

We have received many enquiries from groups and businesses wishing to get involved as exhibitors, stall-holders or sponsors. Thank you to those who have already come forward but we are keen to hear from others. Please contact us via chair@fenedge.co.uk. For those of you who are veterans of previous Festivals, you will know what a tremendous weekend it is for people of whatever age - there will be something to interest and entertain everyone. For those of you new to the villages, mark your calendar and come along - I think you will be amazed by the quality of the organisation and the scale of the event.

I have also made the decision to stand down from the Chair of the Community Association's Management Committee at the next AGM in May. I have been the chair for 6 years and I think that change is good for any organisation. In my time as chair, I believe FECA has continued to grow and thrive as an organisation. The number of member organisations is now over 70 – about double the number in 2016 and these members are more actively engaged. One simple measure of the increased activity is the difficulty the Editor faces now with every Fen Edge News to accommodate

the copy submitted by members. FECA's grant-making has continued to grow alongside the membership and we now regularly give grants totalling more than £10,000 every year to community groups. It has been a pleasure to be involved in all this and while I step down as chair in May, I do hope to be able to stay on as a Trustee. I would also like to thank the other Trustees and members on the Management Committee who put considerable time and energy in to ensuring that FECA's contribution to the community continues to grow. They have been and continue to be fantastic.

If you are interested in getting involved as a member of the Management Committee, do please get in touch. That particularly applies if you live in Rampton, Landbeach or Waterbeach which are underrepresented on the Committee at the moment. It is a very rewarding way to get involved in the life of the community and I thoroughly recommend it. Please send an email to chair@fenedge.co.uk and I would be very pleased to discuss with you.

FROM THE FEN EDGE COMMUNITY ASSOCIATION COMMITTEE

We've welcomed 2 new member groups in 2022: The Friends of All Saints' Church Landbeach and Waterbeach Military Heritage Museum.

The recently formed Friends of All Saints' Church Landbeach aims to increase the use of the parish church as a village asset for community activities, and to fund-raise for the upkeep of its structure – see p27. Waterbeach Military Heritage Museum is devoted to preserving the history of the Waterbeach RAF Station (1938 to 1966) and then 39 Engineer Regiment Barracks (1966 to 2012) – see p43.

We've provided over £8,000 in grants to various member groups (to financial year end March 2022). The most recent grants are £2,773 to Cottenham Parish Council towards the total cost of providing a new audio system at the Village Hall and a grant of £1,000 to All Saints' Church Cottenham towards the cost of a replacement clock-winding motor in the Church Tower.

FECA IN COTTENHAM

COTTENHAM COMMUNITY LAND TRUST LTD

We are opening our activity in 2022 with a call to all three Local authorities to check their Land Assets for parcels of land which might be suitable for our purposes.

Cottenham's approved Neighbourhood Development Plan endorses the independently assessed need for 90 or so locally-affordable homes. To be locally-affordable they have to cost their occupiers no more than 3 or 4 times their household income, not the 6 to 8 times required for "affordable" homes. The occupiers will not be supported by housing benefits but fall into the so-called "squeezed middle" who neither qualify for social housing nor can afford the "affordable" homes being built in SW Cottenham.

Building locally-affordable homes around Cottenham village is a challenge, requiring co-operation of the land-owner, architects, developers, builders and government to make the finances work. Private landowners locally are only willing to offer up land via the Local Plan in the hope that jackpot prices can be achieved. However, thanks in part to the Neighbourhood Plan, no new housing sites in Cottenham have yet been allocated under that draft plan, despite the 49,000 new homes target in the plan period. If successful we will aim, with our project partners, to raise funds from various community-led housing funds through Homes England, the Cambridgeshire & Peterborough

Combined Authority and others to deliver around 30 of those locally-affordable homes as soon as possible. Frank Morris: Chair, Cottenham CLT Limited Keep up to date via our Facebook page - Cottenham Community Land Trust

SUSTAINABLE COTTENHAM

Eco Eats

Building on the success of VegFest last September, Eco Eats has more



climate-friendly eating activities coming up!

Family cookery workshops – Helped by Cottenham Primary School we'll be offering special family cookery workshops, run by our Eco Eats partner Cambridge Sustainable Food. These workshops will share easy ways to prepare tasty meals ticking all the boxes – healthy, economical and climate friendly.

Eco Eats Recipe Book – This summer we launch our Eco Eats Recipe Book. A collection of tried and tested recipes recommended by Cottenham residents and chefs, the booklet aims to inspire you to increase the proportion of vegetarian and vegan meals you cook.

