STITCHWILD

Our members recently took the opportunity to share our knowledge with each other about felt and fibre art! Felting is believed to have originated in the Near East; and probably came to the UK via the Crusades. In Western Europe, where the techniques of spinning and weaving were well entrenched in the Middle Ages, felting was always secondary. It is thought that felting may have been adopted as a way of using up waste materials from the spinning process.

Felted hats were produced in London from at least as early as the 13th century. Any scraps of waste wool were stuck and matted together with waste ale or other sticky fluids to hold the wool together. Once this was done, the matted material went through a process called fulling, where it was squeezed and pounded in hot water so that the wool strands tangled together more extensively. The final products were turned into caps. As time went on, the process was refined and higher quality headwear was produced.

We found that today's process of wet felting is not that far removed from ancient practices. In our session, we used Merino wool, easily obtainable commercially already coloured and with the wool fibres aligned and straight, ready to be used in a design.

Merino wool is incredibly fine and beautifully soft; it felts well, is easy to find, and comes pre-dyed in a large range of colours; however, there are other types of wool that felt-makers may prefer. (Note: various methods are used for wet felting; everyone seems to have their favourite way, which might differ slightly; this is the process that we followed).

The wool is laid out in the desired pattern, with fibres going horizontally and vertically, onto a waterproof base. Bubble wrap works well because the texture helps the wool fibres to entangle with each other.

Then a light spray of soapy water is applied, and then a cover sheet of bubble wrap (bamboo mats are sometimes used) is applied and the wool is gently agitated using the fingers. This process can take anywhere from a few minutes to much longer, depending on the thickness of the wool layers, and how easily the wool fibres entangle.

Once it is stabilised, the work can be rolled up and rolled back and forth until the fibres are matted together to make a single bit of 'cloth.' The cloth is then fulled by pouring or immersion in very hot water and then banging it against a hard surface to

further encourage entangling of the fibres.

Once it is dry, it can be formed into an item of, for example, headwear or clothing, or further stitched into. Wool fibres can also be felted into a loose weave fabric in a process called nuno felting.

Using these, principles, and with a little help from our friends, we were able to turn out some respectable pieces of felt in just a few hours! The general consensus was that it is a process that we are likely to use many times over! Check out these photos of felting by some of our members.

FECA IN WATERBEACH



WATERBEACH MILITARY HERITAGE MUSEUM



The museum tells the story of the former airfield from 1938 (when the land was bought) to 1941 (when the RAF arrived) to 1966 (when the RAF left and the Royal Engineers arrived) until 2012 (when the

Royal Engineers left). The site is now being developed as Waterbeach (New Town).

The Trustees have been exploring ways the *Duxford Radio Trust* (DRT) and the museum can work together to display some of the equipment that would have been used by the RAF and the Royal Engineers. The first exhibit is a replica of a working wireless operator's position in a Lancaster Bomber – such were stationed at Waterbeach from 1943 to 1945 with 514 Squadron. It is quite a large display, which meant we had to take the outside door off and frame out. We gratefully acknowledge the support of Urban&Civic the developers for the Waterbeach new town.



The display is interactive so visitors are able to try their hand at Morse Code. Certificates are given for successfully spelling your name in Morse! Further, the short-range radio is working and will improve

as a better ariel is erected. Members of DRT may be in the museum to explain more to the visitors. We are working with DRT on showing some of the other equipment that helped to win the second world war, such as early radar and G and GH target positioning in Lancasters.

Gee: Sometimes written GEE or just G, was the code name given to a radio navigation system used by the RAF during World War II. Gee-H sometimes written as G-H, was a radio navigation system developed by Britain during World War II to aid RAF Bomber Command and used the 'twin range principal' of location determination.

These systems allowed aircraft to bomb through the clouds. Radio systems that were used by the Royal Engineers stationed at Waterbeach will appear in future displays.

Please do visit us if you have not been before. There is no admission charge, but donations are always welcome. We have a number of old and new books on sale, including an RAF history and Royal Engineers history of their occupation of the Waterbeach Station.

Museum Voluntary Stewards – Do you have an interest in history? Interested in Military or local history, then the museum would like to hear from you. We are looking for people to join our stewarding team to explain to our visitors what Waterbeach RAF Station and Engineers Barracks was all about and to interpret the museum displays. If you feel you would like to explore joining us, please contact Adrian below.

Opening times – the first Sunday and Wednesday of the month from March to October 10am–4pm. Also, on the third Sunday all year, when there is a Community Market adjacent to the museum, 10am–3pm. Other opening times are advertised on village notice boards, social media and on our web pages. We will open for visiting groups at other times. The adjoining Community Room to the museum can be used for meetings.

FECA IN WILLINGHAM



WILLINGHAM PARISH COUNCIL

Our previous article focused on the Highways initiatives that had taken place in Willingham. For this edition I thought residents may be interested to hear about the efforts the Council has been making to reduce its carbon footprint, enhance the environment and increase biodiversity.

