The annual Fen Edge Community

# The Fens and Flooding

The plight of householders and farmers overwhelmed by the water on the Somerset Levels touched the hearts of everyone around the country. Yet despite the two months of record-breaking rainfall the Fen Edge area appeared fairly normal. Was this luck or good planning?

Some of the fields looked very wet and there was a lot of mud around but you'd expect that after the rain we'd endured. But the eastern fenland area is an area of high flood risk, so why didn't the water rise - and not drain away – as happened in the Somerset Levels? The circumstances are not the same. according to Cottenham resident Mike Mason. He believes the name of the Dutch drainage expert Cornelius Vermuyden should be engraved upon every heart in the Fen Edge.

It was Vermuyden who in the 1650s built dykes, new channels and sluices to drain the original marshes and meres which had extended from the coast to Cambridge and Peterborough. These works have been improved on over the centuries by pumping stations to lift water from the low level fens into the high level embanked rivers running through them, making flood protection more reliable. Mike, a county councillor for Cottenham, Histon and Impington with a history of involvement with drainage, is a member of the Anglian Central

Regional Flood and Coastal Committee (CRFCC).

Flood and water management is a complex subject with wide variations in regional rainfall and river catchment characteristics. The pastures of the Somerset Levels cannot therefore be easily compared with the largely arable peat lands of the South or Middle Level of the fens. The Environment Agency report for January said this was the wettest month on record for the Bedford Ouse and Cam Catchments and the second wettest for Central Area overall.

While flooding in the fens has been avoided this year, the cost borne by the local drainage ratepayers and taxpayers will be high in terms of electricity and fuel costs associated with many hours of pumping. Flood defences at Kings Lynn and Denver sluice were severely tested and were actually breached at Lowestoft by the recent east coast tidal surge. We should not be complacent about the effects of climate change, says Mike.

Vermuyden's motto on the crest of the South Cambridgeshire District Council reads "Niet Zonder Arbyt" which translates (from old Dutch) as "nothing without work". As Mike says, the Fen Edge flood defence system is an example of that motto, so luck and planning and many years of capital investment came into it.

# The French are coming to Fen Edge in the first weekend in May, and lots of activities are planned, as Anna Vining explains

The Fen Edge Twinning Association is about 16 years old and membership is open to everyone living in Cottenham, Rampton, Willingham, Waterbeach and Landbeach. The villages are twinned with Avrillé, a small town near the city of Angers on the river Loire, just south of Le Mans (famous for the 24-hour car race).

The association arranges and takes part in annual visits – we go to Avrillé one year and they come to us the next, usually one of the May bank holiday weekends, travelling by coach (or own car) on the Friday and returning on the Monday. Generally about 50 people from each twinning group are involved, the host group's members offering accommodation and hospitality during the visit which this year will be here on 3rd and 4th May.

# In your garden: why not try alpines

# If you've a sunny, reasonably sheltered and free draining area in your garden you're on your way, says Ken Ellis from the Cottenham Gardeners' Club.

Alpines are plants that grow at high levels in harsh conditions and are generally as tough as old boots, tolerating winds, hot days, strong sunlight, snow and freezing temperatures. They share a common need: drainage. They are often found growing in crevices, on screes and in cracks, their long roots reaching deep for nutrients. They don't like having wet roots in winter and they don't do humid.

Remember you are trying to replicate a specific type of environment. Prepare the ground by digging in a generous amount of alpine grit to ensure free drainage. Ideally the area should be three quarters grit. When planting don't let the compost cover the crown of the plant and don't over-water. Mulch more grit around the plant to protect it from splashes.

What alpines to choose? I have a particular liking for auriculas which are related to primulas and have a smallish collection in a range of colours in a special outdoor cabinet called a theatre. All alpines look their best in a small bed, rockery area. tub or pot. Campanulas are the easiest - look out for one called Dickson's Gold at garden centres, it propagates well and has nice foliage. Also search out the hepatica range with their delicate flowers that bloom through February and March. The Japanese really go for these plants with rare specimens changing hands for serious money. You don't need to be so extravagant and you will be rewarded if you choose one called Hepatica Nobilis, probably the most common one at garden centres.

Saxifrages will tolerate dappled shade as will most of the pretty little primulas, especially primula denticulata with tooth-shaped petals, and the even smaller primula alpina with its tiny, exquisite flowers. All really are smaller versions of their larger, garden-based relatives.

