his is the page where you normally read the chairman's report, but as you can see below a new chair will soon be elected. I volunteered to do the magazine — which covers the five Fen villages listed above — because I wanted to know more about the area to which I moved just over two years ago. This is the second issue I have been involved in and I hope you will find the content both interesting and up your street. It might not have happened without Bob Turner who stepped in to handle advertising after Alan Leeks resigned.

After more than 40 years in London, I couldn't believe how easily I fell into village life and its refreshing ways (I will rhapsodise about these in the future). But three discoveries stood out. The first was the Parish Council. As a journalist I covered a variety of councils, but this was new. They don't have them in cities!

I wonder if villagers realise how incredible it is that fine men and women give up their time to caretake where they live, to act as housekeepers for the 'precept' – another word for tax – that they receive as a share of the council tax to use for the benefit of the villages. These people aren't paid (expenses are covered), yet every week of the year each one will be working on a problem or a project relating to their Fen village. 2014 was different for the councils. For the first time in 12 years, Cottenham and Waterbeach

had elections, which only happens when there are more people wanting to be on the PC than is designated by the powers that be. It brought Cottenham a J K Rowling moment when one councillor was elected but resigned before she even took her seat – called a casual vacancy, which will be put right by co-opting another person who is interested in community.

That was my second discovery – how reliant we

That was my second discovery – how reliant we all are on volunteering (see p 7) to make our villages run well for all, a subject the magazine will focus on in the future.

The third discovery was FECA, an association created about 30 years ago for the purpose of making life better and more interesting for everyone in the villages served by Cottenham Village College. It's a charity, with trustees who have helped many groups with small grants, was the originator of the three times a year magazine you are reading, and the Fen Edge Family Festival. They have not sung their praises enough. Times are changing but, with luck, the Fen Edge News will go from strength to strength and there'll be a new FECA website up and running to keep everyone in touch with each other and what's going on in our fentastic localities.

Libraries in the Fen Edge patch have had to struggle for some years, battling with the County Council to survive. With council budgets squeezed, there are more cuts in the offing so the threat has not gone away. In the meantime, however, we should all take advantage of what each library offers. All have printers, photocopiers, computers for email and internet access, and free wifi. You can order a book online through the Cambridgeshire Library Service and it will be delivered to your chosen library. Remember it is free to join a library, online or by phoning 0345 0455225. You receive your card by post and your ID is checked at the library when you visit.



The Fen Edge Volunteer Bank Investing your time in your community benefits everyone

An American football coach is credited with saying: "The measure of who we are is what we do with what we have". So, if it is time we have – a little or a lot – and we use it to make something better for others, everyone gains.

Where would we be without volunteers? On the sporting theme, for instance, it is the mums and dads, aunts, uncles, grandparents who give their time to help with coaching or getting the children to and from venues or training that make an incalculable contribution to those young people's lives, their fitness and their future. And the coaches who have worked to achieve their qualification level also give their time freely and their reward is seeing their young enthusiasts thrive and develop.

And what about the 'service' groups, like the Scouts, Guides, Brownies and Rainbows – the ones that stretch the children and broaden horizons outside of school hours. None of them would exist without volunteers.

On the civic scene, looking after the villages in the Fen Edge patch falls on those who live there. All have one main street along which too many cars appear not to notice speed limits. But volunteers of Speedwatch collect data so how many cars using the roads is known as well as how many travel at over 30 mph. Each monthly report makes sober reading – but at least locally registered vehicles travelling at 36mph and above are written to by area police. What's frightening is the number that travel at 45mph and over. More volunteers sitting by the roadside might make a big difference.

People who live in the Fen villages know how important transport is. With a poor or non existent bus service older residents of Landbeach would be isolated without the minibuses, available through the Cottenham Village College and FECA membership, and driven by volunteers (who must be under 70 because of insurance rules). The car services in Cottenham and Waterbeach are invaluable in enabling hospital and social visits for older people.

