CHAIR'S MESSAGE

The Annual General Meeting of the Fen Edge Community Association (FECA) took place on May 24th and it was gratifying that there was a very good turnout. The member organisations continue to do great work in the community and it was exciting to hear about their plans.

Last year we set out three main priorities – to expand membership, to increase grant making and to increase the number of events we support.

At this time last year, our membership had increased to 48 organisations (from 37 the previous year); it has reached 56 and hopefully will grow further. We welcomed two new member organisations – Stitchwild and the Cottenham Tennis Club – at the Annual General Meeting. The organisation is clearly thriving but we are still under-represented in Waterbeach. We would welcome contact from any community organisation or group that wishes to find out more about the benefits of FECA membership.

Over 2017, the Fen Edge News went from strength to strength and it continues to be a key source of funds for FECA. The 100th edition of the Fen Edge News was published last year. It is informative and I know that many residents really look forward to receiving it. Adrian Stephens is now the Editor and is faced with the unenviable task of managing the ever-growing demand for space without adding any more pages! We were successful in increasing our financial support of members. Our grant making commitments increased by nearly 50% from £4,350 in 2016/17 to £6,498 in 2017/18. In addition, we have promised, but not paid out, other grants exceeding £4,000. We have had some great successes in terms of promoting community participation in activities, helping organisations promote their events and enabling the purchase of equipment and

The Cottenham 7k Fun Run took place in May. Thanks again to Martyn Leeks and all the other volunteers for making this happen. It was a very warm day but there were nearly 200 participants and the event

raised over £1,000 for MNDA (Motor Neurone Disease Association). We also supported the Twinning Association visit to France and the general verdict from those that travelled was that the event was "the best one yet!" Well done to the team that organised that. We also supported a trip for the Tyrannochorus choir group to travel to France to perform.

I would like to extend my thanks to the FECA Trustees and Committee for all their work over the past year in making this happen. It's a very good team and it is good to know that they have all offered their services for the forthcoming year.

We are also looking forward to strengthening the relationship with Cottenham Village College over the next year. The creation of FECA was directly related to the broader community objectives contained in the village college concept. Janet Drinkwater and Steve Ellison continue to be great supporters of FECA and we are very pleased that Helen Cassady, the Principal of Cottenham Village College, has also agreed to join our Committee. We hope that Helen will also contribute a regular piece in the future editions of Fen Edge News to inform the community of news and activities at the College.

Next year will be a Fen Edge Festival (FEF) year and that always dominates the agenda. We extended the event to include activities at Willingham and Landbeach in 2017 and we would love to do the same in 2019. I look forward to a new Festival Committee coming together in the autumn to arrange the event. I really hope that many of the 2017 team will sign up to be involved again as it was a tremendous team but there is always a need for new volunteers. If you are interested in volunteering, please contact me and we can discuss the various ways in which you might be able to get involved. It is a significant commitment but it's a lot of fun (there are quite a few laughs to be had) and there is a huge sense of satisfaction at the end of it. The FEF is totally dependent upon having that team of volunteers - no volunteers, no event! So please get involved. Lastly, the member organisations are the heart of FECA; we are very grateful to them for all they do in the community and we hope we can continue to support their work. You can read about many of their activities in the Fen Edge News and I hope you will get involved in them in the forthcoming year.



The Cottenham Toy Library soft play sessions continue to be a popular activity for babies, toddlers and pre-schoolers. We run two sessions every month, on a Friday morning, which costs £2 per child, £1 per child under I year (babies in arms with siblings are free) or £3 per family. FIRS HOUSE PATIENT PARTICIPATION GROUP

The Patient Participation Group (PPG) is made up of patients registered with the Firs House GP Practice in Station Road, Histon or Telegraph Street, Cottenham. We aim to represent patients' interests, working with the Practice to help improve the patient experience. We meet bi-monthly and are very fortunate in having the support and active involvement

of the Practice Manager and a GP Partner, who attend our meetings. This enables us to have constructive 2-way discussions with the Practice.

We are a group of individuals from a variety of backgrounds, whose collective experiences are wide-ranging. Members volunteer to plan and organise health promotion events in partnership with local community organisations on a variety of topics – e.g. Understanding Dementia, Diabetes De-mystified. These events are free and open to anyone whether or not registered patients of Firs House.

The PPG attends and responds to public consultations on health related issues, and works to raise awareness of GP services for young people.

We have put on 3 community health information events in the past 6 months, and have had very positive feedback on all of them. We will be considering what events to promote in the future.

If anyone registered with the Firs House Practice is interested in joining the PPG, please contact reception at Histon or Cottenham.

