. On Sunday 28 January, Christians Together in Cottenham had a wonderful joint service, held at the Baptist Church and led by Revd Kate Lees of the Baptist Church and our own Revd Lynda Davies. It was lovely to see so many people from the different churches in the village worshipping together and uplifting each other. Over Lent, we gathered in our usual ecumenical Lent groups, looking at the gospel of John. We look forward to our next joint event which will be an evening of Pentecost Praise on Sunday May 20th.

Finally, the completion of the refurbishment process of All Saints' Cottenham church building will be

a cause for much joy. We will be holding an open celebration on the weekend of 16 and 17 June. The Bishop will be joining us for the service on the Sunday morning so save the date – more details to

- Two Cup finals for our youth teams and further semi-finals and one team league winners and one league runners-up in different age groups.

- Our Five- a-side tournaments becoming one of the biggest in the region with over 2,500 people coming to the village to take part.
- Launch of our Cottenham Football Foundation and Soccer schools run by volunteers to provide additional sports time and fitness for all individuals.
 A big thank-you to Jason Adams for all his hard work on getting this launched.
- Supporting the Fen Edge Festival and Cottenham Community days

It goes without saying it has been a privilege to serve the club and its members through all of these successes and we could not have done it without the constant support of all of the coaches, players and more importantly the parents who support us in all weathers in many different ways. As a club we fill Cottenham Recreation Ground every Saturday and Sunday with kids having fun and growing into the future of our village.

WILDCATS - GIRLS' FOOTBALL

About 2 years ago myself and David Burkett set out on a plan to grow girls football within our village. We knew this would be a challenge for us as **Cottenham United Colts FC** only had around 18 girls in total playing football and did not having any competing teams.

First, with the help of Sport England, we started a free after-school session for girls only playing football predominantly at Cottenham Village College. At first we had about 3 or 4 girls coming along and for many weeks we questioned if it would work and what we needed to do, but we continued with it and just tried to make it as much fun as possible. Then suddenly word started to spread and, as the temperature started to rise, so too did the numbers and before we knew it we had 18 girls turning up to each session. We saw this as a great success and the numbers continued to grow and hold steady even when the weather turned colder!

But we knew there was still more we could do so then we launched, in partnership with Cambridgeshire Football Association and Cottenham Primary School our Wildcats sessions. Again this was a risk as we did not have many young primary school girls playing football within the club but, with the backing of the national scheme, we were accepted as one of only 200 applications nationwide to host these sessions, which was a major achievement in itself for a village grass-roots club! Once more we were unsure how it would go and if it would be a success but again by keeping it fun and creating the right environment we could only hope. When we first started this time last year we had about 10 girls, which was great and we were really happy with it and so where they. However as the weeks went by more and more girls started coming and before we knew it we had 50 girls turning up and taking part. This was way beyond what we had imagined, but with great support from the Primary School and all the parents it has grown so well and gone from strength to strength, meaning the local press wanted to do a piece and we have had some radio coverage as well, which we think enhances the village and the children taking part.



The hard work that goes into running these sessions is completely outweighed by the enjoyment and fun we, as coaches, have working with the girls. They put a smile on our faces and show such fantastic attitude. Watching the older ones looking after the younger ones gives us such pride in this great village we live in and the values that the Primary School and parents clearly instil in their children. Due to the success of the club's scheme we have won a number of awards from the Football Association and Cambridgeshire FA, which is wonderful for the club. I have to give a special mention to David Burkett without whose support we would not have been able to do all of this. David gives up a lot of his time to support me in these ventures, and without him they would not have happened. The Wildcats sessions are about to start again at Cottenham Primary School so we hope to see all the girls back again continuing to grow as friends and future football players. With one team already having great success and another being set up, the village is now becoming a real force in Girls' football and sport. Let's show those boys how to do it!!!

Don't forget it will be 'Girls' Football Week' nationally from April 23 to 29.



