

This year we have as a theme, 'Anything Goes!' Our group is composed of ten or so fiercely independent textile artists, working in very diverse media and in many varied favourite subjects – so sometimes finding a theme that we all feel like we can contribute to can be a challenge. This one is wide open enough to include us all in our diversity!

As a group, we have come together over the past five or so years. We range in age from 50-ish to 70-ish and we have come to be textile artists along many different roads. Despite all our differences, we have one common aim – to support and nurture each other in the work that we love!

A quote from Peggy Levison Nolan found its way to my inbox recently

Almost all of my close friends are artists. It's an easier community to navigate. No dress code, not much pressure to be beautiful at any cost. Here it is honourable to age and survive without fear.

To echo a current phrase, as a group, we have 'found our tribe'. I suspect most of the groups in the Fen Edge community could say the same thing. It's that feeling you get when you are among people who understand your engagement with and commitment to a common interest. They 'get' you, you 'get' them. Even though we may be looking at the world through our own perspective, we

suspend judgement and pre-determined attitudes in our interactions with each other regarding our shared interest. We become more compassionate, tolerant and confident because of our shared respect for each other and our commitment to the group. We develop the courage to step outside our comfort zone and to grow beyond our current abilities.

In a world where many people young and old often feel lonely, having a tribe that revolves around a common interest can be an incredibly rewarding and uplifting experience. And what could be better than authentic and compassionate experiences with those who share the things you love?

To close with another quote from Vironika Jugaleva

Plenty of people will think you're crazy, no matter what you do. Don't let that stop you from finding the people who think you're incredible—the ones who need to hear your voice, because it reminds them of their own. Your tribe. They're out there. Don't let your critics interfere with your search for them.

Monday December 11 – Introduction to the Geology of the Chalk Springs and Chalk Streams of Cambridgeshire, by Dr Steve Boreham, Ecologist and geologist.

The chalk springs of Cambridgeshire provide a unique aquatic habitat and



have a vital role in feeding the chalk streams that flow through the southern part of the county. These springs arise in a variety of styles and geological settings, and there is considerable debate about what constitutes a chalk stream. Understanding their variations is essential if the geodiversity of these landforms is to be preserved.

So far, CGS has obtained Local Geological Site (LGS) designation for 4 Chalk Springs: Nine Wells (Cambridge), Burwell, Giant's Grave (Cambridge) and Fowlmere. We are now researching others to propose them for future LGS status. These include those at Orwell, Fulbourn, Great Wilbraham and Bassingbourn. If you know of other chalk springs in the county, please let us know.

Monday 14 January – The Northwest Highlands Controversy; how one man's ego held back science, by Dr Reg Nicholls, previous Chair of CGS.

The North West (NW) Highlands of Scotland can be classed as one of the most complex and interesting geological areas in the world. Due to its complexity, it was amongst the last to be properly mapped and explained.



To this day new observations or evidence allows us to revise its story. The elucidation of the geology was not helped by the massive ego of one of the giants of 19th century geology – Sir Roderick Impey Murchison! The story of the path to the geological truth has now been termed the Northwest Highland Controversy. This talk will discuss the politics and personalities as well as the

science that led to the fuller understanding of the rocks of the NW.

Monday 12 February – Ediacran fossils in Namibia, by Dr Alex Liu, Lecturer in Palaeobiology, Dept of Earth Sciences, University of Cambridge.

Dr Liu's research investigates the interval of geological time encompassing the origin and radiation of animals, between ~700–520 million years ago. His group discovered new fossil specimens (including novel taxa), logged new sections, and initiated collaborations with the Geological Survey of Namibia.

Monday I I March – The interpretation of the periglacial landsystem through LiDAR, by Dr David Giles, Technical Director, Card Geotechnics Ltd.

This presentation presents a review of the relict periglacial landsystem that gave rise to a significant ground legacy of geohazards and will demonstrate the advances in ground model assessment offered by airborne LiDAR (laser scanning) data sets for engineering geomorphology. The available LiDAR data and generated models are described, and examples of their use presented from classic case study sites.



The Cogs keep on turning still after 35 years

WATERBEACH MILITARY HERITAGE MUSEUM

The museum tells the story of the former airfield from 1938 when the land was bought, the RAF arriving in 1941 and leaving in 1966. The Royal Engineers arrived in 1966 and left in 2012. The site is now being developed as Waterbeach (New Town).

Visitors – Our visitors are many and various. Recently we had a visit from a former Royal Engineer who had purchased a Harley Davidson military 350cc motor cycle with panniers at each corner, as it were. This motor cycle had been allocated to the Royal Engineers at Waterbeach during 1996, first with 53 Field Squadron (Air SP) and later to 39 UK Engineer Regiment both at Waterbeach. Later it transferred back to 53 Sqn. Presumably they had returned from an overseas deployment.

