

CHAIR'S MESSAGE



I hope that this message finds you all well and perhaps even enjoying the summer break and some nice weather.

We held our second Annual General Meeting via Zoom in May and I would like

to use the opportunity to reflect on recent FECA activity and the year ahead. It was very pleasing to see so many organisations represented. For FECA, 2020/I was a year that presented many challenges but equally some highlights. In terms of challenges, many of our member organisations' activities were suspended during the lockdown and we are very conscious of the potential need to support these groups as they seek to re-establish their normal activities.

Obviously, one of the greatest disappointments was that we had to cancel the Fen Edge Festival that would have taken place this June. It was the right decision as it was just too difficult to make the commitments and plan the event against the backdrop of such uncertainty. There is every hope that the deferral will just be a year and the event will take place in June 2022, with planning starting later this year. I know everyone will be very keen to know the dates so that they can plan and have something to look forward to. I am pleased to be able to announce that the provisional dates will be 24-26 June. Obviously, there is still a lot of uncertainty about the shape of the event and what will be possible but we are very interested to hear from anyone wishing to get involved in the organisation of the festival.

However, it was also a year in which FECA stepped up to many challenges. In terms of the Covid-19 support, FECA enabled the repurposing of the *Fun Run* online entry platform to a kitty system to support shopping for shielding residents. The system has since processed over £10,000 worth of shopping. We are very proud to have been part of the Covid-19 support groups' efforts in Cottenham and Willingham.

We are also proud of the grants that continued through the year including the largest grant that FECA has ever awarded that was given to the Village College towards a new audio-visual system.

In total, during 2020/21, grants of just over £8.000 were made.

We suspended membership fees in 2020/21 for our member groups. A very small gesture in recognition of the financial pressures. Our current membership stands at 71 organisations, community groups and charities which is double the number of members from 5 years ago and reflects the increasing value and profile of FECA in the community. It is particularly pleasing that we have seen new members in Willingham such as Willingham Parish Council and most recently Willingham Cricket Club.

Overall, not a year we will remember with any fondness, but FECA remains a very active organisation that is proud of its success in supporting other local organisations, groups and charities.

Lastly, I wish to thank the Management Committee for all their efforts over the past year. In particular, I would like to thank Tony Blick, who is stepping down from FECA, but who has done much in a short period of time to strengthen the link between Cottenham Village College and FECA. The meetings have continued regularly on Zoom and I don't think we missed a beat. This was also the first year operating under the new Constitution which has established a much clearer and more robust governance structure.

COTTENHAM COMMUNITY LAND TRUST LIMITED

Our aim remains to deliver a number of locally-affordable homes in and around Cottenham, although progress is slow, partly as a result of Covid-19.

Cottenham's Neighbourhood Plan, which makes the case for around 90 locally-affordable homes over and above the approved developments, is now "made" and forms part of the Local Plan used to determine planning applications in Cottenham. It goes beyond just numbers of houses so is well worth a read. Thanks to all the local people who overwhelmingly supported it at the referendum and the Parish Council and District Council for their support.

We developed a preliminary proposition for a site in Cottenham but the landowners pulled out. We are now reviewing some alternative options. If one is near you, please don't resist it out of hand; there are many local people who will benefit from a house that only cost them around 3 times their household income. Better yet, if you know somewhere, do let us know.

The demise of James Palmer, as Mayor of the Cambridgeshire & Peterborough Combined Authority, has affected our approach in three ways. He was a champion of the CLT approach and we planned to utilise both his £44million revolving loan fund and £100K home initiatives, which both look as if they will disappear with him. It remains to be seen how far the state will go in providing locally-affordable homes around here.

Another worrying development is that Wilburton Parish Council, which had recently voted to support a CLT planning application despite a number of resident objections, has suffered a vote of no confidence calling on them all to resign. The poll, called by their Annual Parish Meeting, is not legally binding but will nevertheless influence Planners at East Cambridgeshire District Council, which has previously been very supportive of CLTs.