Sustainable Cottenham at Fen Edge Festival

Sustainability will be at the heart of the FEF this



year. As well as extending the reusable cups initiative which saved 1,500 disposable cups from going to waste in 2019, Sustainable Cottenham has been working with FEF to bring a range of local

climate change and biodiversity organisations to the new Eco Zone. This will be the place to find ideas and information on what you can do to help the planet, make contacts, get involved, or pick up some low-emission, zero-waste products from eco traders such as *Green Blue You*.

Come to meet us on Sustainable Cottenham's own stand at FEF.We'll have live cookery demonstrations by local chefs, plus special guest chef Anthony Pitcher; tips to help you reduce waste; our Nature Recovery group will show their projects and plans together with other local biodiversity activists, and much more!

Nature recovery update

We've been busy over autumn and winter on our Nature Recovery projects, which have so far focussed on spaces owned by Cottenham Parish Council who have warmly supported us.

November saw our first steps towards creating wildflower mini-meadows, with a pilot plot on the South West corner of The Green. We first removed as much grass as possible by mowing and scarifying, then broadcast a perennial wildflower mix.

Meanwhile, WARG Field on Histon Road is showing signs of spring already. We stopped mowing the field last summer, and within a few weeks it was full of wildflowers and insects. This year, we can already see rosettes of bee orchids growing and hope to see them flower. Together with the New Life on the Old West (NLOW) project, run by ACRE and funded by the National Lottery, we have created a small wildlife pond and planted apple trees.

Winter has also been the time to work at Fen Reeves wood without disturbing nesting birds. Planted by volunteers in 1993, the wood has grown splendidly, but to optimise its wildlife value and make it a more attractive walking destination from Cottenham, we need to thin and coppice some trees and clear some (but definitely not all) of the brambles and scrub. Again, working with NLOW, we've had two volunteer work parties opening up the woodland floor to the sky to encourage growth of a wider range of plants at ground level. Cottenham Scouts have kindly made bird boxes, and these will be in place by spring.

Planning obstacles (ecology report, traffic management plan) have finally been overcome for another project funded by NLOW, the creation of a decent sized pond on the Old Rec.We hope to get digging as soon as the ground is dry enough not to damage the surrounding field.

For our Spring production this year, we're performing Oscar Wilde's classic – 'The Importance of Being Earnest'.





FRIENDS OF ALL SAINTS COTTENHAM



'Stands the church clock at ten to three?' The Cottenham Parish church clock doesn't. It doesn't currently show that time, about which Rupert Brooke was nostalgic, even twice a day. It needs to be repaired. If you have one of the calendars

produced this year by the Friends of All Saints Cottenham, you may have read that this clock was made by the same company that made clocks for St Paul's Cathedral and St Pancras station. Bits of it have worn out and changing a battery will not be enough. The repairs will be expensive.

The Friends of All Saints is a charitable trust with the main purpose of supporting the repair and enhancement of the church building. The Friends put on events of their own to raise funds and work with other groups or organisations which wish to use the church building for their own activities.

The Friends of All Saints is separate from the community that worships in the church but works closely with the Rector and PCC. The building has its origins in the late middle ages and is the only Grade I listed building in Cottenham. If you are also pleased to have this historic building in Cottenham, please consider joining the Friends or coming along

to the events being held this year. Details of membership are on the Friends' website.

Through its lifetime, the church building has been used for both religious and other community activities and the Rector and PCC support its continuing use by community groups for different purposes. FECA IN WATERBEACH

WATERBEACH MILITARY HERITAGE MUSEUM

About the museum – Waterbeach Military Heritage Museum (WMHM) is devoted to preserving the history of the Waterbeach RAF Station from 1938 to 1966 and then 39 Engineer Regiment Barracks from 1966 to 2012 and those who were stationed there.

Largely built on Winfold Farm, the airfield officially opened in January 1941. Waterbeach Station was operated by the RAF throughout the Second World War and post-war period. Waterbeach airfield was used successively for bombers, for training by Transport Command (until 1950) and for fighter squadrons (until 1962). The site was handed over to the Royal Engineers in 1966.

Museum History – In 1984 the Engineers set up a museum to commemorate the men and women who served at Waterbeach Station. The contents of the barracks museum were donated in 2012, by the Army, to the newly formed trust known as Waterbeach Military Heritage Museum to look

after the collection for the village. Although the barracks were vacated by the MoD in March 2013 the museum continues to operate on the barracks site in the same building with the co-operation of Urban & Civic Waterbeach new town developers. The museum is full of RAF and Engineers artifacts ephemera and photographs.