Then there's the Care Network, a Cambridgeshire-wide charity, in which local volunteers (called Community Navigators) offer help – such as finding out about benefit entitlements or encouraging social activities to prevent isolation. The Cottenham mobile warden scheme ensures that elderly people who want to stay in their own homes receive a daily phone call, or a visit from the warden, or will be looked after if their families are away.

Sue Bainbridge has been an enthusiastic volunteer for several years at the Community Centre coffee shop. It's very rewarding and you make lots of new friends, she says. Volunteers get basic training on the job, can do as much or as little as they want, and gain confidence as their skills increase. Drop in to the café or contact the manager jane@hackshaw.co.uk

Right now the big volunteer hunt is on for the 2015 Fen Edge Family Festival, which aims to try and outdo the success of the last in 2013! It needs people with ideas, dedication and enthusiasm to be part of the committee which will come up with happenings and activities for the 19th, 20th and 21st of June next year. It's a real opportunity for local charities and groups in the Fen Edge patch to raise funds and their profile. It should be great fun for all sections of the community and age groups. 

IN YOUR GARDEN: ENSURING WINTER COLOUR

It seems strange - on what is nearly the longest day of the year - to be talking about what you'll be looking at around the shortest day and later, but that's gardening for you. You need to plan ahead, says Ken Ellis.

It makes sense to choose evergreens that flower in January or February. These have a bonus built in, the high scent that attracts any insects that are about to pollinate them. Mahonia, which comes in many

varieties, has fragrant yellow racemes. It's very forgiving to pruning, so it can be controlled. Viburnum bodnantense can fill a whole garden with scent and look a picture in the low light levels of winter. The flowers of 'Dawn' start off as red buds, turning into pretty white pompons. Jasmine nudiflorum regrettably has no scent but yellow flowers appear all winter. But do train it well or it can be an untidy tangle. And do consider winter box - its flowers are not that significant, but what a delicious scent it gives at such a dark time of the year!

Another way of introducing colour is with plants whose stems are interesting. The dogwood, Cornus, with either

red or yellow varieties, is the best known. Be brave in mid to late spring and cut them right down. The growth will amaze you, and the young stems will colour up for winter. If you have room, birch trees (look for the Latin name Betula) have papery bark that peels away in winter, revealing smooth white bark that just has to be stroked. Check out the garden centre, or visit Anglesey Abbey at Lode, to see the effects you can achieve with these trees.

Personally, I like plants appropriate for the season. I'd go for Holly with its red berries, and choice of variegated leaves. Look at the two shades of green on their upper and lower sides! Ilex crenata Latifolia is slow growing and can be kept as a medium sized shrub. Other shrubs with berries include the Cotoneaster all-year-rounders: bees love them in spring, birds love them in winter. Sensitive pruning will give you a good display, and stop the

bush wandering about. Pyracantha can be 'a love it or hate it' plant because of its spikes. But, looked after properly, birds will nest in it, there will be spring blossom and colourful autumn berries. Facing south, it looks excellent in the low winter sun. Lastly, the Skimmia family: Skimmia japonica is probably the best known, with fragrant spring flowers, followed by berries – if you have a male plant nearby.

In October and November introduce bulbs that

Snowdrops of course you know well, but do you know why it's best to transplant them in the green? Neither did I until we had a visit at Garden Club from the owner of a local nursery who specialises in them. He let drop into the conversation that snowdrops have a symbiotic relationship with a mould that lives on their roots and helps them to absorb nutrients. If you buy them as dormant bulbs, the mould is probably not present, and it will take the bulbs a while to get going, as they have to attract the mould. In the green, they're still active and the mould is present round their roots. That's the kind of knowledge that gets shared at Garden Club. If you're any sort of gardener at any level, there's always something to learn.