Although by no means over, relaxations in protective procedures should allow us to rebuild a proposition and proceed before too long.

Ladybird Pre-school is a community-based, charity-run childcare provider that offers term-time childcare for children aged 2–5 in Cottenham and the surrounding villages. We are situated in Cottenham on the

recreation ground, next to the Village Hall. We first opened in November 1994 – back then, we were an amalgamation of three smaller pre-schools and had no building from which to operate. With thanks to our Deputy Manager Carolynn and her fundraising efforts, along with the Parish Council, the building was constructed and Ladybird Pre-school was born.

We offer part-day or full-day sessions between 9am and 3pm, working across three learning spaces (Green, Red and Blue). We work closely with Cottenham Primary School and offer School Readiness sessions to children who are in their preschool year. The purpose of these sessions is to ease the transition into school, equipping the children with some of the key skills required when starting their school journey.

Thanks to a National Lottery grant and a whole lot of fundraising, we have a beautiful garden, which includes; an allotment for growing our own fruit and vegetables, a fairy reading garden, large boat, mud kitchen and balance beam.

Our dynamic curriculum is centred around play, and facilitated by our experienced and passionate staff who are committed to ensuring that all children develop and progress. We use Tapestry online learning journals to document the children's development and to engage with families through regular observations, photographs and conversations.

As an inclusive educational setting, we welcome all children and celebrate differences. We happily accommodate children with additional needs and work closely with families, and the local authority, to ensure that we offer appropriate levels of support. Ladybird Pre-school is operated by a management team and supported by a parent committee and fundraising team. The members of Cottenham Tennis Club were delighted to be able to start playing again in April this year, when the lockdown was partially

relaxed. Whilst life is still not back to normal, we seem to have had a real boost. In the Fen Edge Patch tennis is

now busier than ever, with our Wednesday social evening and our coaching sessions brimming with enthusiastic members, both beginners and more experienced players. On your walks you may have noticed our new sign outside the Village College, (below the football and behind the care home signs!) Thank you to the sports centre for giving us permission for this. Our new Tennis Xpress adult beginner courses, funded by a generous grant from the Cooperative community fund have been fully booked. We have run two of these so far and have one more planned for September.All participants have been offered reduced-price membership and further coaching thanks to further funding. To cater for the increased demand for beginner classes we have opened up a new class specifically to follow on from these Tennis Xpress courses. It's been great to see how the beginners from last year have progressed to become intermediate club players. This is thanks to the excellent coaching we have from the team at Game Set Tennis, and to encouragement

from established club members giving them the confidence to play more. We are hoping to recruit some of them to boost the club's teams very soon! The courts are busier than we have ever seen them and we have strong players coming to club night. We should now be able to field two men's teams in the winter league matches, which will be a first for Cottenham! We now have 100 people in tennis coaching around the patch, including the school breakfast clubs run by *Game*

Set Tennis, which provide an introduction to youngsters at the Primary Schools (and maybe some early morning child care?)
Our membership has more than doubled since last year; we now have over 80 members and are still growing, with members from across the Fen Edge Patch; Cottenham, Rampton, Waterbeach, Willingham and Northstowe.

We have also initiated a day-time session for children aged 3-4 at the grass courts on the Recreation Ground. This was fully booked for the second half of the summer term – lots of fun has been had by the tots learning rudimentary ball skills whilst socialising. It's a great

opportunity to get the children outside in the fresh air, keeping them active and busy as well as a chance for parents and carers to link up.

Another first was our half-term tennis camp held at the CVC courts in June. This was well attended despite being the first opportunity many had to go on holiday, and feedback was universally positive. Hopefully we will be able to run many more holiday clubs.

The grass courts are looking good and being well used. The bounce is interesting and keeps you on your toes but it's a lovely place to be now the weather is so good for grass tennis, and lovely to see the recreation ground being so well used. Thanks must go to Andrew the groundsman and to the parish council for supporting this.

