Summertime... and the garden is busy

It's actually quite difficult to visualise the part of the year that I'm writing about. At present, I'm sat in the middle of Storm Ciara listening to a very angry sounding wind having a go at anything that isn't concreted down.

However, you're reading this in April, and everything is ramping up quite nicely now. This is the time when all of your efforts in the cold months begin to repay you. Carry on weeding, and begin to remove the foliage of earlier bulbs. If you had any in pots, plant them out in the garden if you can. They may not do much next year, but they will if you're patient. We have some hyacinths that were in a pot years ago, and now reside outside my office. They're already in bud.

Don't be tempted to put out annual bedding yet. The frost can be cruel and come later than you think; the latest I've encountered was the end of May, when all of our potato foliage suffered on the allotment. While on the subject of bedding, be cautious about buying multi packs from places that sell plants as a by-line. If you time it right, and know what you want, you'll perhaps get a bargain. If not, it's a case of buyer beware. They don't always look after the plants that they sell, and may not be able to give advice. Go, instead, to a local supplier. If you're not sure what you want, they'll be able to advise you.

You can though plant hardy perennials in April. If you get them in early, they'll have time to settle and send out a root system before it gets hot. You can also sow patches of hardy annuals. The clue is the word hardy. Buy them early and sow in patches. I did a bed once, dividing it into irregular shapes with a trickle of sand. Sow different seeds into each patch, giving more than one patch to each type if you can. Cover the seed and see what happens. Plant up pots too; you can get quite artistic with a bit of imagination. Choose two or three plants to put in a pot-one short, one medium and one tallish, depending on the pot. Colour coordinate them, and people will think you're so clever. A good pot to make up is the Three Sisters. One tomato (go for Moneymaker or Alicante), one medium sweet corn plant and one climbing French bean. Plant the sweet corn and a moneymaker plant, and sow a couple of bean seeds. The bean will use the corn as a climbing frame and look a bit different.

Do a bit of forward planning. You've probably got your holiday dates firmed up. Find a friend that has different dates to you, and form a cooperative now. You'll both know what the other wants looking after, with less explaining to do the day before you go!

Finally, make a date to visit an open garden. The county yellow books are about, or you can go online to the National Garden Scheme (ngs.org.uk) and use their find a garden scheme. You'll get inspired and support good causes, as well as enjoying the company of likeminded people.

Cottenham Carecar is a Social Car Scheme run by volunteers that covers Cottenham, Oakington and Westwick. This service provides for both medical and social journeys supporting fellow villagers that have difficulty in using Public Transport. In some circumstances, people who are temporarily unable to drive can also be helped.

We are now recruiting additional volunteer drivers and escorts to replace attrition, and to continue what is widely regarded as a very valuable service to the villages.

Anyone interested should be aware that they would never be out of pocket, all expenses incurred are reimbursed. Volunteers are not tied down to any particular day or time – they may accept or decline any job offered. Volunteers make lots of new friends and have the satisfaction of helping others.

Even if you can't drive, we always need escorts who accompany the client and help them with their trip.

So, there is no need to be stuck indoors with nothing to do, even if you can only spare an hour per week, just give me a ring and ask questions!



Students compete in national challenge

The Nesta Explorer Artificial Intelligence (AI)

Challenge focuses on how artificial intelligence can be used to help humans live better lives. Students from around the country were asked to design a product to improve the world using Al.

The themes were:



living longer, living together, living greener and living better.

Three year-10 students from Cottenham - Rachel Morgan, Benjamin Reynolds and Josh Wilson chose the theme of living together and have come up with a unique idea of how to use AI in the fight against cyber bullying. Their team was one of 60 chosen out of 126 applicants to progress to the semi-final round in London. The semi-final offered students the opportunity of deepening their understanding of AI and gave them skills and knowledge to further develop their project. The team will have to reshape their application and deliver a two-minute video in their bid to progress to the finals in summer. Rachel, Benjamin and Josh have been working hard on their project, giving up their spare time after school to perfect their idea. We wish them the very best of luck in getting through to the finals.


COTTENHAM RENEGADES





Works on the Rampton and Oakington Road roundabout are expected to take place over the summer holidays, which will lead to some disruption. This Land have submitted Reserved Matters applications defining the design and layout of their sites for scrutiny; it might not reach the SCDC Planning Committee until May. Village Hall/Nursery update - Demolition of the old Village Hall is complete and the frameworks for both new buildings should soon be clear as the steelwork is put into place over the spring. The car park extension and spaces next to the Bowls Club are now almost done, with a bit of finishing off to do over the Easter Holidays. Currently we are expecting handover of the nursery in early September and the Hall in mid-November. As yet there is no operator for the nursery and we will be going out to tender shortly. 

Spotted Flycatchers – have you got this increasingly rare bird breeding in your garden? Let us know!

In recent years many Cambridgeshire community and parish newsletters, magazines and websites have helped with a County-wide survey of Spotted Flycatchers. These are attractive migrant birds, about the size of a Robin, which are summer visitors to village gardens and churchyards. Although they breed with us, they spend up to nine months of the year travelling as much as 16,000 miles a year between here and their wintering grounds in Southern Africa -Angola and Namibia. This is an increasingly dangerous journey for them, and sadly they are in deep decline. Widespread losses amounted to a 50% decline during 1995-2010, continuing a 90% decline since 1970. Only a few hundred pairs remain breeding in Cambridgeshire, but most villages still have a pair or two; they rarely breed out in the wider countryside. We are continuing our work to find and monitor nesting pairs. It's almost certain that there are many additional pairs out there of which we are not aware. Do you have Flycatchers in your garden? Will you see one this year, or have you in recent years? The few that remain are here from mid-May to September. And there's lots more to read about our project and Spotted Flycatchers in general at bit.ly/SpotFly. Please email:



the mass-produced synthetic multicoloured squares that we all see in craft and hobby shops, or on pool tables, 'real' handmade felt is quite a different material, which bears little resemblance to the synthetic variety. Handmade felt is often made entirely from wool fleece that has been cleaned and carded to align the wool fibres, and perhaps dyed. The wool fibres contain microscopic scales; and when the wool fleeces (also known as tops or roving) are layered over one another and then rubbed together with soap and water, they begin to link together and thus the felting process begins. Once the fibres have matted together in a dense fabric, the felt is then 'fulled', in which heat and friction are applied to shrink and harden the fabric, making it thicker and denser. Once this process is completed, the felt is ready to use.

Some practical examples of how this type of felt is used include its use in making weather resistant warm outerwear, hats, boot and helmet linings and roofing material. Felt has many industrial uses, but our focus is on its use in textile art. Wet felting by hand can be

accomplished quite easily with simple and user-friendly equipment such as a net curtain to lay over the fibres, soap and water, a bamboo mat or large piece of bubble-wrap and lots of friction! Flat felted pieces are straightforward to produce but with additional easily learned techniques, 3D and hollow items can be made. Felting can also be done by knitting wool yarn into a piece of fabric and then fulling it in hot water in the washing machine, a process that many may have discovered by accident in the past when a favourite wool jumper has been washed by mistake in hot water! And finally, dry felting can be done by pushing extremely sharp, barbed needles up and down into wool fibres until they tangle and bond together. This process can be done by hand, to form sculpted pieces, or with what is called an embellishing machine, where the needles are pushed up and down by machine.

Hopefully you have enjoyed this quick summary of felting! Under Claire's direction, group members hope to produce some interesting textile work to share with you at a future date!