We are open the first Sunday and Wednesday of the month from March to October 10am—4pm. Other opening times are advertised on village notice boards, social media and on our web pages. We will open for visiting groups at other times. The adjoining Community Room to the museum could be used for meetings. From time-to-time there are events taking place on the Barracks so as there are people about, we will open providing we have the stewards.



FECA IN WILLINGHAM

WILLINGHAM GARDENING CLUB

A meeting to discuss the future of Willingham Gardening Club was arranged for March 7. At the time of drafting this article the outcome of these discussions is awaited. No talks have so far been arranged for the rest of this year. In the meantime, here are some jobs for you to get on with in the garden.

Deadhead Spring bulbs – Promptly remove faded flower heads from spring-flowering bulbs to stop them wasting energy by developing unwanted seed heads. Pinch off the whole flowerhead between the finger and thumb, or use snippers. Leave the stems and foliage for at least another six weeks to die down and return energy to the bulbs. Some bulbs can be left to set seed and spread naturally, including crocus, cyclamen, erythronium, fritillaria and snowdrops.

Protect against slugs and snails – Now is the time to be watchful. New shoots and tender seedlings are particularly vulnerable to slug and snail predation. So, prioritise barriers against them where the plants are just sprouting. Stop slugs and snails reaching shoots in pots.

Prune for winter – Winter flowering shrubs such as Sarcococcas, Daphnes, winter flowering Viburnams, winter Jasmine and Lonicera Fragrantissima, are coming to the end of their flowering season. Spring pruning gives them enough time to produce new growth that will flower well in winter.

Planted containers – Plants grown in containers provide many benefits in the garden: from a focal point to draw the eye, to the injection of extra cover where other plants have passed their best. Perhaps the greatest benefit of containers is their portability and variety. Containerised flowering lilies inserted into a summer border can revitalise it instantly, while pots of fragrant plants near entrances are particularly enjoyable on entering and leaving.

Invest in irrigation – A drip system with a nozzle arranged in each pot, and all the pots placed on trays, should do the job, but its best done now.

Jobs for June - If you're looking for colour

inspiration in the garden, think about the colours you already enjoy in the house before heading out to the garden centre.

To help the garden look good all the year round, plant plenty of evergreens and supplement these with perennials that will come back year after year. Maintenance doesn't need to be a chore. Weed suppressant membranes put down in borders, which you can cut and plant through, will keep them tidy all year round with zero maintenance. Don't be afraid of artificial lawns. If your lifestyle does not allow you the time to mow, there are some remarkably good artificial options on the market.

Nourish gardens and containers with time release fertilisers that continue feeding plants for long periods.

Freshen up your outdoor space by washing down old and weary looking garden furniture and giving it a fresh coat of paint to help transform the garden.

Add fresh mulch to your borders every year to keep the weeds down and help soil retain water, so you can water less.

Don't let the decisions you made last year restrict you now: you can always move things around and replant if you have a change of mind.

If you can get out into the garden after a heavy shower, the weeds will put up less resistance. Even the deep-rooted dandelions will pull up easily from the wet soil with an additional twist to the plant. Wait to prune evergreens, such as boxwood, until they have produced most of their new growth. That way you won't have to tackle them again until next year.

Check your water butt – It is better to use rainwater than tap water on all plants when watering, but the water needs to be relatively clean. Check your water butts and add Citrox – or a similar product – to keep the water sweet. To stop leaves falling into the water cover the butt with a lid and, to filter out debris, tie a pair of tights over the drainpipe feed. You can avoid the water becoming smelly or carrying diseases if you clean water butts annually. Check Cambridge Water Company's website for deals on water butts.

WILLINGHAM PARISH COUNCIL

Defibrillators – As a result of a new defibrillator being donated to the Wolves by the Football Association, we have been able to relocate the one based at the Pavilion to the Primary School. This means the village now has three units, one on the front of the Pavilion, one on the front of the Library and one on the front of the Primary School. We are currently working on a final unit which will hopefully be located in the telephone box on the High Street.

Several people have mentioned that they are uncertain as to how the units work, so it is hoped to arrange some training for residents over the coming months. Please keep an eye on the Council's website for further information or contact the Parish Council office to book a place.

Ploughman Hall - As Covid-19 restrictions lift it has been good to see the hall back in use with party bookings and our regular users returning to run their varied classes. Anyone interested in making a booking or requiring more information on the groups that run in the hall should contact the Parish Office for details. **Council Vacancies** – At time of writing the Council currently has two vacancies. As a local councillor you can become a voice for your community and make real change. Councillors are community leaders and represent the interests of the communities they serve. If you feel you would like to contribute to your community by joining our dedicated team, please either call the Parish Office or any of the Councillors listed below or more information.

