FEN EDGE FESTIVAL 2022

Can it really be three years since joyousness and jollity made its presence felt in Cottenham? People surged forth, from Friday to Sunday, shaking off the restrictions of the pandemic and thoroughly enjoying all that was on offer. The weather was mostly kind and the only problem was not being able to be in many different places at the same time! Tim Jones, Chair of the FEF organising committee, declared the festival - the ninth since 2005 - to be about family, friends and community, a time for fun. And so it was! With an eye on the future, sustainability was key. The reusable cup scheme was expanded to include all bars and types of drink, significantly reducing the amount of waste going to landfill from the event. In addition, funds were allocated to the government-backed Woodland Carbon Code project to invest in woodland to reduce CO₂ emissions equivalent to the festival's estimated carbon footprint.

On the Village Green, at the College, in the Community Centre Café, there was an enticing (almost overwhelming!) range of options. The 'FEF programme' was indispensable, providing details of what was going on where and when. It helped everyone discover an amazing array of craftiness, singing, dancing, archaeology (fresh from the 'dig' on the Broad Lane fields where new ponds will soon appear). Then there was as a medieval combat

performance by Shire of Flintheath that took everyone back to the Middle Ages - and no Tardis needed! There was also bushcraft and culture, a repair café with restoration as its prime purpose, animals, a magic show, retro gaming and graffiti artists. Youngsters put on a great gymnastics display and there was a free C Fit Bootcamp for the over 16s. Fitness is a goal for sure in the Fen Edge. There was line dancing, Pilates and Zumba on the Sunday, as well as Whirl and Twirl to

test your rhythmic capacity.

To cool down you could relax and listen to fabulous local musicians: Fen Edge Orchestra, Cottenham Brass Juniors and Songs of Praise, as well as the impressive BigMouth (over 18s) and VoxPop (under 18s) all of whom share more than a stave or two with TyrannoChorus which made their presence known on the Saturday in the main marquee. What a great lot of voices we have in the Fen Edge!

For this FEF I was a double volunteer. I was among the over 100 locals who carried out the requests of the organisers to keep everyone safe when crossing the road, to pick up rubbish and arrange chairs in the marquee. On the Saturday it was wearing of the green (t-shirts!) at *Tennis for Free* on the College courts, and what a great turn-out it was! A real hit, in fact, with a wide range of ages wanting to test their expertise with a very active ball machine. On the Sunday, *Cottenham Tennis Club* ran a tombola, and managed the Crazy Golf, which was the club's way of thanking FECA for their support.

As for eating and drinking, we were spoiled for choice! Ist and 2nd Cottenham Guides worked wonders at the Festival Café in the College's common room while, in the main marquee on the green, the Fen Edge Baking Competition revealed some very clever local talent. There was an EcoZone with chefs who brought new insight and modernity to seasonal produce, and that which can be foraged.

There were cakes in abundance, tempting sweets and an array of enticing food stalls encompassing the world's cuisine: Mexican, Italian, Greek, Indian, plus BBOs, freshly cooked fish and chips, kebabs and treats from the Longhorn Farm shop. Ladybird Pre-School made an impression with their Pimm's, and the Milton Brewery offered pints of their inimitable nectar. The FECA committee must have been delighted by the response from the Fen Edge's five villages. Everyone slotted themselves enthusiastically into the programming, putting entertainment to the fore. The Venue was a kaleidoscope of live performance, laughter-

makers like Barbara and Chloe (aka Clarissa and Daphne), young performers from CVC and local academy schools, delightful musicians like Lucy Maynard and Liz Monroe. It was all there: classic and tongue-in-cheek blues, folk and country, disco and the Beatles. At the *Community Centre Café*, some of Cottenham's finest performers provided toe-tapping entertainment as well.

Traditions were there, too. Friday's *Tea on the Green* in the marquee, arranged by the *Cottenham and Rampton Lunch and Social Club*, was a magnet for all of pensionable age, packed to the gunnels for food and refreshments. In the evening the PTCA from Cottenham Primary School organised their renowned Summer Dance in the main marquee – it has always been a sell-out, and it was this time too. Those keen on the outdoors and listening to late night soul and party classics were treated to *Dance Away* on Saturday evening, sitting on picnic chairs and under protective blankets – until a little rain brought it to an end.

Closing down of the FEF on Sunday night took various forms. At All Saints' Church, at the far end of the village, the *New Cambridge Singers* presented music by Vaughan Williams (this year is the 150th anniversary of his birth), John Tavener and Jakob Mantyjarvi, followed by Spanish songs accompanied by guitar.