The Tennis Club has had two lads volunteering for their Duke of Edinburgh award by helping with the youngest children's sessions, and other teenagers are also helping out with coaching. This provides an opportunity for those already in the coaching programme to earn some

May and June saw three highly successful events at Landbeach tithe barn.

On 22 May the Histon Country Pop-up Market proved very popular with the ~150 visitors that came, admired and purchased a wide range of locally-made products. One week later saw a one-day display of artworks by local artist Maureen Mace, members of the Cambridge Drawing society and students at Rowan (a Cambridge-based charity providing an arts centre and forest school for more than 80 adults with learning disabilities). The exhibition was viewed by over 230 visitors and the purchases made resulted in a healthy donation to the Spend a Penny campaign (below).

The weekends of 12–13 and 19–20 June saw *Covid Dreams*, an innovative and thought-provoking art installation by Gideon Pain and Theo Gayer-Anderson exploring the impact of the coronavirus pandemic on all our lives. Visited over the two weekends by over 160 people, Covid Dreams was highly hands-on with visitors of all ages encouraged to listen to local testimonies on old-fashioned black telephones and write the names of people they wish to remember onto an upturned boat.

Improving Landbeach tithe barn – Spend a Penny campaign progress

Planning permission for the loos has already been granted so now its full steam ahead to raise the £30,000 needed to install them. We are making bids for grant funding and have already raised over £11,800 (plus Gift Aid) from 59 fantastic local donors. FECA IN LANDBEACH

FRIENDS OF WORTS MEADOW

This past winter Worts Meadow and Bourne Wood suffered extensive flooding, with ducks (and children) enjoying paddling around in mini-lakes formed by water lying in the furrows of the ancient ridge and furrow farming system. The moat around the site of the old manor

flooded out across the meadow into the road ditch, but also out through the gate and down the road. On Christmas Day you could almost have sailed a toy yacht down the stream of water. The wildlife ponds were all full, in contrast to the end of the summer when they almost dried out. Now the warmth and rain have resulted in lush vegetation both within and outside the ponds (and extra-tall 'weeds' in my garden) and plenty of dragonflies and damselflies dipping their tails into the ponds to lay their eggs. Hopefully by the time of our pond dipping (below) there will be plenty of 'dragons' to see as the eggs

hatch and grow into fearsome-looking nymphs. This year the nest boxes were still quiet in the second half of May and our nest-box watch did not reveal the usual mad frenzy of blue tit and great tit parents feeding vociferous young. As you may have heard on Springwatch the caterpillar supply in many areas arrived late this year, due to the cold and wet, which had a particular effect on blue tits. Interestingly those nesting in my garden produced young fledgelings almost on time. Perhaps because we continue filling our bird feeders year-round? This year we recorded a total of 35 bird species on our Dawn Chorus early (6am) morning walk at the beginning of June. We were serenaded by skylarks, chiffchaffs, bullfinches, whitethroats, yellowhammers and many more. With the nesting season now coming towards an end, the singing is less enthusiastic, but it's still well worth getting up early (or 5 minutes earlier if you already have an early work start) and just listening out for the fluid notes of a blackbird and the persistent monologues of wood pigeons and collared doves.

FECA IN WILLINGHAM

WILLINGHAM GARDENING CLUB

The club had hoped to resume its monthly meetings on Monday 5 July. But, at the end of June, the government decided to extend Covid restrictions into July, which meant that our July meeting had to be cancelled. As you can imagine this is a great disappointment to all our members. We hope to resume meetings in September. As with the vast majority of similar events up and down the country, it is with regret that this year's Willingham Horticultural and Craft Show has been cancelled as it proved impractical to make workable arrangements in the current climate.

Some jobs in the garden to think about over the coming weeks

Autumn Jobs to do right now: think of autumn less as the end of the gardening year and more as a start of the next one.

Dig over vegetable beds and flower borders. If your lawn looks slightly the worse for wear, this is the perfect time to revitalise it. Whether it means repairing any worn out or dead areas or wear and tear.