If there are any issues you would like the PPG to raise with the Practice, or have any suggestions for future community health information events, do leave a note in the suggestions box at either surgery, clearly marked "For PPG". (Note that, any personal health issues or complaints should not be sent to the PPG, but need to be raised with the surgery.)

COTTENHAM CARECAR STILL NEEDS VOLUNTEER DRIVERS

Following our last appeal in Fen Edge News, we have lost two volunteers and gained three! We have also been able to recruit a new Deputy Coordinator, Wendy Dear, and a valuable Oakington and Westwick driver. This is still not enough, and we sometimes have to utter the dreaded words "no car available;" so we want to sign on a few more drivers.

For the benefit of new readers, Cottenham Carecar is one of the many Social Car Schemes operating in Cambridgeshire, in association with the County Council. We cover Cottenham, Oakington and, currently, Westwick. We liaise with Rampton and the Histon, Impington and Girton schemes on a reciprocal basis. Half of the journeys are medical appointments and half social.

Volunteer Drivers are not tied down to any particular time or day: jobs are offered one by one. Drivers are fully reimbursed for all their car expenses incurred; some training is available. Drivers must have their own car (preferably four door), and have fully comprehensive insurance. They will also have to be DBS cleared (at no cost to themselves).

This is a great opportunity to do a bit of good for your community, make a few new friends, and get out and about.

ABOUT COTTENHAM CARES

Cottenham Cares is an informal group of village residents who are raising funds to help relieve the suffering of those affected by the war in Syria. Since we started at the end of 2015 we have collected almost £27,000 through a variety of events: carol singing, a sponsored winter camp, a Syrian meal, a golf day, a music quiz, table-top sales, some generous donations and, most recently, a ceilidh in the Village College and a baroque music concert in All Saints' Parish Church.

All the money raised is donated to Save The Children and Medecins Sans Frontieres/Doctors Without Borders to support the vital work they are doing in Syria and its bordering countries.

Some recent letters from these charities show the value of our efforts.

From Save the Children: "We would like to thank everyone at Cottenham Cares on behalf of all the children we support, for your fundraising efforts year for our Syria appeal. Your support has helped us save children's lives.

It's now been over seven years of brutal war in Syria. The psychological toll of living through years of conflict is enormous for children living in the country. The prolonged exposure to war, violence and uncertainty means that many children are in a state of 'toxic stress,' leaving emotional scars which may never fully heal. But with the phenomenal help of supporters like you, we are working tirelessly to prevent any more children from losing their childhoods. Your support has helped us reach even more children who are in desperate need of our help — thank you."

From Medecins Sans Frontieres/Doctors without Borders: "Medecins Sans Frontieres are extremely grateful for the very generous donation raised in support of our work in Syria." The letter then relates the experiences of a surgeon recently returned from Jordan where he was treating warwounded patients from Syria. He describes in graphic detail the care given to 8-year Zehra who lost her father and siblings in an airstrike and herself received life-changing shrapnel injuries to her face, chest and leg. He concludes:

"Your support makes it possible for MSF to help Zehra and others like her with surgery, post-operative care and counselling. I feel proud to have been part of it in a small way. I've finished my posting in Jordan now. It was my first time treating war injuries, but managing complicated wounds proved much easier than saying goodbye. Thank you so much for your generosity."







MANAGING OUR LOCAL NATURE RESERVE

Friends of Worts Meadow (FOWM)

It's hard work keeping a garden in order; wilderness soon returns if it is neglected. We manage our gardens to be pleasant and relaxing places and/or to be a habitat for wildlife. It's no different with a nature reserve except that the priority is to manage it for the wildlife rather than us, but that usually also makes such reserves wonderful places for us to visit as well. The trouble is that management takes time and money, both in short supply from hard-pressed Cambridgeshire County Council (County Farms) who own Worts Meadow and Bourne Wood. This



is where FOWM volunteers come in, by giving practical time and energy in the form of 'work parties'.

This spring and summer we have been concentrating on clearing invading scrub and brambles around our ponds, which support Great Crested Newts (GCNs) as well as an abundance of other water creatures. Water Voles ("Ratty") have also been seen. Our March Amphibian Walk, led by the national charity 'Froglife' armed with powerful torches, showed healthy populations of GCNs much to the excitement of the attending children (and the adults). Without management the ponds would become unsuitable for the newts, which like shallow ponds with submerged plants on which to lay their eggs. We have also created clearings in the wood to encourage wild flowers and especially orchids of which we have at least three species. Bourne Wood used to be a grass field and these are probably remnant populations from around 30 years ago. Recording the wildlife is also important - you can't manage the habitat properly for wildlife if you don't know what you've got in the first place. It's also fun and by the time you read this we will have completed our first 'Bioblitz'. This should add



to our lists which already include some 50 birds, 9 mammals, 136 moths and 100 flowering plants (including grasses).