Friends of Worts Meadow - RECORDING MORE WILDLIFE

In the last few years, many wildlife organisations have taken on board a new concept in wildlife recording called a "bioblitz". When I first heard of this, I thought in sounded rather sinister as though the aim was to 'blitz' i.e., kill off everything living! However the opposite is true and the aim of a bioblitz is to record all the animals and plants in a particular area during a 24-hour period. Experts are at hand to help put names to the creatures and everyone from very young to not so young can take part. You don't need any prior knowledge as half the point is to learn as you go along. I have been to several in the past, including one based on a seashore in Yorkshire run by the Yorkshire Naturalist's Society and two in Cambridge in the Botanic Gardens and various college gardens run by the university. They were all great fun. If you would like to try it out for yourself, then

If you would like to try it out for yourself, then FOWM will be running one this year on **Saturday**July 14th in Landbeach (Worts Meadow and Bourne Wood). This is your and your children's chance to try

out all sorts of activities including bug, butterfly and bee hunting with nets and traps, pond dipping, moth trapping, small mammals, flower identification, tree leaves, and a dawn chorus walk for early risers! The various activities will be time-tabled and you don't have to stay all day, just pick your favourites and come and go as you please. The event will actually start on the Friday evening with a bat walk, using bat detectors to identify the various species from their sounds as they hunt. We will also set out the moth traps as it gets dark.

More details will be available nearer the time.

Neighbourhood Plan

Draft v4 now with SCDC to obtain report on impact on Environment and Habitat Regulations. Sixteen "NP planning evidence papers" and three AECOM reports have been published on our website and will be refined as v4.1a is being finalised. The draft Plan is now being cited in planning applications, so we may get more influence over site layouts etc. Regulation 14 "local consultation" arrangements are being prepared.

Major Building Developments

- Bellway Homes have outline permission (development principle and access) to build 50 homes off Oakington Road; the Reserved Matters (site layout and house types etc) application is yet to be determined.
- Gladman Developments also have outline permission for their Rampton Road site. The site is now up for sale with offers due by 2nd March.
- Persimmon Homes similarly have outline permission for I26 homes off Oakington Road.At end of February there was no sign of the Reserved Matters application.
- County Council (S/2876) application to build 154 homes off Rampton Road was refused by SCDC in August. County have submitted an appeal which is due to be heard on 14th March.
- County Council (S/3551) application to build 137 or 125 houses has been withdrawn.

There have been 2 new applications this year:

- Manor Oak (50 homes on land off Beach Road)
 refusal recommended; although possible Rural
 Exception site in NP
- Lau (23 homes on land off Oakington Road)- refusal recommended partly for concerns over drainage SCDC do now have a 5-year land supply so the speculative wave should now subside.

Traffic and Transport Working Group

We have been working with the Traffic and Transport Working Group (T&TWG for short!) to reactivate Community Speedwatch. 10 volunteers have been trained and locations risk assessed by Cambs Police; we aim to be up and running during April/May. If you'd like to become a Speedwatch volunteer, join the T&TWG, or just be kept up to date on traffic related issues, please email cottenhamtraffic@gmail.com for further information.

HOW GREEN IS YOUR GARDEN?

Writing this on a cold February afternoon, there's not an insect in sight. I always leave some ivy uncut, so that there'll be some nectar for the few brave insects that do venture out. This current cold spell will be pretty unhelpful to them, and they will need all the assistance they can get when things warm up. There's been a lot of talk about the declining numbers of insects, particularly bees, with pesticides getting the blame. It's not just them though. Some of the plants that we grow in our gardens may look nice, but lack the pollen and nectar that insects need. It's easy to blame the farmers for turning fields into a green jungle; our allotments are surrounded by such fields, with little or no flowers to entice the insects. But we're all culpable really. We like big bright flowers. Native species have been bred to flower longer, with bigger blooms, resistant to viral infection with a longer blooming season, it can seem that plants have lost their connection with the ecosystem around them.

Now, this may seem a bit gloomy, but it needn't be. We can help, whatever the size of our garden. Firstly, we can provide insects with a home. Go to www.rspb.org.uk/birds-and-wildlife/advice/gardening-for-wildlife/insects-and-minibeasts you'll find a whole range of habitats that you can build. This is a great way of engaging children (and grandchildren) in the garden. You can build your own version of an insect home. Don't be put off by the pictures of grandiose structures; the crawlie things will be just as happy with what you give them.