When sold on to civillian use, it had only 800 miles on the clock. It now has eleven thousand, some of it in Europe. It must have been in store for a time before being sold to MOD dealers and then in 2007 sold to the current proud owner. Military records are meticulous, enabling tracing the life of any equipment. This motor cycle is in splendid condition. The panniers don't hold as much as would appear in the first place, though. The front left-hand pannier had space for a firearm.

A few years ago we had a services veteran motor cycle club visit and leading the group was a motor cycle and side car. The passenger was in charge of the machine gun on the the front of the sidecar (covered up for going through the street!).

Visitors come from all over the world to visit. Recently a lady



came from Australia, her family still living in Waterbeach and her father flew with 514 Squadron from RAF Waterbeach between 1943 to 1945 we believe. We never know where the next visitor will come from!

Interacting with the community — recently we have hosted with our partners from Duxford Radio Trust (DRT), Brownies and Guides for their communications badge. They were required to learn and use the Morse key on the display depicted in the last issue of this magazine. There was a strict adjudicator. We are pleased to say all the candidates passed the test. They are also learning the phonetic alphabet.

BBQ for Museum Friends – we hosted a BBQ in September for the *Friends of the Museum* and our partners, DRT. This was our third annual BBQ and a great way to meet our *Friends of the Museum* (of which we have about 60), to update them and show off recent acquisitions. You are welcome to join!

Museum Voluntary Stewards Interested in Military or local history? —Then we would like to hear from you. We are looking for people to join our stewarding team to explain to our visitors what Waterbeach RAF Station and Engineers Barracks was all about and interpret the museum displays. If you feel you would like to explore joining us, please contact Adrian below.

When we are open – on the first Sunday and Wednesday of the months from March to October 10am–4pm. Also, on the third Sunday all year when there is a *Community Market* at the former Barracks 10am–3pm. We will open for visiting groups at other times.



WILLINGHAM PARISH COUNCIL

As we are approaching the end of the year, I thought it might be nice to recap on some of the provisions the Council makes for residents to take part in activities within the village.

Ploughman Hall – The hall is located on West Fen Road and is a very popular destination for a wide range of activities including baby groups, dance classes, badminton, ballroom dancing and exercise classes for both younger and older residents. The hall is also regularly hired out for party bookings and individual events.

The Hall is also used for community led events including the repair café and feast weekend events.

Part of the hall is separated out and is leased to Willingham Youth Trust who run a youth club once a week, a very popular venue with a long waiting list of those wanting to attend. The Youth Trust is always looking for new volunteers to help them and Connexions deliver the scheme to our young people.

Public Hall – The hall is located on the High Street and is predominantly used by the Scouting group to run their regular sessions throughout the week.

Pavilion and Recreation Ground – We are very lucky in the village to have a large recreation ground which currently caters for cricket, football, and a bowls club. The Council are in the process of bringing together a project for a multi-use games area on the Recreation Ground which will be available for tennis and netball. A planning application has been submitted for the scheme and we await the outcome. If successful I am sure many residents will enjoy these new facilities.

QEII Field Play Park – Many of you will have seen or maybe used the extensive play-park

situated behind the Ploughman Hall. This is incredibly popular especially in the summer and is used both by residents and visitors from wider afield. Equipment is provided for a wide age range of children and includes a zip wire, slide, swings, trampoline, under 5s area and many more.

Barton Field and Meadow Road – As mentioned previously both these sites have been provided as open natural spaces for visitors to enjoy. Meadow Road will soon benefit from a nature pond at the rear of the site and has had many trees and hedgerows planted which will mature over time and bring added benefit to the area and wildlife. Barton Field also will continue to be enhanced whilst being kept natural for everyone to enjoy through the changing seasons.

Community Orchard – The community orchard is an area that continues to thrive and develop with a wide number of fruit trees, wild-flower planting and woodland area. The footpath along Earith Road that was added last year thanks to an A14 Legacy Grant has made it much easier for residents to gain safe access so they can enjoy walks or picnics in this lovely spot.





Saving Energy at Home

In September, Sustainable Cottenham collaborated again with Cottenham Community Centre to hold an Energy Saving Drop-In event at the community centre itself benefitting from

a £2500 saving so far this year after installing solar panels in May.

The drop-in provided an impressive line-up of practical advice and technical expertise, along with an informative series of talks. We heard about the pros and cons of heat pumps, how to install external wall insulation and the importance of taking a whole-house approach.

Advice and funding - Action on Energy is a partnership between the district and county councils of Cambridgeshire, providing advice on maximising energy efficiency, saving money on energy bills and cutting carbon emissions. If your home does not have gas central heating you may qualify for grant funding that will pay for a range of insulation measures and a new heating system. If you are on a low income or live in a specific postcode you may be eligible.