Which compost to use? Recipes for alpine compost are legion and guaranteed to start a lively debate in a crowd of gardeners. The Alpine Garden Society recommend for pot plants: 6 parts of John Innes No 2, 2 parts leaf mould and one part sharp

sand. For troughs and raised beds: I part John Innes No 2, I part limestone chippings, I part peat (or a suitable alternative like leaf mould) and I part coarse sand. I was told by an expert grower that mixes should be more stone than compost, so mine are. Be careful about nutrients – these plants will generally find their own from the soil-based John Innes.

Now for the Blue Peter bit. How to make your own alpine container using 'hypertufa', which is like a PlayDough for grown ups. Here are three recipes, again courtesy of the Alpine Garden Society.

I limestone lookalike: I part sand, I part cement, I part peat or bark

2 'sandstone': 5 parts sand, 2 parts cement, 3 parts peat or bark

3 'Tufa': I part sand, I part cement and 2 parts peat or bark. This is the one I use as it produces a dark atmospheric rock-like substance that shows off the plants. Mix in enough water to make it workable without being too wet or two crumbly.

Use these mixes to create your own containers. For a rock shape, dig a hole or line an old plant pot with a plastic bin liner then line this with your mix of choice. When dry peel off the liner. To make a trough, use two slightly different sized cardboard boxes which fit inside each other with a gap of 2inches/5cm. Spread the mix on the bottom and about 2inches/5cm up the sides of the larger box (adding some chicken wire for reinforcement if you can), then ram in the smaller box to leave no gaps. When the hypertufa is set enough, remove the inner box. Leave overnight before removing the outer box - your new 'ancient looking trough' will take about a week to dry fully and then you can plant up your selection of exquisite alpines and top it up with gravel for an authentic mountain finish.

So, get creating, and see what you can grow. I'm looking forward to seeing the front gardens of South Cambridgeshire displaying all sorts of hypertufa rockeries.

Vehicles old and new will make their way on Sunday 27th April through many of the Fen Edge villages to raise money for cancer research in Cambridgeshire.





# Landbeach Tithe Barn

The future of the 16th century tithe barn ■ overlooking the Common is uncertain. The Landbeach Society has held a lease on the grade ll listed timber-framed building since 1975 but is no longer able to re-thatch and maintain the property and its owner, South Cambridgeshire District Council, may have to sell it for redevelopment – probably for new housing. There have been consultations with parishioners, the Parish Council, Cambridgeshire Past Present and Future, and the Farmland Museum but time is running out before the council makes its decision. Suggestions on ways to raise the funds needed or practical assistance or expertise are urgently sought so the barn is valued as a heritage site. # **GET ON YOUR BIKES!**

# To celebrate the Tour de France in Cambridgeshire, Willingham Wheels has organised a family event for cyclists of all ages.

Willingham Wheels, set up by the Willingham Action Group, was awarded a grant of £300 from the Cambridge Tour de France organisers to arrange an event to mark the visit of this famous annual bike ride.

On Sunday 6th July, bicyclists are invited to join in 'The Fen Edge Mass Exodus', a cycle ride along the guided busway from St Ives to Cambridge, finishing at Parker's Piece with a do-it-yourself picnic. It is a marshalled, family oriented event and will proceed at a good slow, and safe, pace.

However, you should take into account the distances involved (there and back) and the cycling proficiency of the youngest member of your group! From St Ives, the distance is 14 miles, Fen Drayton 11 miles, Swavesey 10 miles, Longstanton P&R 8 miles, Westwick 6 miles, Histon 3 miles and Arbury 1.5 miles (roughly in each case).

Cyclists can join in at any of the stops on the busway: entrants from Cottenham and

Rampton could start from Westwick or Histon, for instance, while villagers from Waterbeach, Landbeach and Willingham could choose the Longstanton P&R stop.

The national cycling charity CTC has been consulted by Willingham Wheels as has Campbell Ross-Bain, the Bus Operations and Facilities Manager who is directly in charge of the busway. Their recommendations and safety requirements will be strictly adhered to.

There is no entrance fee but there will be a collection for Marie Curie, the official Tour de France charity. T-shirts in the traditional yellow will be on sale at £5 each, all profits to Marie Curie.

On Monday 7th July, Willingham Wheels is also organising a mini exodus to somewhere south of Cambridge to watch the Tour de France riders go by. Advance registration is essential for insurance purposes. Riders not registered will be deemed non-participants. # **ELECTIONS:** you vote, you decide

Thursday 22nd May is the date for the European Parliamentary elections and you may or may not be voting for candidates standing for South Cambridgeshire District Council and your Parish Council. Read on to understand why

Did you know that the MEP for the Fen Edge area is Robert Sturdy, Conservative? He has held the post for two elections – 10 years – but now is standing down so there will be other candidates for you to choose from. Voters elect seven MEPs to represent the interests of the eastern region of the UK; each receives a salary and expenses.