Reducing Electricity Usage – With the help of grants and \$106 monies the Council has installed LED lighting in the Ploughman Hall and the Pavilion. We have also been able to replace the old wooden windows and doors at the Ploughman Hall with coated aluminium frames and installed an infra-red heating system at the Ploughman Hall. These measures have helped to reduce the electricity used whilst at the same time making the environment more pleasant for users of the facilities.

Barton Field – Following the donation of the field on Black Pit Drove the Council decided to keep it as an open green space for people to enjoy. They have planted a new 350m native species hedge along the boundary and hope to continue to enhance the space whilst keeping its natural habitats and charm. The field is open to the public but is only accessible on foot; no vehicles are allowed down Black Pit Drove other than landowners.

Meadow Road – This is the large site that the Council leased from Cambridgeshire County Council a few years ago. The site was mainly left as scrub land and concrete hard standing. The concrete has been cleared and the Council has been working hard with local volunteers to improve the site and increase its biodiversity. The County Council carried out a biodiversity report on the site for us and this, in conjunction with Cambridgeshire ACRE, has resulted in plans for a nature pond at the rear of the site with complementary habitat planting. The site has also been planted up with additional trees and hedging whips.

Wildflower Strips – We are in the process of creating some wildflower strips along the Lode at the Ploughman Hall and QEII Field. Once established, this will hopefully encourage an abundance of pollinators to the area.

Community Orchard – Whilst not a new project the orchard continues to flourish and be enjoyed by many residents. Owl boxes and a beehive were added to the site and the Council is very grateful for all the work that Willingham Action Group and their volunteers do on the Council's behalf to keep it looking so lovely.

Council meetings are generally held on the first Wednesday of the month, starting at 7.30pm. Agendas are published on the website and the notice board outside the public hall in the High Street. Members of the public are welcome to attend and speak briefly or ask questions (see agendas for further details)



Calligraphy - Creative Painted Letters (Liz Barrow) 10am-4pm Fee: £47 plus materials



FRIENDS OF ALL SAINTS, COTTENHAM

The Cottenham (and Saffron Walden) based choir *TyrannoChorus* sometimes rehearses in *All Saints' Church, Cottenham* where they have recently been singing a song by Burt Bacharach and Carole Bayer Sager: *That's what friends are for.* The church has lovely acoustics. I wondered if readers of the Fen

Edge News know what the Friends of All Saints, Cottenham (FoAS) are for. The nature of the affection and commitment is not the same as in the song, but there are echoes of it.

The FoAS is not part of the church as an organisation. It is a community charity set up to support the continued existence of the All Saints' Church building in Cottenham. Not all members of the FoAS, or of its committee, are connected with the church, but all value the existence in good and usable condition of the remarkable late

mediaeval building. FoAS

members want to do what they can to help ensure that the building does not decline from lack of any needed repair. It is an iconic building in the village: its importance is recognised by *Historic England* in its Grade I listing.

The FoAS contributions do not currently provide enough money to cover major repairs, such as

renewal of the roof, but it has paid for a repair to the clock, a repair to some stonework and for a digital projector and screen to enhance the use of the building by all who use it. When a significant repair is needed funds have to be sought by way of grants, the *Church of England* does not provide the financial resources. Community contributions

are important.

FoAS raises money 'in good times' and makes donations to the church authorities 'in bad times'. It has raised money by holding concerts, quizzes, a wine tasting, an astronomy evening, a theatrical production and 'open days' (though the building is open every day!).

Future events being planned are a display about the building on **Saturday 16 September** as part of Open Cambridge, a Quiz on **Saturday 7 October**, another

astronomy evening in November (clear skies permitting), concerts by the Camerata East, Fen Edge Orchestra, Cottenham Brass and by music students. Look out for posters and notices on social media and the FECA website. Do come and acquaint yourself with the building and what it offers our community.

Affordable Homes - forever

It is not just immigration that increases demand for housing and their prices. Our elderly are generally living longer, and longer in their own homes; yet we need homes for our own younger generation that are setting up independently. Our current approach to affordable homes rarely delivers for local families.

Some say we should just build a lot of new houses to fix the problem. In practice, it becomes an opportunity for landowners and developers to make a lot of money, leaving behind many community, education, health facilities and transport infrastructure challenges for the local community.

Research shows that there are about 100 families in Cottenham with household incomes above the level where they are entitled to state-subsidised accommodation yet unable to afford a so-called affordable home. Many more need subsidies to supplement their benefits.

The 500 or so homes permitted between Oakington Road and Rampton Road should deliver

around 200 affordable homes but only 50 or so families from Cottenham may be able to afford them. What can we do for the other 50?

It may be time for a government to step up and invest in modest Community Land-Banks, replacing the current scheme for affordable homes under s 106 agreements. Small parcels of land near the existing or proposed settlement could be bought at a premium to "existing use" value and then made available at a relevant discount to Community Land Trusts, Housing Associations and some Local Authorities to ease the provision of housing at locally-affordable prices – say 4 times local household incomes.

This is the dream. The nightmare is to force people to move away from the communities in which they have invested their lives or build yet another 500 houses in ever-failing attempts to bring prices down.