Keep container plants in tip top condition by tidying up dead, damaged material. Mulching and feeding as necessary. Use pot feet to improve drainage so the pot does not become waterlogged over the winter with the possibility of freezing and killing off your plants.

Remove lower branches on trees that are causing obstruction. Avoid pruning ornamental cherries and plums, though, because the cuts will be open to disease. Prune these trees in summer instead. Dig up and move poorly placed shrubs, and divide over crowded perennials while the soil is still warm. Clean all the glass, frames and benches in the greenhouse to prevent pests and diseases from overwintering.

Clean pots and garden equipment, wipe metal surfaces with a little oil.

Buy and plant spring bulbs as soon as possible for spectacular borders.

If you have a pond spread a fine net and pin it down with bricks. This will catch falling leaves, which can clog pumps and turn the water foul. Take down bird boxes and empty them. Clear old nesting material and other debris that may carry diseases. Wash out the boxes with hot water and a

dash of biological cleaner. Clean out bird baths and feeders, and refill them regularly.

Protect the crown of frost-sensitive perennials. Protect alpine plants against winter wet. Buy bareroot roses.

Autumn is an ideal time to clear out last year's compost bin.

Hedges are not only one of the cheapest ways to create a boundary, they're also wildlife friendly, and make a great backdrop for borders. Buy now as bare-root plants and set them in a staggered double row for a thick, bushy hedge.

A cunning plan for indoor colour at Christmas, plant up a few bulbs now and you won't have to wait until spring to enjoy them.

Some gardening safety tips: Reach for the right tools to take on tough autumn tasks safely. Invest in a few new and nifty gadgets to help you tackle those out of reach, awkward chores like harvesting and pruning.

Dizzy heights. It's essential to be safe and not overreach while working. So, if you have lots of hedging to sort out invest in a tripod ladder that's designed to be stable on uneven ground. Trying to trim a tree in sandals on a wobbly ladder using a lawn edger is simply asking for trouble.

WILLINGHAM BOWLS CLUB

We have not had a good start to the bowls season. After the floods the green has taken weeks to dry out enough for us to begin working on preparation for the season. We had to postpone our planned Willingham Bowls Club Community Scheme on advice from the Government guidelines but hopefully from 19 July we will be able to start the scheme. Our current biggest problem is to find enough members willing to play in our league teams. After a survey of our members, we had to pull out of two leagues, leaving us with one men's team in the Business Houses League. We are not the only club having these problems, two large clubs pulled out of all the leagues due to lack of members willing to play. This may be due to Covid-19, many saying they are not happy travelling to play away matches or just mixing with different communities.

We are conducting club roll-ups, **Sunday mornings**, at 11.00am and **Wednesday afternoons**, at 2.00pm.

WILLINGHAM PARISH COUNCIL

Environment – At all levels of government including the Parish Council there is much discussion about climate change and in particular about reduction in the emissions of greenhouse gases, the main one being carbon dioxide, hence the use of the shorthand term 'carbon'.

The first step in any reduction is measuring exactly which activities produce carbon and how much, known as a carbon footprint, and a tool has recently been produced by the Centre for Sustainable Energy, together with Exeter University, that shows the carbon footprint at parish level. It can be found at https://impacttool.org.uk

The site consists of pie-charts showing two ways of measuring the footprint: (i) territorial carbon that is produced directly from within our parish (e.g., industrial, commercial, domestic, agriculture, transport), or (ii) consumption - including all emissions from our consumption of manufactured goods, food, and transport activity, etc., regardless of where the emissions occur. In addition to the charts, the actual data can also be downloaded. There is also the option to compare our footprint with other parishes, or district or national averages. Much useful background information is provided regarding the data sources used, assumptions, and methodology for arriving at the numbers. This tool is non-interactive and only covers main impact areas, but it is a useful starting point to look at ways of reducing the Willingham carbon footprint. While there are many measures being discussed at all levels of Government from International down to District, there is much that we as a parish and as individuals can do. According to the UK Committee on Climate Change 2019 report, 62% of carbon savings we need to make now will need behavioural change to drive them. Small changes in behaviour add up. As consumers we can create a demand for low or zero carbon alternatives that will send a signal to the market and companies will respond. And just reducing waste will have an effect.

