

Lastly, a message for our member organisations. We know that the Festival represents an important opportunity for community groups and organisations to increase their profile, raise money and attract new members. While the next few months might mean we spend a bit longer indoors, I hope that at least some of you will be tempted to spend some of that time getting involved in the Festival. It is astonishing, but there is no magic. It is the product of the hard work of a dedicated team of people that makes it all possible. Please get involved.

FROM THE FEN EDGE COMMUNITY ASSOCIATION MANAGEMENT COMMITTEE

We've welcomed 3 new member groups in recent months: Rampton Parish Council, Cottenham junior parkrun and Cottenham Community Allotment.

We continue to provide financial support to member organisations. From I April, FECA has given grants totalling over £5,000 to six groups: Cottenham Community Allotment to purchase materials for an outside shelter plus tools and plants (£500); Cottenham Colts for mobile goalposts (£1,300); All Saints' Church Cottenham for a new digital projector (£2,000); Rampton Horse Show to continue our sponsorship of the Fen Edge Community Association cup (£30); Willingham Social Club as main sponsors of this year's Willingham Beer Festival (£1,000); and Cottenham Bowls Club for a new fire door (£408).



After a postponed attempt in 2020, our first Family Tournament for many years took place on October 17 2021. Miraculously

the rain held off, and we had a great morning. 17 parent and child teams participated in a round-robin set up, so that everyone had a chance to play several games, before whittling the teams down to 4 for the semi-finals. In the final, the might of Isaac Stevens-Lee and Wendy Dear overcame the formidable Lou and Francis Cooke to take home the cup and the £1 million cheque (only joking!). Definitely some champions in the making. The participating juniors all took home a small prize and they also particularly enjoyed the cakes and flapjacks kindly supplied by some parents. We hope this will become an enjoyable annual event in the Cottenham Tennis Club calendar. We are grateful to the Sports Centre for getting the lines repainted and thankfully it was just in time for our family tournament.

In other news, the club continues to grow from strength to strength. We now have 120 members and are fielding a second men's team as well as the established ladies' and men's firsts. The newly formed second men's team have (so far) a spectacular 100% record with some wins by 8 sets to nil.

Unfortunately, the ladies had to concede a match when one home game was cancelled twice due to court unavailability. We do look forward to the distant possibility of increased sports facilities including tennis courts in Cottenham as the village grows, which should prevent such difficulties. When the ladies have played, they have also had some success. However, the core of the club is not necessarily about competition, but about getting out and enjoying tennis in a social setting. Our Fen Edge neighbours, Waterbeach, are in the process of putting in floodlights at their public courts, which will also expand local facilities for the winter evenings. Our coaching team is now well established with our excellent coach Alex from Game Set Tennis helping to improve all our standards, from absolute beginners, through to tiny tots and the more expert group, including participants in the popular early-morning sessions at several primary schools in the Fen Edge area. The school holiday tennis camps have also proved successful, all being fully booked and enabling the participants to get out and enjoy sport at their level in their local area. A new doubles tactics coaching session is proving extremely popular and is helping to make our teams a bit more savvy! Several of our club teenagers have also taken up the opportunity to become assistant coaches, with sweatshirts to prove it. This gives them additional experience, kudos and a bit of pocket money, and

> they are really enjoying the experience. For some this has also counted towards their Duke of Edinburgh awards. With 22 hours of coaching a week there really is something for everyone. We would love more local schools to take up the LTA Youth Schools Programme offer of free online courses for primary and secondary school teachers. On completing these courses each school is provided with £250 to spend on quality tennis coaching in school, delivered by coaches like ours from

COTTENHAM COMMUNITY LAND TRUST

The Local Planning Authority (South Cambridgeshire District Council) has managed to publish a first draft of the next Local Plan, including provision for up to 49,000 additional new homes between now and 2040. However, with house prices around 10 times household incomes even these "affordable" homes are beyond the reach of the many Cottenham families that do not qualify for social housing. As a result, our community is eroded as young families are forced to leave the area, and far more land will be developed than is necessary.