In the main marquee on the green the astonishing Luke Harries combined dance and acrobatics in a Cyr Wheel act, a breath-taking prelude to three sessions of silent disco, four channels of music streamed through personal headphones. Then, the grand finale, a fire and pyrotechnic spectacle to remember. Absolutely amazing.

Among those we have to thank are this year's Festival organising committee: Tim, Lucy, Paul K, Rebecca N, Linda, Annabel, Rebecca B, Amy, Graham, Andrew, Christine, Alan, Tom, Peter, Paul M, Bob, Michele, Neil, Simon B and Simon H. PSST — Give a little thought to the stalwarts, the volunteers who put in many hours to set up the festival, wearing high-visibility jackets and ensuring the safety of all. Then they dismantled the lot so that by Monday no trace remained of the event that had brought pleasure to the thousands who sampled FEF 2022.

STITCHWILD

Spotlight on: #PieceForPeace: A 21st Century Quilting Bee!

British guiltmakers have all probably heard of quilting bees (work parties centred around quilt making); and exposure to television shows like Little House on the Prairie has familiarised us to the cooperative nature of women sharing such work on the US frontier. British textile history is full of stories about women participating in cottage industries, earning a meagre living doing piecework during their spare time; so cooperative sewing isn't anything new. And quilters are a generous bunch. What began for most of them as the desire to make something to make their world a little more comfortable, warm and beautiful often turns into a love of the craft; and a wish to inject some comfort, warmth and beauty into the lives of those less fortunate.

We now turn the spotlight on #PieceForPeace, a mission that a couple of our members have had the opportunity to participate in! It was started by a German celebrity quilter, Claudia Pfeil, who embodies the generous spirit found in most quilters - when disasters strike, rush to your sewing machine and make quilts. Just after the war in Ukraine began, Claudia put the word out to her vast army of friends and Facebook followers around the world for guilt blocks to be stitched and posted to her studio in Krefeld, Germany. Once received, Claudia planned to make the blocks into guilt tops and then guilt them and distribute them to Ukrainian children arriving in Germany. She was hoping to receive enough blocks (each quilt takes 20 eight-inch blocks) to hand out a few dozen in her area. Some of our StitchWild members responded to the call and sent blocks over. Before long, quilting groups, fabric manufacturers, and private individuals were donating blocks, bolts of fabric, wadding (the soft layer within a quilt), and thread to help Claudia get the job done. Pictures of quilts being handed out to children who came to Germany with little other than the clothes they were wearing began to appear on Claudia's Facebook page. All was well! Within the first few weeks, however, Claudia had received 17,400 blocks from guilters all over Europe, North America and beyond, enough for more than 800 quilts; and she was receiving more



blocks daily. Clearly, this was more than Claudia's Quilting Army in Germany had anticipated and could cope with. She came up with the idea of #PieceForPeace outposts to be established in Europe, the UK and Ireland, North America and beyond. Outpost heads would receive quilt block kits from Claudia, distribute them to their volunteer stitchers, finish them into quilts, and then distribute them locally. In the UK, a Quilter's Guild member stepped up to the challenge to head the UK outpost, and before long, a network was established to piece blocks into quilts, get them quilted and finished and then distributed.

Locally, we have formed a team of volunteers to assemble quilts, pass them on to a volunteer with an industrial quilting machine to be quilted, then on to more local helpers to finish the quilts; and finally, send them to another volunteer with links to one of the many Ukrainian churches in our region for distribution. What began as a 'what can I do to help' has very quickly turned into a worldwide initiative that we are proud to be a part of!

CAMBRIDGESHIRE GEOLOGICAL SOCIETY

The Fen Edge Trail is a project set up by the Cambridgeshire Geological Society (www.cambsgeology.org). A series of walks around the fen edge of Cambridgeshire



will, eventually, combine to link the border with Lincolnshire, in the northwest, to the border with Suffolk, in the southeast. The Trail takes the 5-metre contour (where the land reaches 5 metres above sea-level) as the approximate fen edge, with the walks linking the local landscape and geology to the history, culture and wildlife. The many places of interest and significant features to be seen, highlight the importance of the fen edge area. So far, 10 Walk Guides have been published and another 10 or so are due this year. You can follow the guides to do each walk individually or adapt them into shorter round trips, whilst the more adventurous can walk several together to complete more of the Trail! You can reach the start and end of each walk by public transport (although not every day on some routes) and all are on publicly accessible paths/pavements (although, unfortunately, not always accessible other than on foot). Each part of the walk has a description of the local interest, so you can just visit some of the places mentioned (if practical) rather