The other east of England MEPs whose terms have come to an end are: Andrew Duff (Lib Dem), Geoffrey van Orden (Con), Vicky Ford (Con), David Campbell Bannerman (Con), Stuart Agnew (UKIP) and Richard Howitt (Lab). At the time of going to press it was not known if all were candidates for re-election.

For the District Council, one of the three councillors for Cottenham, Oakington, Westwick and Rampton ward, Lynda Harford, will retire, as will Peter Johnson from Waterbeach, and Philippa Corney from Willingham and Over. Again, it was not known if they will be standing for election or whether their seats will be contested. If there are no other nominations there will be no need for an election. District councillors receive a salary and expenses.

All members of the five Fen Edge parish councils have to retire, having completed their four-year

term. Every one wishing to stand for election has to be nominated on a nomination form with the names of proposers, seconders and supporters. If more than the required number for each council are nominated then an election will be held the same day as the European and District Council elections.

If fewer than, or exactly the right number of, councillors are nominated then an election will not be held and the returning officer will declare them elected. Parish councillors are generally not party political and do not receive a salary but expenses are reimbursed.

Anyone wishing to be a parish councillor must be 18 or over, a British citizen or citizen of the Commonwealth or EU, registered to vote, have lived within three miles of the village (for example, Cottenham) or worked in the parish for the last 12 months.

You can't stand if you work for the council, are the subject of a bankruptcy restriction order or interim order or have in the last five years (before the election date) been convicted in the UK of any offence and have had a prison sentence (whether suspended or not) for a period of over three months without the option of a fine. To validate a nomination, all details on a nomination form are checked by an Election Officer.

Nomination packs are available from the South Cambridgeshire District Council or clerk of the parish council; nomination forms have to be submitted between 15th April and 4pm on 24th April – one minute after will be too late! See page 5 for details of the Fen Edge parish councils.

This will not be a dry and dusty course but will be a light, informative, enjoyable, progression from idea to conclusion. #### **SPORTING CHANCES FOR COTTENHAM**

#### New plans for the recreation ground will provide more opportunities to enjoy this large open space

Summer should see the appearance of a new skate park at the recreation ground, thanks to a committee of teenagers who approached the parish council to upgrade the area. Made of highly durable, long-lasting concrete the new park should require minimal upkeep and offer an excellent surface for skateboarders. It is hoped it will attract users from further afield and bring local business opportunities to the village.

As more than a quarter of village residents are under 18 the council recognises the need to provide modern facilities that promote healthy, active leisure pursuits and has in hand a project entitled 'Recreation Ground – A Vision' on which feedback from villagers is being sought (see facebook.com/cottenhamvisionplan). The responses will form the basis for a business plan to be presented to the Parish Council in the late autumn The skate park is one element, as is a new sports pavilion on which work will start in April with build time of about six months. Included are changing rooms and a multi-function room that will be available to football, cricket and other sports clubs.


The new building will cover one of three existing but rarely used grass courts, for which upkeep is both expensive and difficult. CottenhamTennis Club

saw this as an opportunity to expand membership and interest in the game. Prompted by the recommendation of Sport England in the planning process, it has prepared a business plan for the council proposing that two hard, all-weather courts, with flood lighting, a mini court

for juniors and, if possible, a hitting wall be installed as part of the Vision. This would be phase one; phase two (at a later date) would add two more hard courts, with flood lighting, for dual tennis and netball use. At least three, and ideally four, courts would be needed for Cottenham to grow a club that can attract better players, host competitions and bring more people to the recreation ground.

The club has enthusiastic support from Primary School headmaster James Kilsby and also from the director of coaching company Over&In, Hamid Hejazi (providing qualified tennis coaches to over 25 village clubs, Cottenham included) and others. Junior coaching is a thriving part of the club which at present uses the courts at the Village College. The plan's promoters Paul Dixon and Bruce Hutchison believe the recreation ground with its new facilities would be ideal for an adult sports club with a large junior membership. Initial quotes for phase one have been obtained (estimated at about £100,000 plus VAT) and Steve Goswell of Tennis4Cambridge, a specialist in sports club funding, is advising and assisting the club in sourcing grants and other funding required from other providers on top of what the club and Parish Council put in. The plan is still before the council for consideration.