Hedge planting in Willingham - In January Willingham Parish Council was involved in two hedge planting projects, with the aim of encouraging wildlife and capturing carbon. With funding from a grant from the SCDC's Zero Carbon Communities scheme a hedge was planted along the 350m boundary of a piece of land off Black Pit Drove recently donated to the village by a resident. Native species hawthorn, blackthorn, wild privet, dog rose and hazel were used. The aim is that the local community will be involved in the future to help in maintenance and creating habitats, and we plan to incorporate nature trails, surveys and monitoring.

The second hedge is at the Council's Meadow Road site, and includes around 230 native-species saplings. Cambridge Tree Planting Community obtained the saplings from the Ovo Energy I Dig Trees scheme and organised volunteers to do the planting, the youngest

being two girls of 6 and 8! We are grateful to Sam Medley from the Cambridge Tree Planting Community and Christine Hertoghe from Avalon Eco Farm for arranging this.

Both of these areas will be left largely untouched, apart from essential maintenance and construction of some habitats, to allow wildlife to flourish and provide peaceful outdoor space for residents. To this end Willingham Action Group were also able to obtain a grant of £500 (our thanks go to the wonderful Localgiving organisation - www.//localgiving.org - and their magic little grants scheme) and these funds will be used for signs on Barton Field giving details of plants and wildlife to be found there.

Agendas are published on the website and the notice board outside the public hall in the High Street. Members of the public are welcome to attend and speak briefly or ask questions (see agendas for further details)

STITCHWILD

In this quarter's News, we're continuing to turn our spotlight on the 'hidden gems' in our membership. Let me introduce Daphne Impey, from Bar Hill. As with many of our group, Daphne learned to sew at home, making clothing and other things with her mother and her grandmother. Once in school, she gained her O level qualification in dressmaking at Coleridge Secondary School. Following this, Daphne secured a position producing patchwork (sewing together small pieces of fabric into a larger design) to be used in designer fashions for a then new to Cambridge clothing designer, Maggie Norton. Maggie became well known for her inventive and witty designs in the midi skirt era of the early 1970's, when bohemian styles were reflecting the seismic changes in society due to the rise of women's liberation. Then, while raising her family, Daphne worked from home producing work for a variety of textile designers, among them Luke Eyres, a knitwork supplier for cricket sweaters; and Sara Fermi, who worked with the now famous Liberty designs. For those that haven't heard of Liberty fabrics, they are named after their creator. Arthur Liberty. He started out selling oriental fabric imports, and as demand for his fabrics grew, he then imported undyed fabric and had them handprinted in England. The prints have now expanded into luxury miniature floral, paisley and abstract designs that most Liberty customers will recognize. Getting back to Daphne, by now it was the year 2000, and Daphne decided to continue her textiles education, obtaining her City and Guilds Patchwork and Quilting qualification at Brickworks Training Centre, working with such textile luminaries as Cherry Vernon Harcourt, Niki Chandler and Annette Morgan. In 2012, she herself began sharing her expertise by teaching City and Guilds Patchwork and Quilting in Peterborough, until the demise of City and Guilds sponsorship for these courses a few years ago. She has also taught Learning to Sew classes at centres in Bottisham and Impington Village College.

In addition to teaching, Daphne is an experienced and established exhibitor, belonging since 2006 to Out of the Fold, a group of textile artists based in Bury St Edmunds. This group normally holds exhibitions at least yearly in prestigious venues such as Bury St Edmunds galleries and the Knitting and

Stitching Show at Alexandra Palace, London and Harrogate. Covid provided only a temporary disruption, as the group quickly embraced Zoom technology and continued to meet regularly on-line. Their last exhibition was in September, in Bury St Edmunds Guildhall. Further exhibitions are planned for 2022.

Daphne often takes her inspiration from William Morris designs. (William Morris was a British designer and social activist during the British Arts and Crafts movement in the late 1800's. His wellknown words 'Have nothing in your house that you do not know to be useful or believe to be beautiful' are oft quoted). Often, she dyes her own fabrics, and uses unusual printing techniques; for example, a current work has involved printing fabric, using the skin of a cantaloupe melon as a printing tool. Another interesting work was made using recycled calico bags, initially used to transport and protect wicker coffins; which were printed and then 'discharged' (colour removed) using household bleach to obtain interesting and unusual designs. Daphne's work is always thoughtful and often involves nature studies. Her most current work in progress is based on observations at Swavesey Lakes.