The 'Using the tool' document on the website is particularly useful regarding next steps, and has a list of resources. We as a Parish Council are looking at ways of reducing our own footprint. We have already secured a £13,000 grant from the SCDC Zero Carbon Communities grant scheme for changing the heating in the Ploughman Hall to a low-energy system, installed LEDs and use a green energy provider for the streetlights we are responsible for. We would like to encourage individual residents and families to do the same, and will be looking at ways to help. There are many tools available to measure your footprint at household level such as https://cambridgecarbonfootprint.org www.carbonfootprint.com/calculator.aspx and one from the WWF. These are much more detailed than the parish level one mentioned above.

The Parish Council is also working closely with the Willingham Action Group Sustainability subgroup and a current project is looking at ways of improving the biodiversity in Willingham.

We very much hope that this will be a two-way process and would really like to hear residents' thoughts on these issues and how we can work together to reduce the Willingham carbon footprint.

Parish Council Election – Parish Councillors are elected for a term of four years, but this time the election was called a year early because of the Northstowe Governance Review. This made Willingham slightly larger after the incorporation of what was part of Longstanton. To keep future elections in synchronisation, the next election will be in five years' time in 2026.

There were only 11 nominations for the 15 seats on the Parish Council, so no vote was called and all nominees were elected. We welcomed back two former Councillors: Jamie Smith and Jo Pilsworth. Following the election two of the vacancies were filled by co-option and the Council was joined by Andrew Cook and Simon Clark.





STITCHWILD

We haven't resumed face to face StitchWild meetings yet, so instead I thought I'd tell you about a recent visit I made to London to visit the Foundling Museum, based on the site of the old Foundling Hospital, which opened in 1745, 'for the maintenance and education of exposed and deserted young children.'

I found the Museum to be quite interestingly poignant; but was also intrigued to find a link to our members' interest in textiles! Let me take you along – many of the children who came to live at the Hospital had at least one parent living, who was unable to provide for the child. When the child was taken in, the parent was not named (to avoid shame) but a confidential note on a 'billet' registration form was made of any token that might have been left by the parent; so that if the parent's circumstances changed, the child could be identified and reclaimed.

Coins and medals were sometimes used, but more commonly, textile tokens were left — a ribbon, a strip of cloth from the mother's clothing, an embroidered item or even a fragment of the child's clothing. These items were pinned to the billet along with a serial number, date of admission and other details, then folded into a packet and sealed with a wax seal, and stored away; only to be opened if a child was claimed back.

The child's name was not recorded and the child was given a new name. This system continued until 1858, when John Brownlow, himself a foundling, decided to remove some of the tokens from the packets, since the system had changed and tokens were no longer used for making claims.

The tokens were then put on display shortly after the opening of the Victoria and Albert Museum, in the hope that the public might see them and donate to the Hospital charity. The Hospital Museum exhibits a small collection of these tokens along with other non-textile tokens, all heartbreakingly touching.

So, over the years, the Museum collected more than 5.000 of these small textile items.

encompassing a wide range of fabrics worn by ordinary women in the mid-18th century and indeed one of the largest catalogues in the country of textiles from this era; interesting as social history totally separate from the Foundling Hospital, which is of great interest and use to textile historians.

The Foundling Hospital also became the first exhibiting art gallery in the country, due to the founder's interest in helping young artists, but that's a whole other story to tell! If interested in the work of the Foundling Hospital, which now continues as the CORAM charity, I would highly recommend a visit to the Foundling Museum, located on Brunswick Square, which is a 10-minute walk from St Pancras/Kings Cross Rail Station!


ARTHUR RANK HOSPICE CHARITY