than do a complete walk. The guides can be downloaded free from the website www.fenedgetrail.org/overview/walks We are currently putting together the details for the Swavesey to Willingham walk via Over and the Willingham to Cottenham walk via Rampton. We are also looking for options for Cottenham to Waterbeach via Landbeach. One feature of the area is the Cottenham Sandstone, a distinctive local rock that is part of the Woburn Sands Formation (forming a band from Bedfordshire through Gamlingay to Cottenham and then north past Ely). A distinctive, hard, dark brown stone, it can be seen in the churches at Cottenham and Rampton, If you know of any local pits where it was guarried, we'd love to know! The old

Rotary



Cambridge-South Rotary Club

Tanzania – We are installing beehives for Naalarami school – a school for Maasai children. This should help with sustainability and keep out elephants (they apparently do not like bees!), which have visited the school and dismantled the rainwater catchment and storage that we have installed for the school. They do not have any other water supply.

Also, a team of volunteer students (www.cambridgedevelopment.org) from Cambridge University, has teamed up with us, as one of them is a Rotary scholar. They are planning to fly there and join with 10 volunteer students from Dar Es Salaam to teach English to students and teachers this summer. They will go laden with Rotary supplied pictorial dictionaries (like those we have supplied to Cottenham Village College), second hand children's reading books (partly from the charity shop in Cottenham - thank you) and laptops. There are now a few solar panels for phone charging and lights for the teachers, and we are hoping the Government will supply mains electricity soon. In Tanzania, students must pass an exam to go on to secondary school and if they pass (as the students from Naalarami are now doing), they are then taught in English rather than their first language, Kiswahili!

Ukraine – Rotary International has Peace as one of its 7 aspects and Rotary in East Anglia has now established a link with the Rotary club of Kiev International. Their club president has spoken to us on Zoom three times about the wonderful work that Rotary is doing delivering humanitarian aid. We are now financially supporting their work, including setting up refugee centres within Ukraine.

In addition, we are beginning to help pay for essentials for Ukrainian refugees here, including in the Fen Edge.

Memory café – This is held at Girton on the first Friday of every month starting at 10am. It is at St Vincent's Close Community Hall CB3 0PE. People from Fen Edge are warmly welcome.

Homeless football – A tournament is being planned with homeless organisations for Sunday 18 September at the all-weather pitches behind the Abbey swimming pool.

Our club – If you would like to help with any of our activities, we would love to hear from you. I would be very happy to have a chat with anyone who may be interested – do get in touch.

100 years of Rotary in Cambridge –To leave a lasting facility, the Cambridge clubs have installed a new central light and plinth on Christ's Pieces to help safety – do look out for it.

Polio – Rotary International, with the World Health Organization, aims to eradicate Polio world-wide within the next few years. Pakistan had, for the first time, no cases of the wild virus in 2021, thanks, in no small part, to the wonderful Rotary donations and volunteer vaccinators! If this continues, it will leave Afghanistan as the only country where it is endemic – a far cry from when Rotary first persuaded the WHO to support this vaccination campaign. The infrastructure has been widely used for Covid-19 vaccinations.

The recent discovery of vaccination-derived Polio virus (in some parts of the world a live vaccine is used, but not in the UK) in London's sewage is a warning to us all to ensure that we complete the eradication of Polio from the world as soon as possible.

Environment and Sustainability – The Parish Council's environment and biodiversity projects are moving forward. The native species hedge along Barton Field, planted with a Zero Carbon Communities grant from SCDC is growing well. The field, recently given to the Parish Council, is partly woodland and partly grasses and wildflowers that have been left to rewild over the past few years. A display board is to be erected there with the aid of money obtained by Willingham Action Group from the Local giving organisation Magic Little Grants scheme. Using information from our village biodiversity survey and from the last owner we are

identifying species to put on the board. The name Barton is after the family who owned it for many years up to the 1980s and used it for growing flowers, like many other smallholders in the village. Members of the family still live around the Fen Edge patch and are helping us with our historical understanding of the field dating back over a century.



Eddie, a Navigator, was the sole survivor of his crew after their Lancaster was shot down over Belgium returning home from a mission to Nazi Germany in April 1944. He was taken prisoner of war, and despite a badly injured leg, subsequently ended up on the infamous 'long march' in March 1945.