The secret of snowdrops

develop at different time lengths. Most appreciated are the aconites which appear straight after Christmas, little vellow flowers brightening the darkest day. They seed freely, so if you're not too fastidious with the weeding they will spread around. Other early flowerers include the iris family Danfordiae. They are small, with a range of colours - we used them in the Ely town displays. Look for 'Katherine Hodgin' with its interesting flower. Crocus and daffodils of all flavours you will know well, but check out what the garden trade are calling Rockery narcissi. Tetea-Tete come into this category. but we like Jetfire, Minnow and February Gold. All come

up earlier than the large daffodils and narcissi.

You can always choose annuals, putting in winter pansies and violas as soon as they are available, so they settle down and begin to bloom. They won't do much on the darkest days, but you will have some colour. Primulas and polyanthus are reliable. By careful choice of variety you can get blooms through winter. Primula 'Wanda' has a nice colour range.

Finally, a shameless plug for the Cottenham Gardeners Club. We don't bite and we'd love to see you. Between us we have a wide range of experience and interests that we'd love to share. All those who delighted in hearing the combined choirs at the May twinning event or the Cottenham Brass Band in action at the start of the Yesteryear Run of amazing old vehicles will know that music is doing very well indeed in the Fen Edge area.

Musicians young and old are involved in various enterprises which allow them to be heard in the villages and further afield. To the fore is **Prime Brass**, based in Cottenham and rehearses at the Village College, which celebrated its 25th anniversary in June with a recital at Kings College Cambridge and on 7th September will perform at Ely Cathedral.

Children and pupils of Prime Brass members got together as **Junior Prime Brass** quintet in 2010 but became a dectet a year later. Aged 15 to 18, all players attend local schools and are either past or current members of the Cambs County Youth Orchestra and Wind Orchestra. The group has been very successful and has been chosen to perform at Music for Youth Primary Proms, a free concert by young people for young people, at the Royal Albert Hall on 13th October. And they'll be performing at All Saint's Church, Cottenham, next year in aid of much needed church funds.

Cottenham Brass Band, which has 35 regular players, will be tuned into both days of the Cottenham Feast weekend, on the 11th October playing from 8pm-10pm at Cottenham Primary School, and on the 12th from 2.30pm for an hour at the War Memorial. A **Junior Band** started in May, meeting at 6.30pm each Thursday at the Baptist Church. Instruments are available to learners and members of the Band are teaching. This move, it


is hoped, will ensure the brass band tradition in the village for future generations.


This year marks the 100th anniversary of the start of World War 1 and the band will be at the War Memorial from 10.30 to 11.30 for the Remembrance Service on Sunday the 9th November as well as on Tuesday the 11th, the actual Armistice Day on which the war ended in 1918.

Waterbeach Brass will take part in Jazz and Brass in the Parks on 31st August at Christ's Pieces, Cambridge, at 3pm. The band will perform on home ground at the Beach Social Club for a charity auction on 20th September, and on 18th October will be at the Landbeach Village Hall for a dinner concert.

Perhaps the most unusual group of performers is the Fen Edge Orchestra which rehearses Wednesday evenings in term time (7.30-9.30) at CVC. Those involved have had musical training but may have given up or not played for years. In a benevolent and encouraging environment their instruments blend under the baton of conductor Evan, the orchestra's third conductor since it was set up. All have a say on the type of classical music they want to play, that they will all enjoy. Concerts are irregular but always appreciated by friends and family.

The combined voices of **TyrannoChorus** – Tongue Twisters, 4 to 11 year olds, Vox Pop, their older brothers and sisters, and bigMouth, parents or other adults – gain fans wherever they perform. It may be too late to book for their concert at West Road, Cambridge, on 12th July but check out their Facebook page: BigMouthSinging – for other appearances, or if you are interested in singing you might want to join.