Working outdoors in our 'green gym' is fun, fascinating and gets you fit! So do join us on one of our working parties or at any of our public events. FOWM volunteers help with the practical management of Worts Meadow Local Nature Reserve in Landbeach. It is free to join. Our open events provide the chance to learn about and enjoy the wildlife of the site and help with recording. 

GARDENING

THE YELLOW BOOK

It's all quiet in the garden now. The sun is out, and it's warm. We're all sat round a table on the patio, and someone's pouring wine. Bliss. The time is 6.20pm on Sunday, June 10th. The NGS open day in Ely is at an end. The last visitors have just left, the steam engine is simmering quietly to itself as it cools down and we're all still vibrating slightly from having around 500 people visit our garden in a four hour period.

We opened six gardens in Ely in total, and raised some £1926.00 for the National Garden Scheme. We were all in agreement that it had been a good day, and worth the effort. You know how it is; if you have visitors coming, you probably clear up a bit, and so it is with this. We enjoy talking to people, sharing ideas and expertise with them so that we can all grow a little from the experience. It's encouraging when someone is enthusiastic about your work, and good when someone is able to tell you, for instance, how they made their Bird of Paradise plant bloom. It's also good to be able to be part of a scheme that donated three million pounds to charities last year.

As part of the publicity, I'd appealed for people who would be prepared to show their garden under the NGS banner next year. I've had several enquiries, which is quite exciting, as some have never opened before. The thing is though, that people think that their garden isn't good enough to show. This is a pity, as it's always a pleasure to see what other people do on their patch, whatever its size. These days, anybody moving into a new house will face the twofold challenge of trying to cultivate whatever the builders have left them, and size! From that point of view, it's good to talk to people who garden in small spaces, and share ideas. I keep emphasising to people who are interested that, yes, a garden has to be interesting, but that it's not a Chelsea style presentation, but more of a celebration of what people can do. The idea is to send visitors away with the feeling that they've seen things that they could do too.

The NGS produce the Yellow Book, which lists nationally gardens that are open in different areas of the country. You may be familiar with the county edition, which is available from garden centres, and other shops and establishments locally. The Yellow Book is great if you travel a lot, and will lead you to open garden weekends, individual gardens that open by appointment and those that have individual open days. I would encourage you to make the effort to patronise

these events – and garden open events raising money for other charities. It's a pleasant way of giving money to good causes, and will leave you with a wealth of ideas for yourself, as well as letting you see places that you wouldn't otherwise be aware of.

What's it like to open? I'd be lying if I said that it wasn't an effort. The planning begins well in advance. If you're a gardener, you already know that. It takes your time, which is more precious than money. There will be the odd panic when things don't appear to be coming into bloom. (One year, I met half of the Ely gardeners at a local garden centre, buying anything in flower. It happens.) Like all good weddings, there's stuff you can only do at the last minute. This can be, er, exciting. On the other hand, there is the payback of watching people wander round your garden, and realising that they actually wanted to see what you have done. You gradually collect a band of helpers, who will man the gate for you, sell plants, or be on hand to talk to people about plants. This can be rewarding in developing a friendship with other people with whom you share a common interest, as you band together to do something nice, bringing pleasure and benefit to others.

So, how about it? Do you want to join the visited? Don't dismiss the idea; consider it. Get hold of the Yellow Book for details, or contact hello@ngs.org.uk. A quote; 'What I enjoyed about the gardens is that, as well as a special quality, they offer up something so personally 'home-made' and are 'real'.

Oh yes. The train? Well, another time. The wine's poured, and I'm four words over my limit!

MINIBUSES FOR HIRE

Does your group need to use a minibus sometimes, to go on outings, fixtures, or to get your members to events? Did you know that if your group is a member of the Fen Edge Community Association, you can hire Cottenham Village College's minibuses? Here is what you need to know: I. It is a major benefit of FECA membership that local groups can hire the college's 3 minibuses. 2. The minibuses hold 17 people, including the driver. 3.At least one member of your group will need to take a test in order to become a qualified minibus driver. These tests can be arranged through the college and cost £75 per person, providing three people take the test at the same time. Once a driver has passed their test, they are qualified to drive for 5 years, before they need to be re-tested. These drivers need to have DI on their licence, or they will need to attend training to get this qualification first. 4. The charge for hire is £1.32 per mile, which includes fuel and insurance.