Many local landowners had put their land forward for inclusion in the draft Local Plan but, as in the biblical expression, "many are called but few are chosen." In the Cottenham case, none have been chosen, partly because of the adopted Neighbourhood Plan, which does identify a need for around 100 locally-affordable homes, ideally at around three times household income.

If you are one of those landowners who put forward a parcel of land adjacent to Cottenham's development framework, please consider helping your community by offering the land to Cottenham Community Land Trust Limited. While the price may not be as high as a developer might pay one day, the money will be a significant gain on agricultural values and, more importantly, could be realised within a lifetime, and before the next Local Plan beyond 2040.

There is a short window for us to obtain the necessary grants to move a project forward, do contact us.

With vegetables to pick each week, weeding to keep on top of, and watering most evenings it was a very busy time. The volunteers who have joined us over the past few months have been invaluable.

Towards the end of the summer, we joined with Sustainable Cottenham's project, Vegfest, on a wonderful sunny day where it was great to see so many people visiting the allotment and children enjoyed digging for "treasure" – potatoes! More recently we have linked up with the food bank to provide veg boxes and fresh produce to add to the non-perishable goods already given out. We have also passed on produce

to the coffee shop where, if you have been in recently, you may have seen some of this for sale or even enjoyed soup and sandwiches made with some of the vegetables that we have grown. We are very excited for the future of the allotment. We were recently given an extension to our plot and have plans for a junior allotment for younger ones to experience planting, growing and harvesting food for themselves. We are also working to develop stronger links with the Doctors' surgeries and other organisations in our village so that we can offer a space in the open, among the plants, so that through nature people can connect with others

COTTENHAM VILLAGE SOCIETY

Cottenham: an old farming village

Cottenham has had a thriving farming community going back to medieval times. At a time when farming was a major occupation, the 16th century was an age of profit particularly amongst farmers who enjoyed security of tenure and whose labour was provided by the family. The hearth tax of the 17th century showed Cottenham having an abnormally high proportion of the middlingly prosperous compared with others in Cambridgeshire. In the 17th century the village was free of domination by a lord apart from Kathryn Pepys, so the inhabitants had more control of their affairs than other villages. The independent spirit of villagers thrived under these conditions. Cottenham was able to retain small farms because of the extensive common rights which survived up to the early 19th century. The farmsteads remained mainly either side of the High Street. In the spring the farmers would take their cattle to feed on the rich pastures in the Fens after the floods had subsided. Some of the old names of the pastures and fields give an indication of their use; Church End Cow Pasture, Bullocks Haste, Green End Cow Pasture and Calves Pasture. Each day the herds would be driven along the High Street to the farmsteads either side of the road for milking. Imagine the state of the road! Cottenham was famous for its cheese. unfortunately the recipe has been lost. A cheese press has been found in at least one dwelling in the village. Enclosure act of 1848 had a drastic effect on the use of farming land around the

village, but the cattle plague of 1865-6 led to most of the dairy farming disappearing. Sheep were also found in the pastures, their numbers declining rapidly by 1890. Of course crops had always been grown for human and animal consumption. Whilst cattle breeding declined more crops were grown, finally leading to the large increase of fruit growing and market gardening in the early 20th century.










SATURDAY 15TH JANUARY

Calligraphy Embossed Letters (Liz Barrow) 10am – 4pm Fee: £45

This is a practical workshop where participants will examine the Neuland lettering style, and then design their own letter which they will emboss onto plain paper, adding simple decorative elements if wished. The letter can be left as its own piece of art or combined with some pen calligraphy and used as a greeting card.

Dressmaking (Sally Tilley) 10am - 4pm 3 Saturdays (15 Jan, 5 Feb & 19 March) Fee: £135

Have you always wanted to draw but never thought you could? If so, this course is for you – the tutor will teach you how to draw a still life using pencils, with a focus on shading using a bright light source to create strong shadows. No prior experience required.