OCTOBER IS FOR FEASTS

Fen villages have a long tradition of feasts but they are not necessarily alike or held at the same time of year. One thing's for sure – they are designed to involve all age groups

Willingham spends months planning its feast so that there will be a range of attractions. It is always held on the first weekend in October, and spans up to a week to include scouts, guides, walkers and cyclists, exhibitions, a farmers' market, car boot sale, music and dance events and a funfair. Feast Sunday is the special day when a Salvation Army band plays on the Green and in the evening a joint church service is held.

This year's event, organised by the Willingham Action group (WAG), will take place on 3rd to 5th October and you can check out details nearer the time at www.willinghamlife.org

In an interesting article about Feast Sunday which appeared in a past issue of Willingham News the choice of the date was explained: 'on Michaelmas Day domestic servants change places or are reengaged, but in all cases they have a few days' holiday'. Which is why daughters working out of the village in domestic service came home then. Another tradition was the cooking of special cheese tarts. 'Janet Hart notes they were made with local cheese, sugar, lemon, egg and mixed dried fruit,' said the article.

In Cottenham, the Feast Parade which has been running since the mid 1800s (war years excepted) was originally organised by the churches and was held to celebrate the end of the cheese-making season (Cottenham was famous for its cheese, no longer made) and the bringing in of the harvest. Now run by a separate committee, the Feast Parade will take place on Sunday 12th October, starting at 2pm at the Brookfields Industrial Estate, Twentypence Road. All the groups in Cottenham – guides, scouts, schools, WI etc – generally take part, choosing a theme for their float and decorate it and themselves, some groups walk dressed up. The parade will make its way through the village, past the War Memorial where Cottenham Brass will be playing, to the Green, arriving about 3pm, where there will be a fair and stalls. Money is collected on the route and non-profit-making groups within the village can apply for a share of the collection. Each child taking part in the parade receives a medal. COMMUNITY NEWS

BIN COLLECTIONS

Because of reductions in government funding to local authorities, South Cambs Council has made savings on bin collections, while improving efficiency and trying not to inconvenience villagers. From September collection times may vary, from 6am to 5pm, from 60,000 properties on 180 routes every fortnight– all will be included in the calendar published in the South Cambs Magazine or collections can be checked online at www. scambs.gov.uk/bins-by-parish. Further changes will occur in December, January and February when green bins will be collected monthly, a decision taken by the council after research showed that the amount of compostable waste halves during those months.

YOUTH COUNCILLORS

South Cambs Youth Council which gives school-age youngsters between 13 and 17 a voice and input into happenings across the region has entered a new phase after seven councillors have stepped down (either because they're too old or have other commitments). Among those still serving are three from the Fen Edge Patch: Dale Hargrove from Willingham, Nathan Samuel, Landbeach, and Gemma Steele, Waterbeach. The present youth council's focus will be on finding out what employers are looking for in young employees and how to raise the profile of the skills young people can offer. And they will be getting involved in Cambridge Conversations, a forum to find ways of encouraging young people to get involved in their communities.

INDIVIDUAL ELECTORAL REGISTRATION

People 18 and over entitled to vote in England and Wales now have the responsibility for their own registration rather than leaving it to one householder to fill it in for whoever lives there. The change in the system of annual registration requires evidence of identification for each person which will make the electoral register more secure and help guard against fraud. Most electors won't have to do anything as their data will be matched automatically to that held by the Department of Work and Pensions or council services; others will receive letters asking them to re-register, online or by paper, and provide their national insurance number and birth date, legally required nationally.

SQUIRT MAKES COTTENHAM DEBUT

Cottenham's new fire engine has been named Squirt thanks to the children at the village primary school. The pupils came up with lots of names but the school council decided that the one chosen by Reception pupil Ted, 5, and Year 3's Grace and Noah, both 8, was particularly apt. They not only received a prize but the school also enjoyed a visit from the engine, the first the on-call station has had in more than 30 years. It cost about £240,000 and while it looks similar to a traditional fire engine, carrying 1,800 litres of water and a variety of ladders, it has equipment that enhances rescue capability in road accidents, and will provide an improved service to rural communities.