Following a buffet lunch, a fly past was carried out over the former main runway by a Hurricane Mark IIC, PZ865, operated by the Battle of Britain Memorial Flight and flown by F/L Giles Croft.

During the afternoon, a ceremony was held at the memorial garden on site to inter the ashes, which had been brought from Australia, of former Squadron veteran Lewis Shaw (RAAF). The day concluded with a visit to the museum on site to view the many artefacts collected over the years to record and illustrate the occupation of the base by the RAF and Royal Engineers. 514 Squadron Association wish to record their thanks to Urban & Civic for allowing the reunion to take place on the base once again.



fantastic local support from the many individual donors to our Spend a Penny campaign, our volunteers and members of the Tithe Barn Trust.



In addition, this work has been made possible by a substantial award from the Postcode Community Trust, a grant-giving charity funded entirely by players of the People's Postcode Lottery. The Tithe Barn Trust values all the contributions made towards achieving this significant goal. These fully accessible eco-toilets are now installed and will be available from June whenever the Barn is open.

Manufactured in Europe by Kazuba, these high-quality toilets work off-grid using just readily available solar and wind energy. Their advanced but simple technology ensures that the products of the aerobic decomposition process are odourless and non-toxic. Liquids evaporate through the chimney whilst the more solid waste fully dries out and in time can be used as a compost for trees and shrubs being planted

on the site. Importantly this results in overall low maintenance and costs. It leaves a more environment-friendly footprint with no water required, nor sewage cleaning or travel mileages needed to tackle this type of waste.

Landbeach Tithe Barn – The Tithe Barn Trust is a small charity which looks after the over 500-year-old Grade II listed Tithe Barn in Landbeach, near Cambridge. Our mission is to 'ensure the long-term survival of the rare and ancient Tithe Barn, by breathing new life into the site, for everyone to enjoy'. The Landbeach Tithe Barn is one of just a handful of buildings of its type remaining in Cambridgeshire. Ours is unique with so many historic features including a thatched roof, elm timber frame, timber granary and brick threshing floor. Experts believe the barn may well date to the medieval period.



COTTENHAM COMMUNITY LAND TRUST LTD

Despite the number of so-called affordable homes being built in Cottenham, few are affordable for local people. Cottenham's approved Neighbourhood Development Plan endorses the independently assessed need for 90 or so locally-affordable homes. The occupiers will not be supported by housing benefits but fall into the so-called squeezed middle who neither qualify for social housing nor can afford the supposedly affordable homes being offered in SW Cottenham – £160K currently being asked for just a 50% share.

Building locally-affordable homes around Cottenham village is a challenge, requiring co-operation of the land-owner, architects, developers, builders and government to make the finances work. However, thanks in part to the Neighbourhood Plan, no new housing sites in Cottenham have yet been allocated under that draft plan, despite the 49,000 new homes targeted in the plan period.

If successful we will aim, with our project partners, to raise funds from various community-led housing funds through Homes England, the Cambridgeshire & Peterborough Combined Authority and others to deliver around 30 of those locally-affordable carbon-free homes as soon as possible.

CYCLING WITHOUT AGE COTTENHAM

The Cycling without Age Cottenham project will not be able to continue. This difficult decision has been reached after two years of careful work by a small organising group. Our foundation corresponded with the emergence of Covid, and the pandemic put our plans onto a longer timeframe from a very early stage. Unfortunately, during that time period, although we have gained fundraising support from Co-op customers and a valuable link with the Community Trishaw operated by Histon and Impington (HI) Friends, the personal circumstances of our organisers have changed significantly, making it much harder to manage a community project based in Cottenham.

We are grateful to those who encouraged us and responded positively to our community survey last

Spring/ Summer. We had offers of passengers to ride the trishaw, and a number of potential pilots. We did not have anyone who felt able to give their time and energy to developing the group and managing the activities that need to happen behind the scenes, which is what we need lots of at this point.

It is with great regret that we have therefore decided to end the project. Arrangements are in place to return the Co-op Community funds to them – we believe these will be distributed to the other "Cottenham good causes for 2021–22". We are hugely appreciative of the support of the Fen Edge Community Association, who have backed us and been our bankers throughout. The offer to work in partnership with HI Friends to make use of the trishaw remains, and the Facebook page will remain open in the short term to advise people of the status of the project.