Sketch & Stitch (Ricki Outis) 10am - 4pm Fee: £45

A relaxing and creative day of drawing and stitching. This is a great way to develop your personal style and to make unique fabrics. Bring three objects with you to use as inspiration. We'll start with some fun drawing exercises to loosen up and develop the drawings into stitch using hand embroidery. By the end, you will have one or more patches which you can use as a pocket, cushion centre or just frame as a work of art! No experience is necessary, just a willingness to experiment and embrace the unexpected.

Upholstery (Lisa Cramp) 10am – 4pm 3 Saturdays (15 Jan, 5 Feb & 19 March) Fee: £135

Learn the techniques and skills to upholster a small chair or stool in traditional or modern upholstery. Intermediate level learners can continue to upholster an existing project or to start a larger project in either modern or traditional upholstery learning new and more advanced techniques (Students bring their own piece of furniture — materials extra). SATURDAY 5TH FEBRUARY

Crochet for Beginners (Gordana Adamceska-Halson) 10am – 2pm 2 Saturdays (5 Feb & 19 Mar) Fee: £60

This introduction to the art of crochet will provide you with the basic practical skills and knowledge so you can start to create your first masterpiece. The course covers the following crochet techniques and stitches — chain, double crochet, treble crochet, slip, stitch, half treble crochet, change of yarn colour, weaving ends. The project for the two sessions will be to make a scarf and hat.

Lino Printing (Clive Riggs) 10am - 4pm Fee: £55 (includes materials)

Suitable for beginners or those with some experience. An in-depth exploration of a range of techniques both for multiple prints or one-offs. You will have the opportunity to print by hand or with a press, producing both colour and black & white. All materials included.

Indigo & Shibori (Ricki Outis) 10am - 4pm Fee: £45

Explore the magic of indigo on cotton fabrics. You will make a mini indigo vat in order to learn the whole process. We'll do shibori – folded, bound, scrunched and stitched resists patterns. With indigo, the fabric changes from green to a beautiful blue and becomes even bluer as we progressively build up colour. This is an opportunity to experiment, to create some beautiful fabric samples and to learn about new ways of working with this ancient dye. This workshop is ideal for people who enjoy creating their own fabrics for stitch. (We won't be dyeing large items eg – T-shirts or other clothing in this workshop)

Silver Jewellery Making for Beginners (Tina Yates) 10am – 4pm Fee: £70 plus materials

This is a day for those who would like to learn some basic silversmithing skills, including soldering, shaping and texturing. These skills will then be used to make some simple pieces of jewellery, including two simple rings, cut out a shape for a small pendant, or, if time allows, two shapes for earrings. Principles of designing and knowledge of Hallmarking will also be covered.

During this workshop you will create a unique and beautiful Copperfoil Stained Glass panel based upon a nature theme. Experiment with cutting glass, shaping it using a grinding machine, copper foiling it, and finally attaching the fragments together with a soldering iron. LANDBEACH SOCIETY

At a Special General Meeting held on 20 October the members unanimously voted to dissolve the Society. So after nearly 50 years this village organisation has closed.

The Society was formed in the early 1970s and over the years it has responded to planning proposals for developments in the village, and encouraged the restoration and maintenance of historic properties, particularly the Tithe Barn. However, the latter proved too great a burden and responsibility for it was taken over recently by the Tithe Barn Trust, with great success in restoring and promoting its use.

With falling numbers attending meetings, the Society has decided that it is no longer viable. Its archives will be donated to the Cambridgeshire Collection and the County Archives for safe keeping, and residual funds will be given to the Tithe Barn Trust.

The King is Dead, Long Live the King!
Ray Gambell has announced the end of the

Landbeach Society after 50 glorious years of campaigning to save the Tudor Tithe Barn, raising awareness of the antiquity and value of the historic core of our village and engaging a range of speakers who gave us some wonderful talks on all aspects of local history from Mammoths on the A14 to the history of Chivers.

But all good things must come to an end. The Landbeach Society could not, of itself, raise the sums necessary to maintain the Tithe Barn. The Friends of Worts Meadow are undertaking sterling work, not only in preserving the meadow for the future but, in their programme of activities, interesting new and younger people into the wealth of history and natural history which lies on our doorstep.