Secondly, we can attract insects to their very own fast food outlet. Insect friendly annual seeds are in the shops now. Mix some silver sand with the seed, and gently sprinkle it over a patch that you've cleared; the sand will let you see where the seed is. Gently cover the seed and water it. When buying

plants, generally if the plant has flowers that have single petals, it will be insect friendly, providing nectar and pollen. Plants to include are delphiniums, cornflowers, verbena bonariensis and scabious. No garden? Have you space for a pot? Get a reasonably sized one, buy one bonariensis or English lavender bush and a couple of French marigold bushes. You'll have a good colour combination and regular visitors. If you've a fence or wall, grow scented climbers like honeysuckle for summer food, and lvy to provide food in the cold months.

Finally, a small water feature. Get a wooden half tub from your local garden centre, somewhere round 450mm diameter. Liberally paint the inside with black bituminous paint - the sort they sell for dampproofing. Buy three aquatic plants: an iris, a grass and something to lay on the surface, preferably that has flowers. (I actually used a miniature water lily.) Get a small bag of aquatic compost, and some pond planters. Place the tub where you want it, put the plants into the planters. Carefully place them in the tub and fill it with water. Fix some fairly large holed mesh across the top to child proof it, guiding the plants through the holes. Again, no hot sun, but it will tolerate a bright spot. And behold, you have a small environment that will attract its own wildlife. These are small changes, but ones that will be

These are small changes, but ones that will be appreciated by the local wildlife.

A final thought. I belong to Cottenham Gardeners' Club, details of which are elsewhere in this magazine, and can commend gardening clubs to you. Look up your local club, and go. You'll meet all sorts of people with all sorts of experience and ideas for how to make your garden greener!

WILLINGHAM ACTION GROUP (WAG)

'Willinghamlife' website

We continue to develop our new website at www.willinghamlife.org with more pages of information relating to the village. So far we have: important websites, opening hours of amenities, useful phone numbers, transport details, bin collections and village events. We plan to add details of local roadworks and we hope residents will contact us via the website to let us know what else is needed. You can also access current and back issues of the Willingham News.

We also want to have a complete directory of businesses and social and sports clubs in the village and we are relying on people to submit such detail.

Amenities on the QEII Field

The new play equipment is well-used and continues to attract an increasing number of families and carers with children. The Environmental Group of WAG are now applying some finishing touches to the landscaping. It became apparent last summer that there was a need for more seating. The idea of creating a tree feature of three white silver birches, surrounded by a circular tree bench, prompted WAG to seek funding from a sponsor with the balance coming from the SCDC Community Fund. The additional SCDC funds will also allow for the provision of three more simple plank benches in close proximity to the under-fives area. The materials have been purchased and work on preparation and installation will commence in early spring.

Vintage Travel kindly sponsored the three silver birch trees, which were planted last winter, with the bench being installed in the autumn. The teak circular bench was co-funded by Vintage Travel and the SCDC Community Fund, for which WAG are very appreciative. Also, those visiting the QEII will be aware of the many native trees which have been progressively planted by WAG, further enhancing the area, 50 in all. All the trees were generously sponsored and bear identification/dedication labels. A sponsor board has recently been installed by WAG showing the location of individual trees and their sponsors. As with the information boards located in the Community Orchard the design and graphic art work was kindly contributed by Siobhan Brown, many thanks. WAG would like to thank all those who have contributed to the creation of such a wonderful recreational facility. In particular WAG recognises the support and cooperation of WPC and the tireless work of our very own 'famous five' now immortalised by the living play feature of five hazels.

The Community Orchard

Many of the fruit trees have made appreciable growth, although some are yet to bear fruit. WAG Environmental volunteers have been pleased to take up the offer of pruning instruction from Ray Manning. Ray explained the basic choice between creating a more upright tree with a main leader and an open bowl shape encouraging outward spreading growth. As the trees are planted on an 8m square grid the latter has been chosen with a view



to creating the appearance of a more traditional orchard. Ray has kindly spent two Saturday mornings providing pruning instruction to WAG Enviro volunteer groups enabling us to undertake some pruning in between for his appraisal. What is second nature to Ray takes a leap of faith for those learning when removal of significant growth is required, especially as the label bears the sponsors name. Sponsors rest assured the effect is instantly evident as a pleasing shape is created! The accompanying photo shows Ray instructing the second