Attendance at meetings of the Society was dwindling and it was often embarrassing to book a speaker when only (at most) 12 people arrived to hear them. Things had to change! As a Society which has been part of Landbeach village life for so long this was a hard decision to make, but,

PARISH COUNCILS

RAMPTON PARISH COUNCIL

Bus Service – We are currently working with our County and District Councillors and the Greater Cambridge Partnership to secure a regular and more frequent bus service for the village. We are also working with the County Council to secure an improvement to the crossing at Reynolds Drove across the busway and into Northstowe, as we appreciate that with the school in particular there is an increasing need for safe passage between the two villages.

Beautiful Barrels – This summer saw Rampton made even more beautiful by the installation of many flower barrels, these were very kindly sponsored by local businesses and maintained by local residents, these have added some real colour to the verges and we are looking forward to restocking them for the winter to keep the colour going.

Flood Plan – Other than surface flooding from high runoff and poor drains, Rampton is a very low risk flood area. However, after the exceptional rainfall last winter and the associated issues particularly in the area of Pauley's Drove, we worked to improve the drainage at that location. We also cleared and jetted drains around the village. We are also developing a flood plan so that Rampton remains a low-risk area for flooding.

Football – Cottenham Colts have been welcomed to the Recreation Ground and have installed a set of goals, which have been enjoyed by all over recent months.

Skatepark – Ramps 4 Rampton continue to develop a community project to provide a skatepark on the recreation ground. This project is currently at tender prior to further public consultation. The group have been busy fundraising over the summer, with a very successful band night at the Black Horse and a Raffle alongside the Fairies Breakfasts.

New Life in the Old West (NLOW) – The NLOW team worked with volunteers to build bug hotels and wildlife habitats at the recreation ground and churchyard in Rampton. Bat boxes were installed in both locations. Following a recent twilight bat walk, Common Pipistrelle and Soprano Pipistrelles were recorded on detectors around the church.

I had a chance the other day to talk in more detail to Esther, one of our group stitchers, and thought you might like to know more about her! Esther is a Cottenham resident who recently participated in the Cambridge Open Studios program; so, she may be a familiar face to some Fen Edge News readers!

Esther grew up in a home with a mother who made high-end wedding dresses and says that she was attracted to the tactile nature of fabrics from childhood. She has been a creative person from a young age in many different types of crafts, ranging anywhere from rugmaking to crochet, upholstery, carpentry — you name it. Her first thought when seeing something interesting is, 'Can I make that? I'll have a go.' But it wasn't until about three years ago that she really got started into textile art in a serious way. One of

her first textile art projects was inspired by the painting Las Meninas, by Diego Velazquez, painted in 1656, depicting a scene at Spanish court during the reign of King Philip IV of Spain. Esther saw modernised versions of Velazquez's Court Ladies interpreted in different mediums; and this inspired her to make a textile work, using fabric collage and applique. Was it intimidating to Esther that she didn't know how to do fabric applique? No, she taught herself this and other techniques necessary for her work from YouTube videos.

Esther has completed some of Velazquez's Court Ladies and has also been inspired to re-create some Klimt and Modigliani portraits in the same way. In Esther's words, 'I am really interested in figurative art and portraiture and found that recreating known paintings is not only really enjoyable but helps me focus in learning and developing my techniques without the pressure of making my own composition or finding the

likeness of a real person. I hope to find my own style of portraiture this way.' Esther is a selftaught stitcher, but, in addition to YouTube, credits the TextileArtist.org Stitch Club as her main source of instruction at the moment. She has also taken contemporary textiles courses through Cottenham Village College. She joined StitchWild just a few months before everything stopped for lockdown in March 2020, and took the opportunity afforded by lockdown to study and work to improve her knowledge and standard of textile work. As well as being a prolific maker, she has been an avid participant in on-line workshops; and she realised one of her goals this summer by participating in the ever-popular Cambridge Open Studios, where she shared her passion for her textile art with more than 60 visitors to her home studio. StitchWild is pleased and fortunate to have such a talented and motivated stitcher in our midst. Esther will have some work on show at Textiles East, which takes place on 18-19 February 2022 at Swavesey Village College.


